### PROGRAM MEETING 10:00 am April 12 Jane Kirkpatrick

Jane Kirkpatrick, the Bend author, speaker and teacher who describes herself as "weaving the stories of our lives" into her books will present our April 12th program.

"Life is messy," Jane says. "I look to the landscape, to relationships and spirituality to find the threads" that tell women's stories.

Aurora: An Experience in Quilt, Community and Craft is Jane's non-fiction book about stitches and craft in the Old Aurora Colony of Oregon's lush Willamette Valley. Quilts tell a story, and Jane uses them to piece together the real lives of Oregon pioneers. Primarily a fiction author, Jane's books have sold over a million copies. Many of her historical fiction books are based on research and interviews with descendants of Northwest settlers. She combines her mental health background and imagination with her research to write her characters' stories. Homestead, Jane's first book, tells the story of the ranch she and her husband, Jerry, built along the John Day River. Today she and her husband live in Bend.

### Joe Cunningham

Joe Cunningham will be presenting our May program and teaching a class the next day, Wednesday, May 11.

Joe is not your traditional quilter. He was first a rock quitarist. Then he fell in love with the work of a traditional quilter born in 1910, Mary Schafer. Together with Gwen Marston he authored a book documenting Schafer's quilts. This led to sitting at a quilt frame and copying traditional quilts, stitch by stitch.

In 1991 Joe struck out on his own and began making original statements in his quilts. He has not stopped. The San Francisco artist frequently exhibits his work in galleries and museums.

On May 11 Joe will teach a class, Rock the Block Album Style. We will learn how to make a simple block that looks complex and leads to unavoidable originality.

As of February 29 we had collected about 83% of our dues for the year; I appeal to the remaining members to please submit your dues this month so that we can continue to provide our excellent programs through the first half of 2016. Our checking account balance at the end of February was \$8700, and we had \$7300 in the savings account. Of this amount in savings, \$5940 is designated for the 2017 retreat, which includes \$550 in participant deposits collected at the general meeting on February 9.

The minutes from the February 9th, 2016 Business Meeting were motioned, seconded and approved with no changes.

**Announcements:** Patty Gates handed out a supply list for the next Applique class.

**Program** – Jan Tetzlaff introduced Betty Gientke as our speaker for the day. Betty has lived in Bend for about 12 years and is a self-taught quilter. She belongs to the following quilt groups: Journeys, Undercover Book Club and SAQA. Her subject was "Working in a Series...We All Do It". She shared her series of quilts inspired by natural pools and a new series she is starting on Aspen Trees. She challenges herself in each quilt such as with her perspective, using beads, a particular inspiration, and free form or using all silk. It's about discovering your own style.


Hexagon Quilt Class




### BJ's Quilt Basket
