Hampton Roads Facing Water Supply Drought

As of October 20, 1993, the fourteen cities and counties in the Hampton Roads Planning District are requesting that citizens and other water customers begin or continue to voluntarily conserve water. Conservation measures should be practiced by all citizens until further notice.

Here are a few Water Conservation Tips.

- Put a plastic Lottle containing sand or gravel in your toilet tank.
- Dont use the toilet as an ashtray or waste basket.
- Take shallow baths instead of showers.
- Turn off the water while brushing your teeth or shaving.
- Repair faucet drips. A small drip could waste up to 100 gallons per day.
- Keep a bottle of drinking water in the refrigerator rather than running the tap for cool water.
- Don't run rinse water while washing dishes by hand.
- Limit watering of shrubbery, trees, lawns, plants or other vegetation to once a week.
