Our treasurer can collect any amount you choose to pay each month until your \$150 fee is paid. You can also pay in full at any time. And you may withdraw your money without penalty up until March, 2017.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Board received detailed information regarding MMQ's financial status at its meeting on January 5. Here are the highlights:

In 2015 we had a net income of \$4428, which was more than enough to set aside \$2331 (30% of our bazaar sales proceeds) towards the 2017 retreat fund. In fact, our bazaar sales proceeds were 37% higher than the year before. The board felt that rather than being an anomaly, the increased bazaar sales were due primarily to our use of the Square software to accept credit and debit card payments. Certainly we owe much gratitude to our members who made and contributed items to the bazaar; members who organized, contributed to, and taught the bazaar workshops; and all those who worked at the quilt show and the bazaar to help generate this important part of our budget. In fact, our bazaar sales typically generate over 50% of our annual gross revenues, enabling us to have our fabulous programs and education events. Thank you to all of you!

At the end of 2015 we had \$6713 in our savings account, of which \$5117 is designated to the Retreat Fund of 2017. The remaining \$1596 is from the sale of the Judy Hopkins quilts, of which \$275 has been allocated to the Retreat Fund so far in 2016. Our checking account balance at Dec. 31 was \$8151, of which \$1645 was from 2016 dues we received before the end of December.

MONOGRAM MONTAGE

For the 2016 Sunriver Quilt Show, the applique group will be making monogram blocks embellished with Baltimore Album style vines and flowers. The entire guild is invited to participate and you do not have to attend the applique group meetings in order to put a quilt in the exhibit.

Here are some guidelines:

- We are using the monogram letters from Janice Vaine's book, Applique and Embroidery Fundamentals.
- While using the first letter of your name is recommended, you can use any letters you wish (spelling a word for a table runner sounds like a fun idea!) The applique group will be focusing on hand applique, but other methods of applique will be accepted for the quilt show.
- There is no size limit.
- Each participant selects her/his own fabrics and colors.
- Finished monogram projects will be turned in for display at the Sunriver Quilt Show, so a completion date of late July is what we want to shoot for.
- On the third Tuesday of each month, applique group members will be demonstrating hand appliqued vines, flowers and leaves from the book. This will be done at regular applique group meetings, 9:30 a.m.

There is one "Thinking of You" to Diana Gonce whose husband is ill.

The minutes from the November 10, 2015 Business Meeting were motioned, seconded and approved.

Marleen Fugate awarded the Golden Needle Award to Karen Padrick for her excellent work on the Newsletter (she was unable to attend the Christmas Party and receive her award there).

Program - Jan Tetzlaff introduced the Program for the day "Baltimore Album". Bevalee Runner and Lillian Arnold were the guest speakers. A brief history of the beginning of Baltimore Album style of applique was given. It is all about "Politics, Religion and Passion". They also explained when the Applique Group in the guild was formed. The Applique Group will be starting a Baltimore Album block in January and all are invited to join in this project.

Treasurer, Mindy Wolfman, reported the financial status of the guild. The treasurer's report was motioned, seconded and approved by the membership.

Sally Wilson, Membership, reported she had received 85 membership applications (9 are new members). If you haven't received or picked up your membership card by the end of January, it will be mailed to you.

Communications and Website – Louise Yoshihara reports that new and updated information is being added to the website as she receives the data.

Program – Jan Tetzlaff states that Valori Wells will be the speaker next month for program; Joe Cunningham will be here in May; July will be our newest master quilter, Dolores Petty; and in September we will have Janet Fogg. **Ruth Kinane, Education**, reported that Judy A Johnson will have a class on silk ties January 25. On February 23, there will be a class on embellishments. Stations will be set up for "Bead Work", "Embroidery", "Ribbon Work" and "Trims"

Sunriver Quilt Show – Barb Lowery said to watch the "Newsletter" for news about the show. There is a meeting on March 4th at the SHARC at 10:00 in the Crescent Room to discuss the quilt show.

Marilyn Bowman and Michele Mullenberg announced that Bazaar classes are starting in February and the first will be in LaPine at Homestead Quilts. They will be making a growth chart quilt and crayon holders.

