<u>CAP & GOWN</u> - The keepsake Cap, Gown & Tassels will be ordered from <u>Gowns</u> in March. We want to make sure the gowns fit your senior properly so after they arrive we will set a date for a gown fitting. Students may not wear a gown from a previous graduation. (Colors are Royal Blue with gold tassels.)

HONOR CHORDS & SASHES - Only honor chords earned through established and reputable programs are permitted in the WTHEA graduation. Parents must mail or email proof of said honor(s) to WTHEA at graduation@wthea.org or to the WTHEA address by April 13, 2017. Parents are responsible for the purchasing of honor chords for their graduate. If you wish to purchase honor chords from Gowns4Good this may be arranged through WTHEA. All orders for honor chords from Gowns4Good must be placed before March 10, 2017. Only the WTHEA Valedictorian, Salutatorian and Outstanding Students will wear sashes or stoles. <u>PICTURES</u> - The WTHEA Graduation fee covers ceremony photos of your graduate receiving their diploma, the group shot and cap toss (to order additional ceremony pictures see page 17). You will also have the opportunity to purchase after ceremony pictures.

<u>INVITATIONS & CLASS RINGS</u> – Checks should be made payable to: Balfour (www.balfour.com) Invitations from Balfour start at \$1.25 each plus the cost of name cards (100 name cards \$26). <u>GUESTS</u> - Graduates may invite as many guests as they like. Parents, or persons presenting the graduate with their diploma, will be seated in a reserved area up front. Only persons presenting diplomas should be in the front-reserved seating - children should be seated with other family members in the audience. Seating for other guests is first-come, first-serve. We ask that you not use program booklets to reserve seats.

GRADUATE DISPLAYS - Graduates are given half of a six foot table to display special moments and achievements in their life. Displays are generally a tri-fold display board with pictures and information about the graduate. Past displays have also included sports teams, trophies, art portfolios, church youth events, quilts or other crafts made by the graduate, 4-H projects, etc.

<u>CEREMONY ETIQUETTE</u> - Clapping and cheering is acceptable, however noisemakers such as cow bells and air horns are not allowed.

Robes will need *light* pressing (Steam).

<u>GRADUATION TASSELS</u> - are provided by WTHEA and must be worn during the pictures & graduation ceremony. Graduates are not allowed to switch tassels or wear more than one tassel.

Tassels hang on the right side, move the tassel to the left after the diploma is presented.

HONOR CHORDS - Only honor chords earned through established and reputable programs are permitted in the WTHEA graduation. Parents must mail or email proof of said honor(s) to WTHEA at graduation@wthea.org or to the WTHEA address by April 13, 2017.

<u>SASHES</u> - Only the WTHEA Valedictorian, Salutatorian and Outstanding Students will wear sashes or stoles. For more information and rules of eligibility see pages 14 and 15-16.

Guys, remove caps during prayer.

LADIES:

White or light colored necklines.

The length of your dress cannot exceed the length of the graduation gown.

Must wear black, brown or navy dress shoes, preferably, closed-toe.

No flip-flops (nor sandals resembling flip-flops), tennis shoes or other type of footwear will be allowed.

GENTLEMEN:

White shirts with ties to be worn under the graduation gown (no bow ties)

Dark pants (black, brown, or navy)

Must wear dark dress shoes or nice boots (black, brown or navy)

No flip-flops (nor sandals resembling flip-flops), tennis shoes or other type of footwear will be allowed.

SUNGLASSES ARE NOT TO BE WORN DURING ANY PART OF THE GRADUATION CEREMONY, NO CHEWING GUM, AND PLEASE TURN CELL PHONES OFF OR GIVE TO YOUR PARENTS.

We reserve the right to deny participation to any seniors who choose not to comply with these codes on the day of graduation—with no refund of fees.



Rules For Decorating Your Graduation Cap

(Keep this page for future reference)

Graduates are allowed to decorate their caps however decorations must:

- 1. lay flat on the cap
- 2. not extend beyond the brim or hang off the cap
- 3. not be visible from the front.
- 4. not contain any inappropriate images and/or language.

Inappropriate language and/or images such as misuse of the name of God, any and all witches, witchcraft, wizards, sorcery, vampires, zombies, werewolves and other shape shifting creatures, inappropriate body parts, drinking and/or drugs, disturbing images, or symbols of hate. This includes quotes from books, movies and other media containing any of the above mentioned.

IMPORTANT

All decorated caps must be pre-approved by the board before April 13, 2017.

After a cap is approved you may not make <u>ANY</u> alterations without prior approval.

If your cap is not approved by the board a new one must be purchased to replace it.

If graduate arrives with a cap that has not been pre-approved they will not walk.

Assemble the Graduation Booklet: The booklet contains the ceremony program, list of graduates, senior
bios & pictures, honors, awards, Outstanding Students and special thanks. The booklet will have to be
converted to a PDF file before sending to the printer. <u>Majority of the content is written for you</u> .
Proof Reader: Someone to proof read the program booklet.
Put together the Class of 2017 Senior Memories Video: This is basically a slideshow with background
music. (Music must be pre-approved by the board)
Be on the Decoration Committee : Decoration committee will help plan and create decorations.
Decorations and Set-up Crew : Will help put up decorations and signs after rehearsal.
Stage hands: These volunteers can be younger siblings of the seniors. We need one or two volunteers to move microphone stands out the cameras view after the performances are over. (This job takes about 90 seconds.)
Help with the Walk through : After the graduation ceremony we do a quick walk through of the sanctuary to check for lost items. After the walk through we will close up the sanctuary.
Clean Up: After the graduation we will need to take down the signs and decorations and load them into the designated vehicles.
