

4 Chaplains



At the February 3 meeting night, we remembered those who lost their lives on board the USS Transport ship Dorchester with our annual 4 Chaplains programs honoring the 70th anniversary of the sinking of the transport ship by a German U-boat bound for England on that historic day, February 3, 1943. As the Dorchester slid beneath the cold north Atlantic waves, the four Army chaplains calmed frightened men and led as many

as they could to safety. When life jackets ran out, they gave away their own. Those swimming in the water and floating in nearby rafts never forgot their last glimpse of the chaplains: all four - Methodist minister, Jewish rabbi, Reformed Church in America reverend and Roman Catholic priest - were linked arm in arm, praying and singing hymns as they went down with the ship. Only 230 out of the 902 men on board survived that night.

Sandy Locker, Malcolm Watson, Kathy Bourdeaux, and Dorothy Jacobson were the voices of the 4 brave chaplains with Bob Locker narrating the program.
