Scarlett Martin and her family own the Hopewell hotel in the heart of New York City. With the rising tourist industry, however, the old-fashioned hotel isn't doing as well as the family hopes, and they end up losing all their staff. Summer starts off on a bad foot: Scarlett's older sister Lola is dealing with an infuriatingly rich and clingy boyfriend; her little sister Marlene is demanding attention, as always, because of her leukemia a few years back; her older brother Spencer is attempting to find an acting job or go to culinary school; and Scarlett herself is left alone at the hotel, forced to tend to the family's one guest, Mrs. Amberson. What Scarlett doesn't anticipate, however, is Mrs. Amberson's glamorous Hollywood lifestyle. A summer that held bleak prospects plays out with drama of proportions that Scarlett never imagined.

Suite Scarlett is a fiction book meant for teenagers from 7th grade to 10th grade. The story is well written; Johnson manages to capture the complete mentality of a fifteen-year-old girl, from the sibling spats to naïveté about boyfriends, while maintaining a captivating style of writing. Although all the characters have their own archetypes, none of them fail to develop their own personalities, bringing even more charm to the overall story. Suite Scarlett provides the perfect mix of drama, comedy, and suspense that makes the reader imagine about the "magic" of New York City and long for their own adventures. This is a story that I would definitely have my friends check out for themselves.
