As I complete my first year as Chairman; The Carberry and Area Foundation is celebrating their 15th Anniversary. Congratulations!

The Foundation was established in 1996 and has grown over that time to administer assets totaling \$1,632,636.18 at year end. A remarkable growth; which reflects the belief area residents have in the value of our community and their willingness to see it continue to prosper.

Over the 15 years \$512,555 has been granted to 65 different organizations varying from healthcare, education, recreation, heritage, community groups, agriculture, greenspace, arts and culture.

These grants have been awarded, by and large, to groups staffed by dedicated volunteers who have improved the overall quality of life of area residents. Our thanks to you all!

2011 saw the creation of two new funds: one by the North Cypress Soil Conservation Group which represented funds remaining with this group as they decided to wind up their organization and the other the Cancer Shuttle Fund that was created to help cancer patients with the cost of travelling for treatments. We also received additions to existing funds.

2010 saw us say good bye to three of our directors: Bob Adriaansen; Jim Marnoch and Lori Scott. We thank them for the time they devoted to the foundation. To start 2011 we welcomed: Don Mitchell, Marilyn McMillan and Leslie Smart.

I would like to thank Don Forbes for his 15 years of support and guidance in administering the Foundation's Funds. (not to mention the use of his office!) My sincere thanks also to Teresa McConnell our executive director as well as Tracy Sutherland who "pitches in" when needed. They have kept us up-to-date with a website and Facebook page! Thanks Ladies you make my job easy!

It has been a pleasure working with all the board members and I look forward to another good year in 2012. The Carberry and Area Foundation is a worthwhile organization to consider for donations which will enhance the life of the community for years into the future.

