Chairman's Message

The Board started off the year with the challenge of acknowledging the 10th Anniversary of the start of our Community foundation. The Provincial government had promoted an Educations Scholarship Fund that would provide additional funds to those raised by each Foundation in Manitoba.

Lo-and-behold the R.M. of North Cypress had received information of receiving a substantial grant in lieu related to recent improvements to intrastate at CFB Shilo. Council, in its wisdom wanted to make the best use of this "windfall" that it could. What better place to contribute than the foundation!

This contribution could give to the community in perpetuity, and as a result Council of the North Cypress provided \$500,000 to the foundation with the request that the foundation develop funds and criteria for the use of the funds! And so, the Board members developed the three 10th Anniversary funds; related to support long term funding for Medical, Educational and Youth in Philanthropy. Along with that substantial support to the Community General Fund and a small administrative CACF fund were established. Needless to say the endowment picture and gift granting potential for the Carberry and Area Community Foundation will change substantially in the upcoming years for the betterment of the area! Thank you North Cypress Council.

Other new endeavors for the Board involved hiring of an administrative assistant to carry out the required ongoing administrative work of the Board. Teresa McConnell has accepted the position and has really improved the operations, record keeping and reminders for the board members. As volunteers we always accept responsibilities to do things but run out of time to do them effectively. Teresa has assisted carrying out some of these chores and otherwise keeps member (this member) on track for Board related work. She now keeping the web page current, along with keeping very current with financial operations of the Board, new Grant applications and guidelines for applicants.

This year we attempted a new procedure for successful applicants with a small gathering at Modern Bakery to acknowledge grant recipients. The evening was well received and again demonstrated the value of our foundation to the community.

2006 is the completion of my maximum 4 year term and I would like to thank all who support the activities and endowment funds of the Foundation. Personally I would like to thank the Board members for their support and contribution of time and efforts the work required to direct the Carberry and Area Foundation. My term for involvement in this organization started with very little understanding of the value of a Foundation to the area and community. I finish my term with a tremendous appreciation and thank you to all who contribute in any manner to the "Gift that keeps on giving". It can never be seen as a waste of money! Never! So please keep supporting our Foundation.

10th Anniversary Funds Established By Foundation with \$500,000 Donation From R.M. of North Cypress

Due to some major construction and renovations at Shilo, a one-time grant of 1.2 million dollars was granted to the Rural Municipality of North Cypress in lieu of taxes. Wisely, the R.M. Council allocated \$500,000 to the Carberry and Area Community Foundation for long term benefits to the citizens of the Carberry area.

Doug Baron, Rural Municipality of North Cypress representative, was on hand for our September 19th, 2006 meeting to discuss the recent \$500,000 donation to the Foundation as well as some guidelines and expectations.

The Carberry and Area Community Foundation chairman, Dan McPherson, expressed appreciation to the Rural Municipality of North Cypress for their long term flexibility and support to the Foundation.

The Foundation currently has fifteen different existing funds and has given grants of \$194,916.00 during the last ten years. Of the \$500,000 allocated \$250,000 has been split into three new 10th Anniversary funds: \$100,000 to the 10th Anniversary CACF Medical Assistance Fund, \$100,000 to the 10th Anniversary CACF Community Education Fund and \$50,000 to the 10th Anniversary CACF Youth in Philanthropy (YIP) Fund. The remaining \$250,000 has been split into two existing funds: \$230,000 to the Community General Fund and \$20,000 to the Administrative Fund.

This generous \$500,000 gift has been invested and only the interest portion from the 10th Anniversary CACF Community Education Fund, the 10th Anniversary CACF Youth in Philanthropy (YIP) Fund, the Community General Fund and the Administrative Fund will be disbursed to worthy non-profit organizations that preserve and advance the quality of life in the Carberry and area community.

The 10th Anniversary CACF Medical Assistance Fund is a flow through fund available to community members in need of medical assistance and/or accommodations. These community members must fall within the terms of reference and guidelines that have been developed by the foundation members. All applicants for these funds are required to come from a registered charity.

10th Anniversary Endowment Funds

Community General Fund:

\$230,000.00 will be added to this fund as it provides most of the grant revenue for the semi annual granting process of the Foundation.

Administrative Endowment Fund:

\$20,000.00 is recommended for this fund. The Community Foundation does not like to use interest from private donor funds for the daily operation of the Carberry and Area Foundation. Historically, the Foundation has been getting administrative secretarial and investment services well be low costs. Requesting donors to provide funds for the operation of the foundation is not an easy sell. The Winnipeg Foundation and Manitoba Hydro provide small amount of funds to assist Manitoba foundations. The contribution to this fund would allow the Foundation to meet ongoing expenses without using other funds. Typically the expense as a percent of endowment funds has been less than .3%.

10th Anniversary CACF Medical Assistance Fund.

\$100,000.00 as requested by council will used to establish a flow through assistance fund to be available for community members in need. The foundation has developed the terms of reference and guidelines for this fund. The terms of reference and guidelines have been designed with a lot of consideration in regards to existing medical supports and availability issues. It should be noted that all application for funds are required to come from a registered charity legal obligations of all foundations.

10th Anniversary CACF Community Education Fund.

\$100,000.00 to create a new Scholarship/Bursary fund to assist rural students who face extra costs related to post secondary education. The Provincial Scholarship and Bursary Building Incentive Program agreement states that "the recipients must be facing the added financial burden or relocating their residence to a different community in order to pursue their academic studies." This new fund will earn a contribution from the provincial incentive program at a pro-rated basis based on the total of new education funds created for the year. This is part of a four year program in co-operation with The Winnipeg Foundation as a partner.

10th Anniversary CACF Youth in Philanthropy (YIP) Fund.

\$50,000.00 to create a permanent Youth in Philanthropy Fund to be used by Carberry and area youth to learn about the Carberry and Area Community Foundations involvement in our community and to be able to participate in local philanthropy.

Establishing a Fund...

When establishing a fund with the Carberry and Area Community Foundation you are making a lasting commitment to the Carberry and area community. All donations are invested and only the interest from the donation is used for grantmaking. This means that your original donation will have a lasting impact on the Carberry and area community for today and the years to come.

We prefer you have \$2,500 as a minimum donation to start a fund. To start, a spokesperson for the family or an organization would need to contact the Carberry and Area Community Foundation indicating their request.

A draft Agreement to Establish a Fund and Terms of Reference on how such a fund shall disburse the ongoing grants will be prepared for discussion and mutual written approval of both the donating party and the Carberry and Area Community Foundation.



The following three types of funds can be established:

- 1. Family named and/or memorial fund: the family or person named shall have their name honoured in perpetuity while the grant selection is left entirely to the discretion of the Carberry and Area Community Foundation.
- **2.** *Field of interest fund:* the donor designates a field of interest or purpose for future grants. The Carberry and Area Community Foundation board shall try to match up the income generated from these designated funds to grant applicants who use those funds to these specified fields of interest/purpose.
- **3. Donor advised/field of interest fund:** the most restricted fund, as the donor will have input into the selection process for these specified grant applications. The board of directors of the Carberry and Area Community Foundation always have final approval of any and all of these grants.

The deadlines for grant applications are April 30th and October 31st each year. Decisions are made and grant recipients notified no later than May 31st and November 30th.
