Living Unafraid

I'm in a loop right now—my Sundays are dominated by giving messages in my Autumn Sermon Series—Walk the Walk, Real, Living Faith—and my weeks are dominated by Living Unafraid, the Bible and video studies we are undertaking. Every week is the same (well, the details are really different) Walk the Walk, and Living Unafraid.

I suppose back in August that I hoped that we'd all be living faithfully and fearlessly by Christmas. While my hope about everyone living faithfully is intact, I've quickly learned that a healthy amount of fear is normal and useful for we humans. A moderated amount of fear helps us when we get into dangerous situations. Our groups are using scripture, video, and conversations to quell our fears, keeping them moderated and helpful. The alternative is what we see all around us, and experience ourselves sometimes—rampant anxiety, which leads to unhealthiness and brokenness.

Both fall emphases on faithfulness and being unafraid will give way to the Christmas story, eventually. In just a few months, we'll hear the stories of angels visiting members of our human family, telling them that Jesus is coming into the world to save them. Angels will always start the story with the same phrase—"Be Not Afraid." Mary and Joseph will have a great role to play in history, raising up Jesus to show us the way to faithfulness. But first, their clinging to fear must get out of the way, so that they can prepare room for him, not just in their hearts, but in their lives. May it be just that way for us as well.


