

Designed to provide young men with current and accurate information about teen pregnancy prevention, Project Alpha consists of a series of workshops and informational sessions conducted by Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity brothers. The three goals of Project Alpha programs are:

- Sharing Knowledge by combating ignorance and fear with factual information.
- Changing Attitudes by providing motivation toward positive changes in sexual behavior.
- Providing Skills by creating a sense of empowerment and self-esteem.

Brothers Pierre Irvine, Jermel Wilkerson, and Daryl Brown spoke on Domestic Violence, Male roles and responsibilities, teenage pregnancy and STD's with assistance from the brothers who were in attendance.


