Jones County Courthouse




Union County Courthouse was designed by the same architect as the Jones County Courthouse, it is now a museum.


Songs to be sung are "The Halls of Ivy" and "Bless This House" by the graduation class, under the direction of Miss Odum.




2002 Baseball signed by the State Champs







Alice and Jerry

The primary reader, Alice and Jerry, was commonly used through the mid 20th century. The children went on many different excursions and met many friends along the way. The picture and book, donated by Mr. Cecil Ethridge, depicts the story of Alice and Jerry as seen by millions of school children Nationwide. The Word, Phrase and Sentence cards, which coincide with the Alice and Jerry series of books, was donated to the Museum by Mrs. Charlotte Wilson. It was used by her mother, Mrs. Willie Mae Russell Crutchfield, who taught at the Juliette and Wayside schools. Mrs. Crutchfield later taught in Jasper and Bibb counties to finish her career with a total of 33 years in education.



Jacob Hutchings Marker in front of Court House in Gray

Born a slave in 1831 in Virginia, Jake eventually became the property of R.H. Hutchings of Jones County, Georgia. He was a skilled stone mason, cutting much of the stone in the county, including the granite in this retaining wall. These blocks originally formed the walls of the first county jail in nearby Clinton. Jake was a tall man of great strength, polite and well respected. He was elected as the first black state representative for Jones County in 1868. Jake died on June 9th, 1909.


