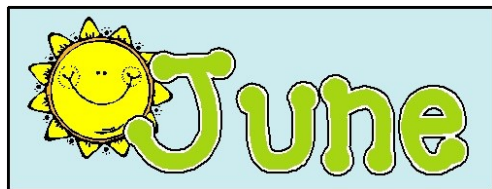

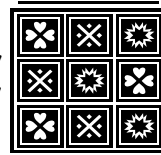

Wearable Art Does Not Mean a Walking Quilt, My Mistakes and Successes

Deb Wilkinson has a passion for wearable art. The first garment she made, "Forever," won first place at the Tanana Valley State Fair in Alaska in the early '90s. In 2014 Deb's jacket, "Two Birds," took first place at the Pacific International Quilt Festival in Santa Clara.

On Tuesday, June 14 Deb will share her journey from making her own wool clothing in Maine, where she grew up, to creating outdoor gear and award winning quilted clothing in Alaska, where she taught and raised a family.

Two years ago Deb and her husband retired to Bend. She continues to create, sew, knit, ski and work with her therapy dog, Ole.

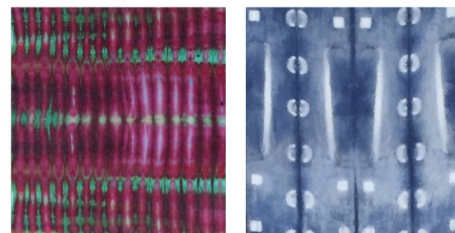

TREASURER'S REPORT

Through the end of April we had collected dues from 128 members, which brings us very close to our goal of 135 members for 2016. There were no unusual or noteworthy expenditures in April.

As of April 30 our checking account balance was just over \$10,000. Our savings account had a balance of \$7600, of which \$6300 is designated for the retreat in 2017. This amount includes \$900 of deposits from retreat participants. The required annual reports with the Internal Revenue Service and the OR Dept of Justice were completed and timely submitted in April.

MINUTES
Business Meeting
May 10, 2016

Meeting was called to order at 10:00 am by President, LaWanda Richardson.

Greeter, Connie Cleveland, announced we had five visitors today, including some new members.

Diana Gonce, Hospitality, announced that the treats were provided by Mike Carriger, Terry Anderson and Dorothy Spain.

There were no "Thinking of You's".

The minutes from the April 12th, 2016 Business Meeting were motioned, seconded and approved with no changes. However the minutes to the April 12th Board Meeting had a clarification. The clarification and the minutes were then approved and seconded.

The corrected paragraph now reads as follows:

Mention was made on the growing size of the quilt and the lack of space and seating at the Education Meetings (4th Tuesdays). It was also noted we were only allowed the room until 1:00 and that wasn't working if we wanted to have a class. We discussed moving our Education meetings to the Dillard Room next year as we have outgrown the current room. We also discussed using the Dillard Room for the upcoming education meeting on April 26th. Mindy said there was room in the budget to do this. Patty checked on availability and the room was not available.

Announcements: LaWanda introduced Dottie Knuth from the Mt. Bachelor Quilt Guild who attended the meeting with their raffle quilt for this year. She was selling tickets. Sandy Mahnken announced she needed the completed "Crazy Squares" we were all working on so she can determine the size of the quilt the guild is making.

Program: Jan Tetzlaff introduced Joe Cunningham as our guest for the day. He is a nationally known quilter who started his career as a rock guitarist. He became interested in traditional quilting when working with Gwen Marston on a book about quilter Mary Schaefer who quilted around 1910. In the beginning he adhered to strict traditional quilting but the creativity he had soon became apparent and he wanted to try new things and branched out. He started his lecture with his guitar and a kind of slow rap song about quilting. It got everyone in the mood for a fun talk. He was very entertaining. Joe also shared some of his quilts and had CDs for sale.

Mindy Wolfman gave the Treasurer's report. As of the end of April we had \$10,000 in the checking account and \$7,600 in the Savings account. (\$6300 of the money in the savings account is for the retreat next year.) The required reports to IRS were completed and sent in April. The treasurer's report was motioned, seconded and approved with no discussion.

Sally Wilson, Membership, reported we now have 132 members. She also stated she had membership cards that have not been picked up, see her for yours if you haven't received it yet.

Communications and Website – Louise Yoshihara stated she has been working on the website and all is working well.

Program – Jan Tetzlaff announced that Deb Wilkinson, a clothing designer, will be the speaker for Program in June. To Deb "Wearable Art is not a t-shirt with a saying".

Education, Ruth Kinane announced the Education class in May will be an open "mike" for members to give a "4 minute" quilting instruction of their choice. The winner will receive a \$20 gift certificate to a quilt store.

Sunriver Quilt Show – Barb Lowery again asked for more volunteers for the quilt show. You can volunteer to help in more than one area.

Marilyn Bowman announced the Bazaar classes on Wednesday, May 18th, will be making microwave bowls (taught by Marleen Fugate) and a "Four Circle Patch Runner" (taught by Pat Jones). The June 15th class will have Beryl Wilcox teaching a jewelry bag holder for traveling and Debra Ewing will be teaching making rice bags that can be heated or chilled. In July, the class will be about making car trash bags and crib blankets. Classes will be at the SHARC.

Sue Humistan, Service Projects, announced that we had already received "Thank You Notes" from the agencies where we delivered quilts, she read one of the notes from the "Kid's Center". Seven service quilts were turned in today.

Retreat – Linda Saukkonen talked to the retreat instructors and they stated they would accommodate the waiting list into their classes.

Julia Jeans and Judy A Johnson, Sisters Quilt Show, announced that there are 19 members showing quilts in the "Hexie" exhibit at the show.

Applique class – Bevalee announced that since the April class was canceled, the May class information will cover the April material and the May class will be transferred to June. Applique class is the third Tuesday at Bevalee Runners home.

Sandra Smidgall, Block of the Month, Not available. Several members showed their recent BOM blocks.

Nancy Fischer, Technique of the Month, stated that the May TOM would be about "Disappearing 9 Patch" and she will have handouts. (Also Part II of "Elton John").

Marleen Fugate, Christmas Party, reported the party will be on our regular Tuesday Meeting time - 12/13/16.

Secret Sisters - Marcia Schonlau asked that we please remember to pick up our gifts and to take home gifts not picked up.

New Business: La Wanda stated there had been questions about the use of the service fabric and she gave us clarification. Fabric that is donated specifically for service quilts can only be used for service quilts. So, please when you are donating to the guild, specify it is for the "guild"; then it can be used as the guild determines (which means it could be used for bazaar classes). This gives the guild more flexibility. Also, many fabrics have accumulated in the service fabric bins that are not suitable for quilting (example: terry cloth). The decision has been made to have a sale to the membership at the July Business Meeting of this extra fabric (Second Tuesday of July).

No Old Business.

"Show and Tell" and "Drawings" occurred.

Meeting adjourned.

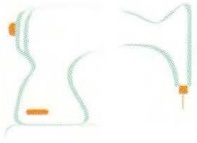
