- benefit the whole community, encourage more efficient use of community resources.
- demonstrate new approaches and techniques in the solution of community problems.
- address the underlying causes of problems in our society.
- promote cooperation and sharing among organizations.
- eliminating duplication of services.
- promote volunteer participation and strengthen agencies' management capabilities.

The deadlines for grant applications are the third Tuesday in April and third Tuesday in October of each year. Decisions are made and grant recipients are notified no later than May 31st and Nov 30th.

## ***Youth in Philanthropy...***

Youth in Philanthropy is a program designed to introduce local high school students to philanthropy and community development. The program provides hands-on experience that benefits both the participating students and local charities.

The 2007—2008 Grade 10 Skills classes “A” and “B” at Carberry Collegiate participated in the 4th annual YiP program. Again, it has proved to be a very successful program with the students, as it educated them about our local community foundation and the needs of our various local organizations. Each class was given \$1,000 to allocate to an organization they felt worthy of financial support. Course teacher, Alicia Gawaziuk, oversaw both of the grade 10 class discussions and debates.

After reviewing the financial requests from the various community organizations and discussing their needs and values, the class invited Albert Naismith as a representative from the Carberry Minor Baseball, Ken Allan as a representative of the Crohns and Colitis Society and Brenda Buck, Wendy McMillan and Teresa McConnell as a representatives of the Carberry Children’s Memorial Park Assoc., building Rylin’s Park, to speak to them and answer any questions they may of had.

After much discussion and debate, Skills Class A decided to grant the Carberry Children’s Memorial Park Association \$600 to go toward building Rylin’s Park and the remaining \$400 to the Crohns and Colitis Society to help with local patients medical expenses.

Skills Class B also granted \$600 to the Carberry Children’s Memorial Park Association to go toward building Rylin’s Park and the remaining \$400 to Carberry Minor Baseball to help with the necessary repairs to the local baseball diamonds.

The Foundation Board members were very pleased with both of the Grade 10 Skills Class’s decision and fully support their granting. On behalf of the board of the Carberry and Area Community Foundation, we would like to sincerely thank the Grade 10 students and Mrs. Alicia Gawaziuk for their participation in this Youth in Philanthropy program and look forward to continuing this again next year.

Alicia Gawaziuk, along with her students, indicated that the project was a great learning experience including how important it is to maintain our community as well as how much it costs to do so. The students thanked the Foundation for allowing them to be involved in such an important part of this community and for making our community a better place.

# *2008 CACF Scholarships and Awards*

The CACF Scholarships and Awards come from our 10th Anniversary CACF Education Assistance Fund held within The Winnipeg Foundation. On May 20, 2008 the Carberry and Area Community Foundation board carried a motion to add the offsetting Manitoba Government grant of \$28,155 to this fund for a grand total of \$129,005.

The CACF board discussed creating a new fund and increasing one of the old funds. It was decided at our May 20th, 2008 meeting that we would create the new *Applied Arts, Trades and Technology Award*. A letter was sent out to CCI Principal Kathy Bjarnason in May of 2007 outlining the addition and increase in the scholarships and bursaries held with the CACF. Please see the following for descriptions of the 5 scholarships we disburse:

*The Governor General's Medal* in the amount of \$2,500 is funded by the Carberry and Area Community Foundation Inc. and awarded to the student with the highest academic standing based on grade eleven and twelve final marks at Carberry Collegiate Institute and is continuing in a post-secondary education program.

*The CCI Medal* in the amount of \$2,500 is funded by the Carberry and Area Community Foundation Inc. and presented to the best all round student in the Carberry Collegiate Institute graduating class. A hard working student with a high average throughout high school, spends a lot of time with extra-curricular and school programs, gets along with all students and staff and is continuing in a post-secondary education program.

*The CCI Staff Award* in the amount of \$1,000 is funded by the Carberry and Area Community Foundation Inc. but was established by the Carberry Collegiate Institute staff to recognize exemplary performance throughout his or her high school years both through academics and extra-curricular activities and is continuing in a post-secondary education program.

*The Edith Bailey Memorial Scholarship* in the amount of \$2,000 is a memorial scholarship funded by the Carberry and Area Community Foundation Inc. and intended to encourage individuals graduating from Carberry Collegiate Institute to enter post secondary education in the areas of theology, health care related fields, education, agriculture and/or music.

*Applied Arts, Trades and Technology Award* in the amount of \$1,000 is funded by the Carberry and Area Community Foundation Inc. and awarded to a Carberry Collegiate Institute individual who will be pursuing their education in the fields of applied arts, trades or technology at a recognized training facility other than a university.

To date, the CACF has granted a total of \$21,500 in scholarships to CCI students since 2003.

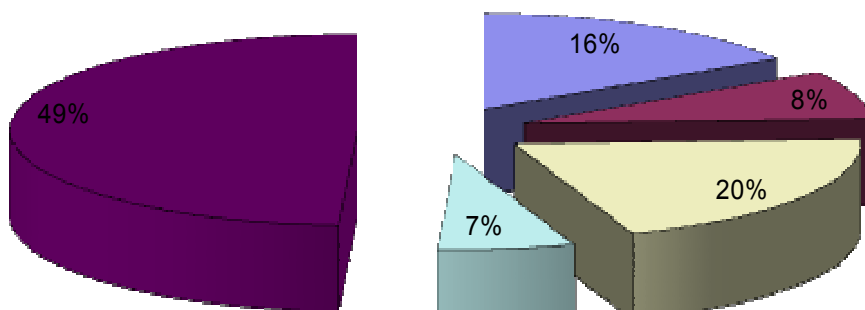

## ***Establishing a Fund...***

When establishing a fund with the Carberry and Area Community Foundation Inc. you are making a lasting commitment to the Carberry and area community. All donations are invested and only the interest from the donation is used for grant making. This means that your original donation will have a lasting impact on the Carberry and area community for today and the years to come.