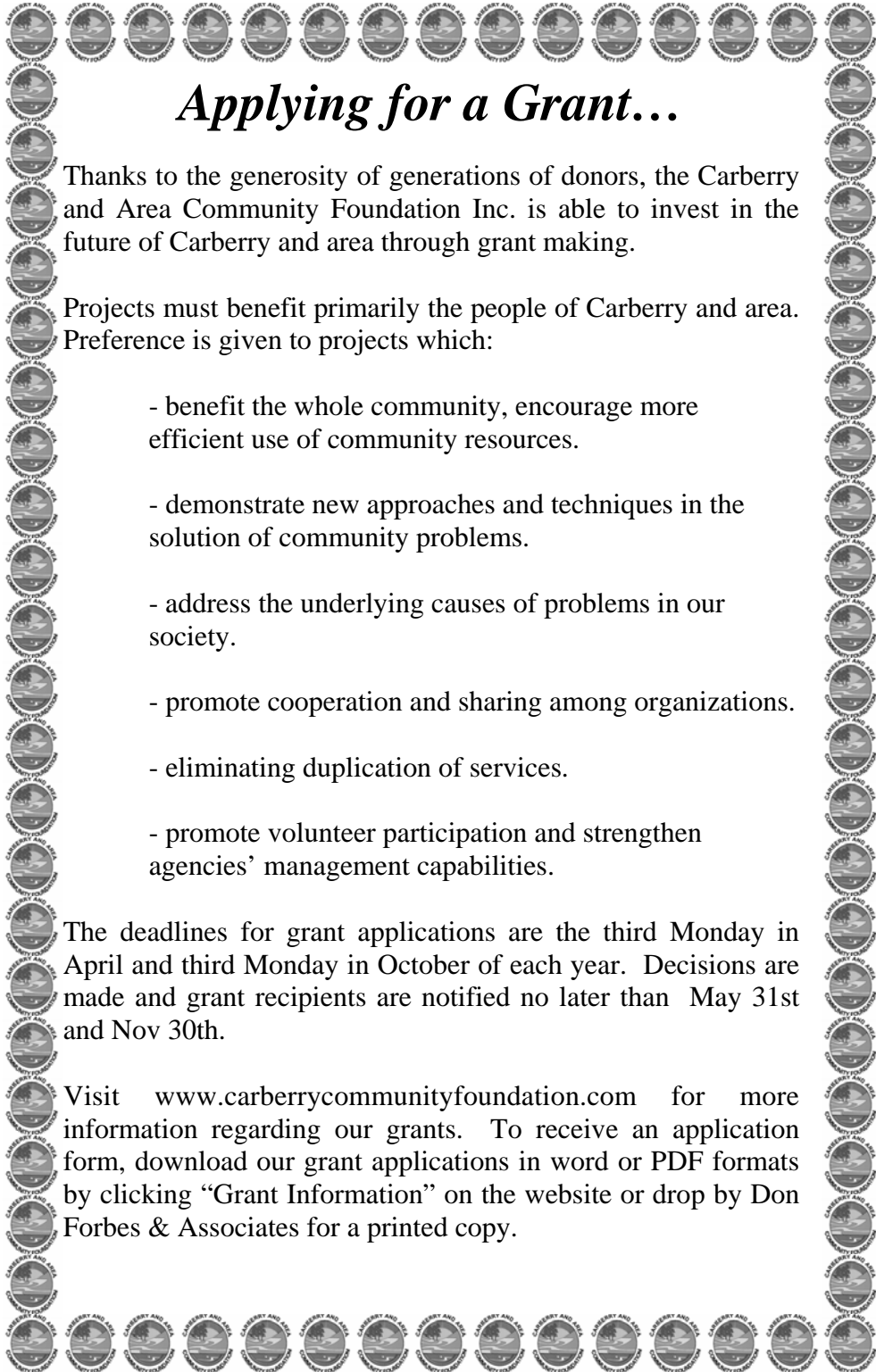

Thanks to the generosity of generations of donors, the Carberry and Area Community Foundation Inc. is able to invest in the future of Carberry and area through grant making.

Projects must benefit primarily the people of Carberry and area. Preference is given to projects which:

- benefit the whole community, encourage more efficient use of community resources.
- demonstrate new approaches and techniques in the solution of community problems.
- address the underlying causes of problems in our society.
- promote cooperation and sharing among organizations.
- eliminating duplication of services.
- promote volunteer participation and strengthen agencies' management capabilities.

The deadlines for grant applications are the third Monday in April and third Monday in October of each year. Decisions are made and grant recipients are notified no later than May 31st and Nov 30th.

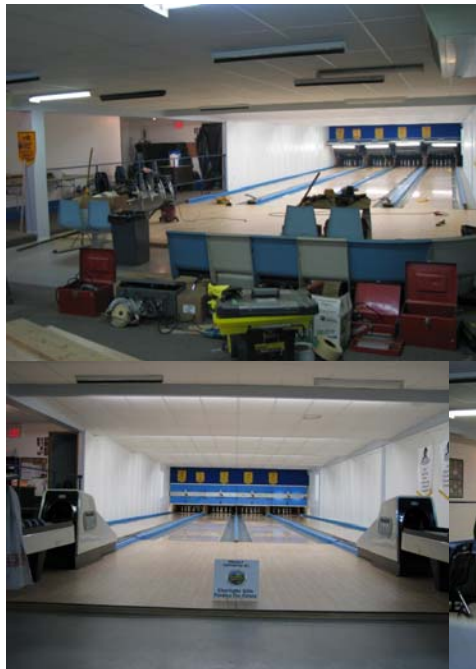

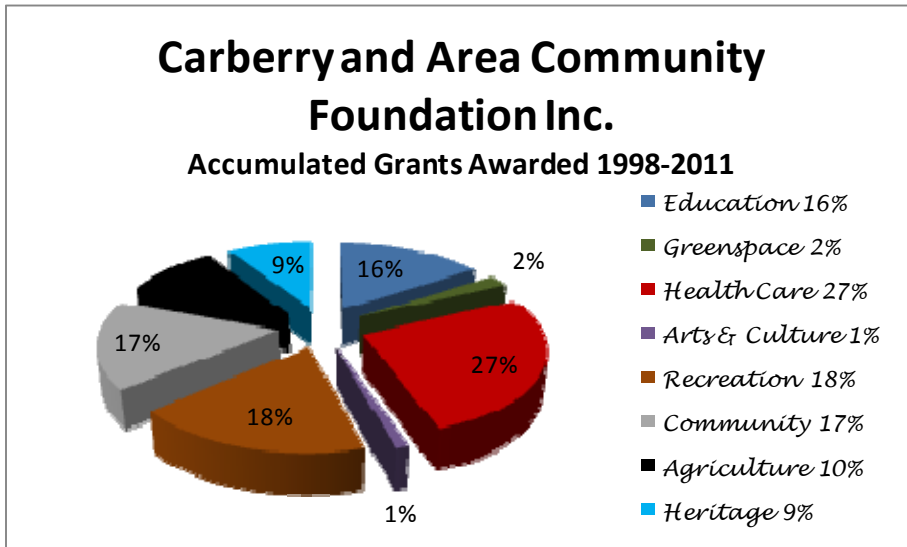

CRA Disbursement Quota..