Sue Humistan, Service Projects, passed around a sign-up for members to suggest organizations where they would like to donate quilts. Next month there will be a vote to decide on which organizations will receive our quilts. **Newsletter, Karen Padrick**, announced the deadline for the next newsletter is 1/19/16. Linda Saukkonen, MMQ Retreat, stated the retreat will be held on May, 9th, 10th and 11th, 2017 (2 ½ days). She handed out a flyer telling us the assignment of teachers will be on a first come, first serve basis. What to do: 1) Choose a teacher 2) Pay \$10 down at the Feb. meeting to hold a space and 3) you have options in how to pay for the rest of the retreat (\$150 total). The retreat includes classes, dinner, 3 lunches and breakfast snacks. Tuesday the 9th (our regular business meeting time) will be a trunk show by Jan Krentz. Wednesday night Maria Shell will give a trunk show. Both of these events are open to guild members even if they are not attending the retreat.

Julia Jeans and Judy A Johnson, Sisters Quilt Show, announced there will be about 15 members showing "Hexagon" quilts at the show in July.

Sandra Smidgall, Block of the Month, will be providing blocks of stars this year.

Nancy Fischer, Technique of the Month, will start with the Hourglass block. After that she will be focusing on the use of specialty rulers.

Secret Sisters, Marcia Schlonlau, reports there are 12 members so far in Secret Sisters this year.

Marleen Fugate, Christmas Party, reported that the board approved the site, The Great Hall, but that the date is still not confirmed.

New Business – **Mindy Wolfman, Treasurer**, presented and discussed the 2016 "Proposed Cash Budget" approved by the Board. The membership motioned, seconded and approved the budget.

Old Business – LaWanda Richardson presented the revision to the bylaws that reflect the change we have in membership description. We no longer have "active" and "associate" members. This change was motioned, seconded and approved by the membership.

"Show and Tell" and Drawings occurred.

Board Meeting Minutes January 5, 2016

Meeting called to order by President, LaWanda Richardson at 10:20 am. The following reports were given:

Membership – Sally Wilson stated as of this date she has 44 membership renewals and 8 new members.

Program – Jan Tetzlaff has almost the entire year scheduled for programs.

Education – Ruth Kinane reported the first two months are set.

Service Projects – Sue Humistan will conduct a survey in January for options for our service projects and the guild will vote on what they want in February.

Newsletter – Karen Padrick states the deadline for the next newsletter is January 19, 2016.

Retreat – Linda Saukkonen not present. Jan and LaWanda reported that we have two presenters: Maria Shell and Jan Krentz. The committee is wondering if we will need a third teacher since the event will be held at the SHARC and more attendees are expected. Event is planned for May 9th, 10th and 11th.

BOM and TOM – LaWanda reported they are ready to go.

Sisters Quilt Show - This year is "hexagons" and the quilts must be 40" wide. Information will be reviewed at the January Business Meeting

Bazaar Classes – Workshops will generally be at the SHARC; but there are classes planned for Homestead Quilts in LaPine and at the Bend Park and Recreation Facility. Information will be in the newsletter.

New Business:

The issue of copyright laws was brought up in regard to bazaar classes being taught using other quilter's patterns. The proposal was made that teachers of classes will request permission to "use" and "copy" these patterns. If they do not receive permission the guild will purchase patterns for use. The patterns would then be maintained in a guild library. This proposal was passed by the Board. Mindy Wolfman volunteered to maintain the library of patterns.

Phone Tree – Phone tree procedures were established in the event we need to cancel a meeting on short notice. The President will determine when a meeting is to be cancelled.

Newcomers Tea - It was voted on and passed that we would have a Newcomer's Tea this year with the date to be set later since we have had many new members join in the last year.

The question was brought up about prorating our dues for new members who join at any time during the year, as we do in October. The Board decided to keep things as they are. You pay full dues until October, at which time you still pay full dues but it will include the following year.

Sunriver Quilt Show – there is question as to whether the guild needs to have all volunteers who work at the Sunriver Quilt Show sign Liability Waivers. This will be discussed at a later time.

Budget for 2016. Mindy Wolfman, Treasurer, reviewed and discussed the 3 handouts that she had: "Income Statement – Two Year", Multi Year-End Balance Sheet" and "Proposed Cash Budget for 2016". The Board approved the budget for 2016 and the Proposed Budget will be presented to the guild on 1/12/16 for final vote.

Banking: The Board proposed and approved that the names Barbara Lowery and Marlene Fugate be removed from the bank signature card and that the names Melinda Wolfman and LaWanda Richardson be added for 2016.

Donation Slips have been printed and were given to the Service Project Chairperson and the Bazaar Chairperson. The only things that can be claimed for tax purposes are your materials; you cannot include your individual time as part of the donation.

Meeting adjourned at 12:30 pm. Minutes prepared by Michelle McMicken, Secretary.




BJ's Quilt Basket
