USING NEWSPAPERS

- 1. Editors in the early days cast a wide net for subscribers (\$\$\$). Consider this when looking for articles on specific areas of the country.
- 2. Marriages were almost always announced in the newspapers, including dates, times, places, etc.
- 3. Marriage notices will often give additional information about family members.
- 4. Clues about family may be clarified and add missing data. Also may describe current conditions in surroundings.
- 5. Good to use to compare with other records.
- 6. Can show 'missing' children not on census.
- 7. <u>Genealogy Bank</u> site ... be sure to check government documents.
- 8. May often clarify 'certificate' info/birth, death, etc.
- 9. Even newspapers used abbreviations for names (Wm. instead of William, for example).
- 10. Often the wording might be different than how we might write it now. It is only in recent times that US English has been standardized.
- 11. Reunions often listed.
- 12. Will have information about the times the family lived in.
- 13. Articles will be written as the 'author' saw them.
- 14. Often carried letters from military personnel.