We prefer you have \$2,500 as a minimum donation to start a fund. To start, a spokesperson for the family or an organization would need to contact the Carberry and Area Community Foundation indicating their request.

A draft *Agreement to Establish a Fund* and *Terms of Reference* on how such a fund shall disburse the ongoing grants will be prepared for discussion and mutual written approval of both the donating party and the Carberry and Area Community Foundation.

The following three types of funds can be established:

- 1. Family named and/or memorial fund:*** the family or person named shall have their name honoured in perpetuity while the grant selection is left entirely to the discretion of the Carberry and Area Community Foundation.
- 2. Field of interest fund:*** the donor designates a field of interest or purpose for future grants. The Carberry and Area Community Foundation board shall try to match up the income generated from these designated funds to grant applicants who use those funds to these specified fields of interest/purpose.
- 3. Donor advised fund:*** the most restricted fund, as the donor will have input into the selection process for these specified grant applications. The board of directors of the Carberry and Area Community Foundation always have final approval of any and all of these grants.



## ***Three New Funds Established in 2008...***

***Tony and Johanna Adriaansen Family Fund*** is a named family fund. This new fund was established with board approval on April 15th, 2008. The interest from the fund will be granted, with CACF board approval, to a charitable organization in Carberry and / or the surrounding area.

***Thomas Switzer and Thomas Rogers Family Memorial Historical Heritage Fund*** is a designated family fund which received board approval on May of 2008. The grants from this fund, with CACF board approval, will be directed towards purposes that would record, research and support past Carberry history and heritage.

# ***Bob and Nellie Garland Memorial Fund***

The *Bob and Nellie Garland Memorial Fund* was established in November of 2007. Bob and Nellie's grandson, John Allan Garland of Penticton, B.C. created the fund to forever carry on his grandparents name through the Carberry and Area Community Foundation.

Eleanor Mary Garland, affectionately known as Nellie, was born in 1875 in Lucan, Ontario. She was the daughter of Mr and Mrs. Jeremiah Haslam. Nellie received her education in Lucan, ON and taught school in Wiarton, then Boissevain for two years after they arrived in Manitoba in 1905. Following her two years in Boissevain, she taught in Carberry for an additional two years. She was a member and an active worker in the United Church and was a life member of the Woman's Missionary Society. Nellie passed away at Fox Memorial hospital on Tuesday, December 26<sup>th</sup> 1961 at the age of 85 and is presently laid to rest in the Carberry cemetery.

Nellie's mother, Charlotte, lived with them at Carberry from sometime before 1911 (the year of the census) until her mother's death on November 19, 1923 at age 81.

Robert Allan Garland, affectionately known as Bob, was born in Greenock, Scotland in 1876. In May 1882, Bob emigrated from Scotland at the age of 6, with three sisters, under the surname Mathieson. They had been orphaned by the deaths of their mother Margaret, in 1881, and their father William, in 1879. In Canada, these children were placed through the Marchmont Home in Belleville with four different families in the Huntley area just west of Ottawa. Bob was placed with Patrick and Frances Garland, who adopted him, having no children of their own. In 1895, he came to Carberry as a teacher, boarding with Wright Garland (Patrick and Wright were brothers: also William Garland of Portage La Prairie).

On May 25, 1909, he and Nellie were married in Winnipeg at the Broadway Methodist Church and celebrated 50 + years of marriage. Bob and Nellie had one son, Robert Haslam Garland and one daughter, Eleanor Louise.

Bob entered the teaching profession when he was quite young and after teaching in the Ottawa Valley for a couple of years, he journeyed west to Carberry and taught in the old Carberry School and at Petrel, Manitoba before he passed the Trinity College (in Toronto) law exams in 1899. Bob Garland practised law in the old Bank of Montreal building for nearly 50 years, retiring from practice in 1958. Bob passed away peacefully on February 5, 1970 – 3 months from his 94<sup>th</sup> birthday.

Bob was an ardent curler, a hockey fan for many years, and loved a good game of golf even well into his 80's. He was an active member of the Carberry Lodge and in 1953 he was the first to receive a "Fifty-Year Jewel". Also a member of the Masonic Order A.F. & A.M, Carberry since 1903, he received the 60<sup>th</sup> medal and bar, which the family still has.

Bob was said to be unselfish and untiring in his services to the Carberry community. This unsurpassed citizen and public servant, never seeking the public eye, served as a school board member, an officer of the Chamber of Commerce and Board of Trade, Town Secretary, Town Clerk, and Mayor in 1927. He was said to be one of the Carberry's greatest assets.

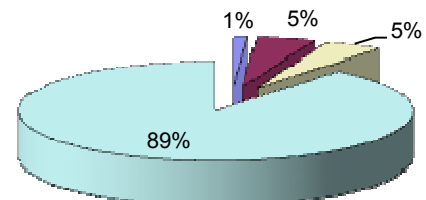