The disbursement quota is the minimum amount a registered charity is required to spend each year on its own charitable activities, or on gifts to qualified donees (for example, other registered charities). The disbursement quota calculation is based on the value of a charity's property not used for charitable activities or administration.

The disbursement quota is calculated as follows for charitable organizations:

If the average value of a registered charity's property not used directly in charitable activities or administration during the 24 months before the beginning of the fiscal period exceeds \$100,000, the charity's disbursement quota is:

3.5% of the average value of that property.

Note: A registered charity must continue to devote its resources (funds, personnel, and property) to its charitable purposes and activities even though the amount for its disbursement quota may be calculated as nil.

If a registered charity is: spending too much—if a registered charity spends more on its charitable activities or by way of gifts to qualified donees than its disbursement quota for that year, it has a disbursement excess. Disbursement excesses can be carried forward for five years or carried back one year.

If a registered charity is: Spending too little— if a registered charity spends less on its charitable activities or by way of gifts to qualified donees than its disbursement quota for that year, it has a disbursement shortfall.

Making up a shortfall—A registered charity can draw on disbursement excesses from the five previous fiscal periods to help it meet a shortfall. If no excesses are available to draw on, the charity can try to spend enough the following year to create an excess that it can carryback to cover the shortfall.

Please note that continuous shortfalls can lead to revocation of a charity's registration.

Youth in Philanthropy...

Youth in Philanthropy is a program designed to introduce local high school students to philanthropy and community development. The program provides hands-on experience that benefits both the participating grade 10 Carberry Collegiate students and local charities.

The 2010-2011 Grade 10 Skills classes “A” and “B” at Carberry Collegiate participated in the 7th annual YiP program. Year after year this program has proved to be a very successful learning tool for the students, as it educated them about our local community foundation and the needs of our various local organizations. Each class was given \$1,000 to allocate plus their 2010 fundraising dollars (totaling \$452.34) to an organization they felt worthy of financial support. Course teacher, Jennifer Baron, oversaw both of the grade 10 class discussions and debates.

After reviewing the financial requests from the various community organizations and discussing their needs and values, the class invited many community representatives to speak to them and answer any questions.

After much discussion and debate, Skills Class “A” decided to grant the Carberry Children’s Memorial Park Association \$700 to go toward building a skateboard park and \$200.00 for a midway at the fair and \$326.17 to the Ag Society for grandstand repairs.

Skills Class “B” granted \$426.17 to Carberry Ag. Society to help with the necessary repairs to the fair grounds and \$800 to the Carberry Children’s Memorial Park Association to go toward building a skateboard park.

The Foundation Board members were very pleased with both of the Grade 10 Skills Class’s decision and fully support their granting. On behalf of the board of the Carberry and Area Community Foundation, we would like to sincerely thank the Grade 10 students and Mrs. Jennifer Baron for their participation in this Youth in Philanthropy program and look forward to continuing this again next year.

Jennifer Baron, along with her students, indicated that the project was a great learning experience including how important it is to maintain our community as well as how much it costs to do so. The students thanked the Foundation for allowing them to be involved in such an important part of this community and for making our community a better place.

2011 CACF Scholarships & Awards

The CACF Scholarships and Awards come from our 10th Anniversary CACF Education Assistance Fund held within The Winnipeg Foundation. The following funds are awarded each year from the CACF:

The Governor General's Medal in the amount of \$2,500 is funded by the Carberry and Area Community Foundation Inc. and awarded to the student with the highest academic standing based on grade eleven and twelve final marks at Carberry Collegiate Institute and is continuing in a post-secondary education program.

The CCI Medal in the amount of \$2,500 is funded by the Carberry and Area Community Foundation Inc. and presented to the best all round student in the Carberry Collegiate Institute graduating class. A hard working student with a high average throughout high school, spends a lot of time with extra-curricular and school programs, gets along with all students and staff and is continuing in a post-secondary education program.

The CCI Staff Award in the amount of \$1,000 is funded by the Carberry and Area Community Foundation Inc. but was established by the Carberry Collegiate Institute staff to recognize exemplary performance throughout his or her high school years both through academics and extra-curricular activities and is continuing in a post-secondary education program.

The T. Roy and Edith Bailey Memorial Scholarship in the amount of \$2,000 is a memorial scholarship funded by the Carberry and Area Community Foundation Inc. and intended to encourage individuals graduating from Carberry Collegiate Institute to enter post secondary education in the areas of theology, health care related fields, education, agriculture and/or music.

Applied Arts, Trades and Technology Award in the amount of \$1,000 is funded by the Carberry and Area Community Foundation Inc. and awarded to a Carberry Collegiate Institute individual who will be pursuing their education in the fields of applied arts, trades or technology at a recognized training facility other than a university.

To date, the CACF has granted a total of **\$61,000** in scholarships to CCI students since 2003.

Establishing a Fund...

When establishing a fund with the Carberry and Area Community Foundation Inc. you are making a lasting commitment to the Carberry and area community. All donations are invested and only the interest from the donation is used for grant making. This means that your original donation will have a lasting impact on the Carberry and area community for today and the years to come.

We prefer you have \$2,500 as a minimum donation to start a fund. To start, a spokesperson for the family or an organization would need to contact the Carberry and Area Community Foundation indicating their request.

A draft *Agreement to Establish a Fund* and *Terms of Reference* on how such a fund shall disburse the ongoing grants will be prepared for discussion and mutual written approval of both the donating party and the Carberry and Area Community Foundation.

The following three types of funds can be established:

- 1. *Family named and/or memorial fund:*** the family or person named shall have their name honored in perpetuity while the grant selection is left entirely to the discretion of the Carberry and Area Community Foundation.
- 2. *Field of interest fund:*** the donor designates a field of interest or purpose for future grants. The Carberry and Area Community Foundation board shall try to match up the income generated from these designated funds to grant applicants who use those funds to these specified fields of interest/purpose.
- 3. *Donor advised fund:*** the most restricted fund, as the donor will have input into the selection process for these specified grant applications. The board of directors of the Carberry and Area Community Foundation always have final approval of any and all of these grants.

The ***Cancer Shuttle Fund*** was created within the Carberry and Area Community Foundation's endowment funds in 2011.

In the past if a patient required radiation treatments they had to travel to Winnipeg whether on their own or through the Canadian Cancer Society Transportation Service. With the opening of the Western Manitoba Cancer Centre in Brandon, most cancer patients requiring radiation therapy, chemotherapy and/or outpatient care, will be able to access these services a lot closer to home!

Carberry Service for Seniors and The Canadian Cancer Society Manitoba Division have partnered in order to implement a local transportation service for cancer clients to Brandon. To date, volunteer drivers have been trained and Service for Seniors will act as coordinator to ensure that the volunteers are linked with the cancer clients for the service. All cancer related travel expenses provided through the Carberry Cancer Shuttle service are heavily subsidized for the patient, which in turn helps to offset the financial burden. In order to provide this service for our local community members, we must secure a Cancer Shuttle Fund.

By purchasing a light bulb for the Christmas Tree of Lights in memory of a loved one, family member, friend, or neighbour you are helping this worthy cause establish funds that will assist local cancer patients in getting to their treatments.

