Highwater is Charter Location for Boy Scout Troop #55

In March of 2016 Highwater Council accepted Troop # 55 as Highwater Church's charter troop. Troop leader Roger Webb brings us up to date on some activities and events the boys (pictured below) have been doing. We hope to see and hear from them often.

Troop 55 has been meeting on a regular basis now since April 11th. We meet every Monday between 6:30PM and 8:00PM. We have definitely put the outing in scouting so far as we have spent 21 nights out in the woods camping. In a couple of weeks we will be having back to back camping trips coming up. (Oct. 7th, 8th, 9th and again October 14th, 15th and 16th.) One is a regular Campout for scout skill training and just plain Troop fun. The latter is to work at the Licking District Webelos Woods where the scouts will help train the Webelos Cub Scouts. We will also be working the Apple Butter Festival which is open to the community to come to. Good Exposure for the Troop.

We have attended 2 Camporees so far this year. The first one we just watched since it was our first one the second one we participated in and placed 7th out of 18 different Troops. I was so proud of them for all of their accomplishments during that Camporee.

The Boys worked all week at the Cub Scout Day Camp this year also. They worked the Fishing station, First Aid Station, Map and Compass Station, Water Sports Stations, walked with dens to help watch the cub scouts and in the evening went around and cleaned up trash everyday even after 8 hour days in the heat and humidity, and zero complaints from them.

Resident camp this year we took 5 boys and 3 leaders, all of the boys but one were in the Brown sea Program which is a program for first year scouts. There is no Merit badges given for this program, it is strictly a patrol building, scout skills refresher course. They had 2 hours of free time during the day and what did they decide to go do...Earn merit badges! All the boys earned the Eagle rank required First Aide Merit Badge and a few others totaling 16 merit badges in all. Mind you they did this on their own time. We also had one leader complete the BSA Life Guard saving Course. Needless to say we were all busy that week.

We took a few weeks off in August for the Hartford Fair and family vacations. They have also recently completed their rank required Cyber Chip Training. They completed their Totem Chip Training and Fire'm Chip Training, have been Canoeing over at Hoover Dam for an entire day completing almost half of their Canoeing Merit Badge requirements and several of their Hiking requirements for their Hiking Merit Badge.

We will be having our Court of Honor November 21st at 6:30 PM. Several boys will be getting there Tenderfoot Rank. Also in November we will be doing a 10 and 15 mile hike, one being a backpacking hike. Good Exercise for them and me.

On December 9th we will be having a Camp in at the Church from 5PM Friday until 10AM Saturday. This will be a fun Camp in which the boys play video games, watch movies, play board games, play basketball and of course, learn some team building skills/games. Please feel free to stop in and see the troop and introduce yourself.




