

PROGRAM MEETING 10:00 am August 9 Sheila Finzer

Terrebonne artist Sheila Finzer will share with us the Phases of Discovery in Art Quilting for our August meeting.

Creating fiber art is Sheila's passion. She transforms fabric into her own interpretation of the beauty and serenity of nature. Her intent is to create works of art that invite the viewer to draw closer as the imagery invites discoveries of color, detail and texture.

Sheila's art begins with photos and sketching. At some point the piece takes on its own energy. Most of her quilts are fabric collaged with hand dyed and painted fabrics.

Born in Prineville, Sheila now resides in Terrebonne with her husband Steve and dog, Bailey. Sewing has been a constant in her life, from embroidery as a child, to making her own clothing, to her former wholesale appliquéd clothing business. In addition to her BS in Home Economics from Oregon State, Sheila has studied with many art and quilting instructors. Since 2003 this award winning quilter's work has shown in many regional and national juried art shows.

Janet Fogg

Janet Fogg, internationally recognized quilt maker and designer will present our program for our September 13th meeting. The next day, Wednesday, Sept. 14, Janet will teach a class using her techniques. There is no charge for the class but the purchase of one of Janet Fogg's kits is required. Most of the kits are \$80 and include all fabric and pattern required to make the quilt top and binding. Janet's patterns require a number of fabrics to give the finished project its look of complexity, so buying a kit is very cost effective. 

TREASURER'S REPORT

It is such a pleasure to once again be able to report on our glowing financial position - this time for the entire first half of the year. With only two exceptions, all of our expenses year to date are well below what was budgeted for the period, which means our net income for the year is likely to be larger than what was anticipated. We can thank our various committee chairs and their teams for providing us with such great programs and activities well within their budgets! The only exceptions are (1) our facility fees paid to SROA for use of our meeting rooms at the SHARC; as I mentioned earlier the fees have been increased twice this year, which means we will have to increase our budget for these expenses in future years, and (2) various expenses incurred in connection with our service projects. The increased service project expense is directly related to the increase in the number and frequency of our guilt donations to the various charitable organization recipients. Kudos are due to our service project committee and all of our members who donate their time, fabric, money, and effort to this very worthy cause. The charitable organizations that receive our donated quilts are extremely appreciative, and this activity is a vital component of our exempt function. I hope we will continue to increase service project activity, and welcome the increased expenses that are bound to result from growth in this area.

As of July 1 we had \$7800 in our checking account and \$7800 in our savings account (both amounts are rounded to the nearest \$100.) Most of our savings account (\$6400) is earmarked for our 2017 retreat. and this amount includes \$1040 we have received as deposits from retreat participants.



Thank you so much for your continued support of the quilt show in so very many ways: exciting quilts, volunteering for hostess, hanging, office, etc. I am looking forward to coming to your show and being a guest and buying potholders. You always have a wonderful show and it is hung so nicely.

As you know this is our HUGE inventory time of year and I planned ahead so we would have lots of great fabric, etc. for the whole summer. We actually had five big boxes arrive from Cotton and Steel the day before quilt show, they read the shipping date wrong and sent it a month early. It is all the bolts I choose at market. Val created a wonderful display of our Christmas collections in her market booth in the classroom, it is wonderful and full of some really beautiful offerings. Our batiks inventory (largest selection in Central Oregon) filled the classroom at quilt show and it is stunning. These are their first store samples. The Sparrow machines are all metal in the inside and sew like a dream. They are entry level machines and very affordable. I have been sewing on one at the moment since my big Bernina is on the fritz. They are great for a class machine or a granddaughter. We have them set up in the classroom so you can try them out. Don't miss Valori Wells' new fabric line, "Marks!" This new line captures the freedom of the out-of-doors in pattern, color, and texture. The woven imagery was created with hand-carved blocks, carefully layered and painted, resulting in three unique color palettes: Charcoal, Saffron, and Indigo.
