

MICHIGAN SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF GRADUATION

On Thursday, June 9th, Phil and I along with Peggy Johnston and Sharon Poplar attended the graduation ceremony at the Michigan School for the Deaf. I had the honor to present the \$500.00 scholarship to the Valedictorian, Craig Cooper Langmaid. Thanks to all who contributed to the Deaf Awareness Fund and made this possible. He plans to further his education at NITD in New York. He will be working on a Computer Major and also wants to get an Associate and Bachelor Degree in Applied Computer Technology.

C.J. (Craig's nickname) has been a student at the school for 13 years. His activities in the past 4 years have been basketball, football, track, Big Sister, and Student Body Government. His senior year he was Class President.

C.J. received many scholarships and awards at Graduation. Among these were the Flint Association of the Deaf (This award is given to the best all-around male student); Michigan Deaf Association (this is an award presented to two stu-

dents who have shown the most academic improvement in their high school years); Cathy Cottress Award (this \$100.00 award is presented to a graduate who is going on to higher education in the accounting or computer field.); AFSCME –In Honor of Sandra Evans (the student must be accepted in a college or trade school; have a GPA of 3.0 or higher; must have been a dorm student at MSD or four years ($9^{th} - 12^{th}$ grades); must have lead-

ership qualities; must submit a 250 word essay on "How Did Attending MSD Prepare Me for the Future".; Quota International of Flint (this \$1000.00 scholarship is to be used towards college tuition and/or expenses for a student with outstanding citizenship, a positive outlook on life and strives to be the best they can be. A student with a high GPA during high school, and demonstrates leadership qualities); Martin Belsky Scholarship (this scholarship is to be used towards college tuition and/or expenses for a male and female student with at least a 3.2 GPA or above, demonstrates good sportsmanship, and preferable involved in athletics (but not required); Genesee Career Institute Certificates; Earl Jones Award- Valedictorian (this award is presented to the Valedictorian of the Class of 2016. This represents





academic excellence and is determined by the highest cumulative GPA while attending Michigan School for the Deaf from 9th -12th grades.; and the MICHIGAN STATE GRANGE \$500.00 scholarship award which Is presented for outstanding scholarship. This is presented to a student who will be going on to higher education. Many of these scholarships and awards included financial assistance.

There were 10 Seniors who graduated. The Commencement Guest was Brian J. Whiston, who is the State Superintendent and the Commencement Speaker was Johnston Grindstaff, the Professor of Art and Media Design at Gallaudet University.


C.J. was also involved in the Class song "See You Again".

HAND CRAFTED ART CONTEST:
