Special Donor

The Edith 'Alice' Stevens Fund was established in 2012 with the intent to fulfill Alice's wishes in assisting in the medical needs of a needy youth. If no applications for medical assistance are received in any individual year, then the foundation has determined that preference will be given to providing educational assistance to needy youth.

Alice's parents, Charles and Jennie (nee Nielsen) Stevens, had both immigrated to Canada in the early 1900s with their respective families and had settled to farm in the Gregg district.

Inspired by her fond memories, which involved a strong relationship between Alice, her family and their community, she was committed to investing in the continued well-being of both of her 'families'. Shortly before her passing, Alice had graciously donated \$10,000 to the Carberry and Area Community Foundation. Subsequent to her death in October 2013, the CACF was further honoured to discover that Alice Stevens had also bequeathed her entire \$248,000 estate to the foundation.

As a young child, Alice enjoyed going for countryside bike rides all by herself, spending time with her grandmother, going for walks to enjoy wildflowers, gardening and just generally enjoying being the centre of attention. Sadly, her younger

brother, Charles, passed away at ten years old, when they were both very young...essentially leaving Alice as an only child.

Sometime in the 1950's, Alice's family had relocated from the family farm into an Aladdin-style home on Main Street in Carberry. It was here that she continued to live independently, well into her nineties.

Alice was well known and respected in the Carberry community for her skills in cooking, gardening, watercolour artwork and as a proficient seamstress. Alice eventually moved into a personal care home in Cartwright, Manitoba, where she then passed away in 2013.

A bold and vibrant individual, Alice absolutely loved bold colours and was a self-assured and generous community member. The Carberry and Area Community Foundation are deeply humbled by the generosity in which Alice Stevens had shown her community in sharing her entire estate with the causes which she had sincerely loved.

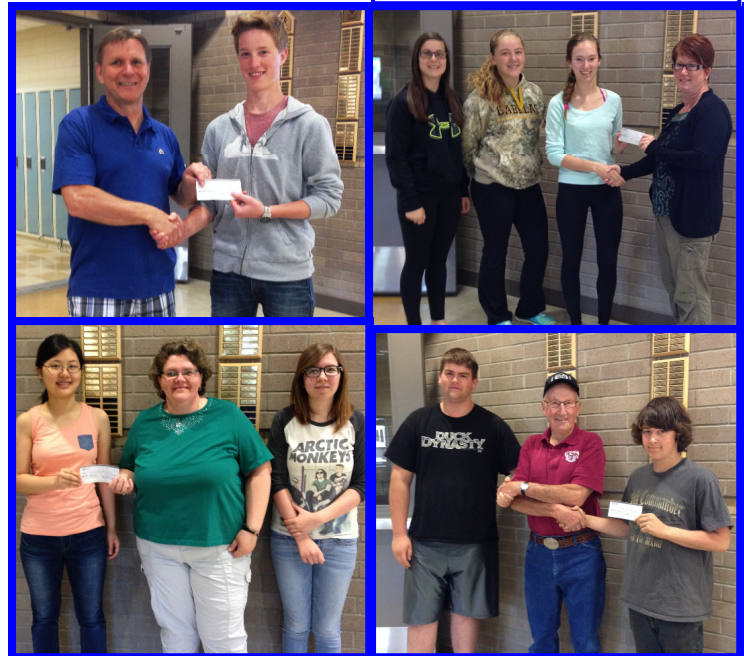
