Greetings to the Saints of St. Mark,

¹² So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom. Psalm 90

Could you imagine walking into a dark room you've never been in before? Would you be afraid . . . or excited? How about anxious . . . or confident? Well, that's exactly what we are doing on January 1st of 2018. But you say that you're not in the dark but can see exactly where you are and where you are going. Are you sure? We are creatures of time and space, and though you may be starting at the same space and with a familiar landscape, you and I are about to enter the new time of a new year. Every day will be different than it was in 2017 — even if you keep living in the same house!

It was Bob Dylan who first said, or at least sang, "the times they are a-changin'." And he's right on a lot more levels than he probably realized. Time changes things even when the geography doesn't. Of course, a guy named Heraclitus would beg to differ about that. He's the Greek philosopher who first said, "No one steps into the same river twice." Even standing in one place in a river, the water is not really the same. It changes by just its movement. And so do we.

The dark room we walk into is not so much geography as it is the whole cosmos around us made up of people, places, events, activities, thoughts, feelings, things, travels, and so many other things that will be a part of each of our days in 2018. We don't know what will happen . . . or when . . . or where. But God does. We don't have to walk into a dark room or even this year as if we are totally in the dark. Moses, who lived and wrote and knew a thing or two about God and life, says to ask God to "teach us to number our days" so we can live wisely. This isn't so much about arranging them in order or even how many there will be, but instead, it's about putting the right things into each day — the things that can make them count.

So how do we make each day count? By numbering God first in our lives. He is the only one who knows what's up stream. Jesus is the One who can see in the dark and is the Light of the World. How do we make God number One? Simple, make time for God and give Him room in our days, in our lives. This year, one day at a time, determine to look for God each day, talk to God each day, listen for God each day, thank God each day, and trust God each day. Maybe, write these guides on a 3 x 5 card to help remember. It helps to start our days that way — and finish them that way, too — but it also helps to do it a couple of times a day. Eventually, it will become a habit, a way of life. It will be a change to help with all the other changes — even those of a new year.

Change is inevitable but the right changes take effort. For Christ-followers the best is always yet to come. God is with us, so . . . Welcome 2018!!

Just Do or Just Be

This time of year many people start thinking or talking about some type of New Year's resolution. They are becoming resolved to have some behavioral modification in their lives. I too have made a New Year's resolution or two throughout the years of my life. The reality is as Christians we understand that we need and should see change in our lives as part of our faith and daily walk with Christ.

This need for change and growth sometimes is in extreme contrast with how we live our lives. The Nike slogan says, "Just as many of our actions and reactions to the busymass of our deily

Do it!" Which matches many of our actions and reactions to the busyness of our daily lives. Often times in my own life and many of the people around me, we tend to put forth the mantra, "get it done." We tend to put our head down and lean in with our shoulders and push or pull with great determination to "get it done" when life gets busy. We are a doing people. I understand that well, it is how I am personally wired this way, I like to see task completed, to have a finish line so I can say, 'I achieved something." Anyone else feel that way? We are a doing society.

Recently, I have found myself pondering and wrestling with the spiritual ideas of doing verses the being. Even as I type that I feel an uneasiness roll through my emotions. Being, or abiding in Christ, that seems hard for many people, myself included. The reality is that if a person does not abide or stay connected to Christ there is no doing or no doing that will matter in the long run or eternally. A Christian that does not take time to abide or "be" there is no way for that Christian to change, grow or do what Christ desires. I am afraid that we are like a person just spinning their tires on their car. A lot of smoke, using up the car, tires without going anywhere.

I think we all need to grow in Christ, see changes in our lives, but it must start with our being. When is the last time you thought about being righteous, because God has made you righteous? How about forgiveness, grace, peace, hope or loving? Yes, I want to see people and a church that is doing things for the Kingdom of God. We must first allow our hearts; minds and souls to abide and be in Him. I am resolved to grow in my faith this coming year and it must start with my being in Christ. How are you doing? Is it from your own means and energy or is it because you attached yourself to Christ, abiding in Him that you are doing? Be then do.

