Kizzy is about a R.E.A.D. dog (Reading Education Assistance Dog) who helps people read and learn to be more active. Kizzy and Judy, the local librarian, are on a T.V. show that is broadcasted on the evening news. The T.V. reporter, named Summer, watches as some kids at the library read to Kizzy to improve their reading skills. After that, Kizzy visits Mr. and Mrs. Taylor. Mrs. Taylor is recovering from a serious stroke and Kizzy is helping her get her auditory skills back by letting her read to him. After that, Summer talks to Dr. Matthews, who has a patient called Amber who used to stutter when she read and talked to other people before she met Kizzy. Now she never stutters at all! After that, Kizzy, Summer, and Judy visit some teenagers that got into trouble with the police. A girl named Meg is grateful to Kizzy because before Meg started to read to Kizzy, she never spoke to anyone. Now she speaks to anything! Kizzy's final visit is the bilingual school for second language speaking students. Kizzy lets all of the kids there read to him before he has to leave. Then Kizzy and Judy watch the evening news together.

This is a great book for starting readers because it can help with *their* reading even though they don't have Kizzy to help him. I wouldn't recommend this book to my friends, but this book is good for 6 year olds and under. This book is 5 out of 10 because it can teach younger kids how to read, and *KIZZY ACTUALLY IS A REAL DOG*. The only thing that would mark this book down is how simple it is and its short length.