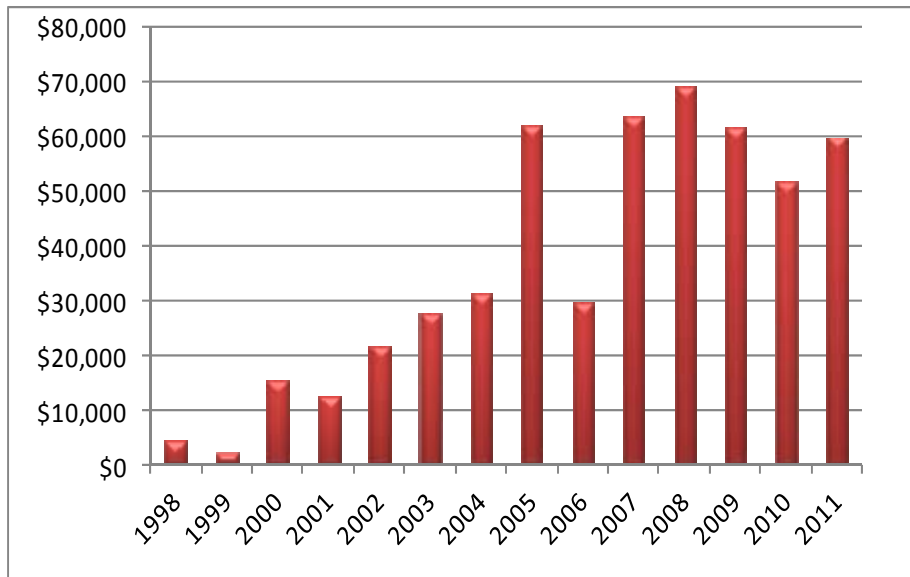

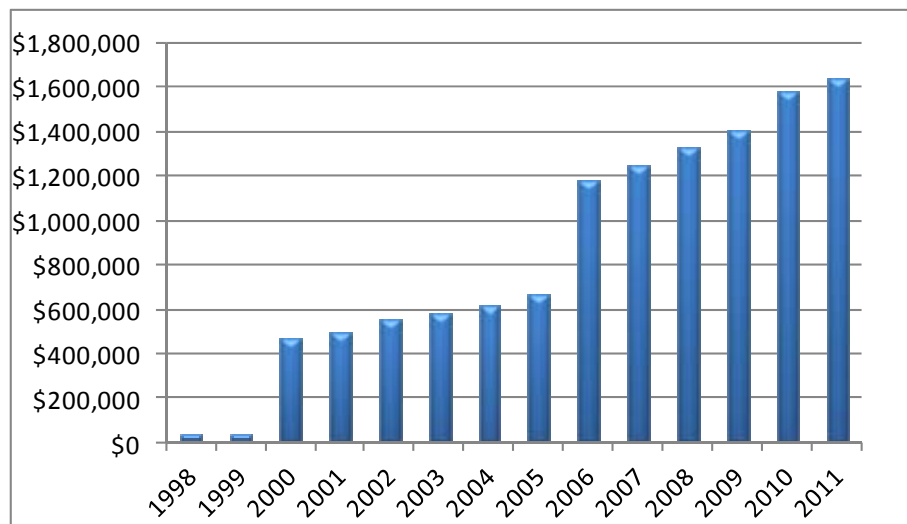

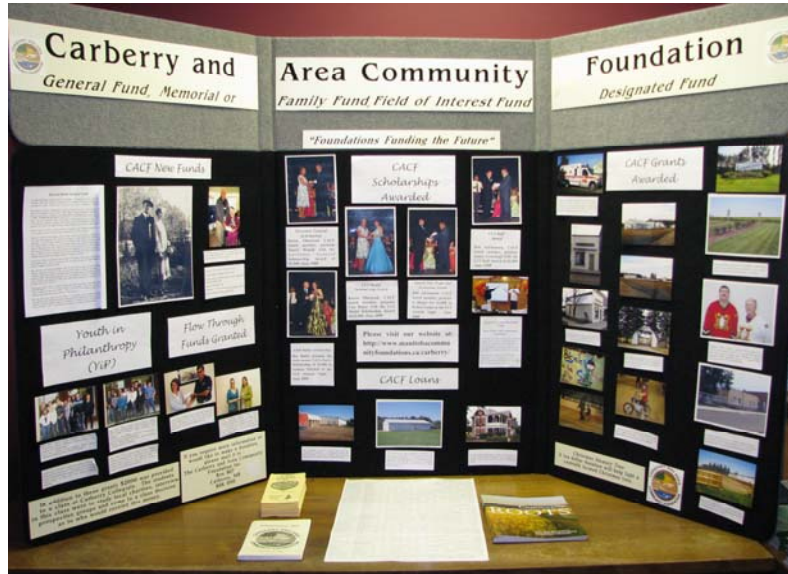