What is your dream for your church? To grow to by 10%? By 10 people? By 100 people? Simply to fill the worship space every now and then? Or perhaps it is to grow closer to God? To accomplish whatever it is that the Father wills for St. Mark? To make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world? How would you know when the world has become transformed? It's hard to really nail that down, but it is vitally important that we strive for it!

I'd like to do a thought exercise with you. I don't like to simply talk numbers for numbers sake, because "dollars and derrières" or "butts and bucks" or whatever euphemism you want to use — giving and attendance are not the end game. Changed lives are what we're after. However the numbers do tell a story. And because we're interested in the story, we are also interested in the numbers.

St. Mark averaged 465 in Sunday morning worship in 2017 across our 4 services. I know because I meticulously entered attendance counts every week in my own personal spreadsheet. If you're curious how that breaks down across the 4 services, that is 150 at the 8:45 service, 61 at the 10:00 service, 120 at the 11:00 service, and 147 at the 11:15 service. Now I realize that adds up to 478, which is obviously higher than 465. That difference is due to the fact that many of our regulars attend different services from week to week. That drives the average for any individual service up while keeping our overall attendance the same. I hope you haven't fallen asleep yet! I laid all that out for you, not to judge or compare or "grade" our different services, but simply so that you have that information (the actual data and not anecdotal observations).

For the purposes of this thought exercise, let's focus on that number: 465. If we're interested in more changed lives, by the law of averages that number will have to be higher. So I ask the question again: What is your dream for your church? 500? 600? 1000? Let's just say 500. That would require St. Mark to average an additional 35 persons across the 4 services next year. That seems doable. That seems attainable. Now take that dream and multiply it by a million. We need to grow by 35 million people. How are you going to accomplish that? There aren't 35 million people in our state! In fact, it would take the entire population of South Carolina, North Carolina, AND Georgia to hit 35 million (35.421 million to be exact)!

We can't do that as "St. Mark." We can't even do that as the United Methodist Church! There are only about 7 million of us in the US, and only about 12 million worldwide! We cannot do that alone! And God did not create us to do it alone! "For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us . . ." (Romans 12:4-6 NRSV) We need to be connected to other people. We need to be connected to other groups. We need to be connected to other churches, other denominations, other states, and other countries! ". . . you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." We cannot build God's Kingdom alone. We can only build it with God and with others. A Kingdom mindset starts at home, but extends "to the ends of the earth."



We need to discover how St. Mark can express our life together as a church through common values, strategies, measurements and mission in such a way that unites us together and moves us effectively and purposefully in our life together and ministries to our community.

The framework for our focus comes from a book called *Church Unique* that offers us a process to rethink our thinking about our church and uncover the commonalities. In turn, this will help us discover the "heart of St. Mark" that can draw us closer together, unite us in our vision and ministries, and enable us to better follow God's leading for our church. The premises of the book is each church is unique because it is made up of this people (as opposed to other people who are part of other churches) that are living during this time period (right now, not forty years ago) that are located in our particular location (as in Greenwood, not elsewhere) and within our particular context (our community in the 21st Century). To be unique also means we are to hear Christ's call and follow His ways, not by trying to copy everything other churches are doing but living and serving God out of who our church is. This awareness and understanding of our church means that God has gifted this people – St. Mark – with the talents and resources in our people while calling us and moving through us in particular ways and passions so we might serve and meet the needs of Greenwood in the best ways our church can.

This process is being undertaken under the leadership of our FOCUS Team. They began meeting in November and hope to finish their work in May of 2018. But as we are all part of this church, we will all have opportunities to be involved. There will be a survey sent out by the FOCUS team to the whole church in January. Along with individual responses, the FOCUS team will be conducting interviews with this survey to the various groups of the church. This information will be used by the FOCUS Team to help them discern the particulars that will guide their thinking and discernment. There will be other opportunities for each of us to be engaged in this process during the coming year.
