PROGRAM MEETING 10:00 am JOANNA PRICE

Salem quilt artist Joanna Price will present our October program. A quilter for 20 years and teacher for 17, Joanna loves to experiment with surface design techniques including fabric painting and dyeing, eco and rust dyeing, soy wax batik, mono printing, silk painting, thread painting, beading, screen painting and stamp carving.

She has developed a technique called Zen-Doodle-Foil based on the popular Zentangle craze. On Wednesday, Oct. 12 Joanna will teach a class on how to make a Zen-Doodle-foil pillow cover. Zentangle is a trademarked method of doodling. Zen-doodling, Joanna's technique, does not require any previous drawing skills. After a few practice doodles, the patterns are inked onto white fabric. Add batting, free motion quilt over the inked lines, then fusible appliqué is added to enhance your design. The result is a beautiful, one of a kind pillow. Joanna will demonstrate adding to the final design with small accents of transfer foil. (Sample of pillow below.)

TREASURER'S REPORT

MMQ's big financial news for the month of August is, of course, the huge success of our guilt show. We received (and sold) \$7175 in value of potholders, table runners, other bazaar items, books and magazines. We also received a \$1500 donation from the Sunriver Village in support of the show, \$240 in handling fees from members who sold guilts at the show using our credit card service, and \$250 from the five vendors who had booths at the show. Total income related to the show was \$9165. Thanks to the efforts of our guilt show organizers and committee members, our total expenses related to the show were relatively minor: \$225 in credit card fees relating to the bazaar sales, \$75 Crescent Room rental fees for the bazaar workshops, \$600 for the Summit Jazz Band performance during the show, and \$570 is various printing and labor charges for show promotion. Total expenses related to the show were \$1470.

For those keeping track, the overall addition to our budget for hosting the 2016 quilt show was \$7700. So many thanks are due to so many members who donated their time, efforts, fabric, sewing supplies, etc etc to make our bazaar sales and other show efforts so successful. Everyone involved deserves a huge round of applause. Thank you!!

Now for the boring part: as of August 31, our checking account balance was \$14,740, and our savings account had \$7,840, of which \$6,500 is designated for the 2017 retreat. On September 10 \$2260 was moved into the retreat fund from the checking account representing the portion of bazaar sales which each year is designated to the next retreat.

MMQ Exhibit at Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show Update Special Reguest to Members

At the September business meeting "Cabin Fever" was selected as the theme for MMQ's Special Exhibit at the 2017 Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show. Quilts for the exhibit can be made with traditional, log cabin blocks – or they can be pictorial art quilts with a cabin theme. Variations of the log cabin blocks, such as Courthouse Steps, Pineapple Log Cabins, and Chevron Log Cabins also qualify, as do more modern variations such as Folded Log Cabins, and Fractured Log Cabins.

Cabin Fever quilts entered in the Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show will be a part of the Sunriver Quilt Show in August. <u>However, you do not need to complete a Cabin Fever quilt for Sisters in order to enter one in the Sunriver Show.</u>

Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show has called a meeting of Special Exhibit coordinators on the 28th of this month. At that time they will go over timelines and parameters. This <u>may</u> mean that they plan changes for 2017. Julia and I will attend and keep you informed. In the past, quilt titles and dimensions have been due in mid-January, with actual quilts delivered in June. The quilts have been required to be 40 inches or greater in width and no longer than 100 inches in length.

Now a special request: If you have a Log Cabin or cabin-themed quilt that you have made in the past, will you please bring it to the <u>October business meeting</u>. A quick show-and-tell of these quilts is sure to inspire members and get the creative juices flowing. I will also start a "lending library" of log cabin books, patterns, photos, and other resources - so please bring to any meeting those that you are willing to share with others.

Michelle McMicken

It is my pleasure to nominate Michelle McMicken for Master Quilter. Michelle has shown over and over again that she is worthy of this honor by her service to the guild and the community, by diligently working to master every aspect of hand and machine quilting, and succeeding beautifully. Please consider the following list of Michelle's accomplishments in her eleven years of quilting.

• Michelle started sewing when she was eight years old; she has a Home Economics degree, and spent many years sewing clothes for herself and her daughter. Michelle began quilting in 2005 and joined our guild in 2007, immediately immersing herself in the diverse education programs and activities we have to offer, including participating in guild retreats and taking classes from various nationally recognized instructors.

• From the beginning of her association with the guild, Michelle was eager to volunteer and took charge of the Secret Sister program in 2008. In 2009 Michelle served as Bazaar chairperson, organizing the workshops and teaching some as well. During the years when members of the guild took turns teaching block of the month and technique of the month, Michelle stepped forward to take her turn as a teacher.

• Michelle became CoChair of the guild in 2011 and supervised the rewriting of the guild bylaws and job descriptions. She served as President of the guild in 2012 and stayed on the board as past President in 2013. During her years as CoChair, President, and past President, Michelle made the new guild banner and supervised the construction of the Bazaar banner, doing a lot of the work herself. Michelle also handled the transition of our meetings from Holy Trinity Church and Cascade Bible Church to our present location at the SHARC.

• In 2014 Michelle volunteered with quilt shop door prize drawings and cochaired the organization of the Christmas luncheon. She also taught a guild education program on color. In 2016, Michelle taught an education class on machine needles and she is currently serving as guild secretary.

• Every year since Michelle has joined the guild, she has made items for the bazaar and for the past seven years has taught at least one bazaar workshop each year. Michelle has made at least one service quilt each year that she has been a member of the guild except for the year she served as President. As soon as Michelle joined the guild, she started attending the applique group in order to learn how to applique. Only two years later, in 2009, her skills had advanced to the point that her Shop Hop quilt with the hand appliqued basket center was chosen as the winner of the 2009 "Shop Hop Challenge" over all other contestants in Central Oregon. Then in 2010, Michelle designed her own quilt for the Hoffman Challenge and her quilt was chosen to travel with the exhibit around the U.S. for a year. This quilt also had a considerable amount of hand applique. Michelle continues to be a regular member of the applique group and has taught various miniworkshops there. She is also a member of the Fiber Chix group since its beginning in 2010. Michelle's quilts have been included in many special exhibits including those of the Applique Group, Fiber Chix, Novel Idea Quilts, and the Shaker Challenge, where she won Viewer's Choice and Best Use of Color in 2011. Michelle was chosen to be the first exhibitor featured in BJ's Quilt Basket's new "Hall of Fame" in October 2014. She has continued to further her skills by taking classes in various techniques at all of the local shops and at other west coast shows. I trust that Michelle is a lifelong learner and "doer" and will continue to push herself towards further excellence. She is indeed worthy to be a "Master Quilter".

Pat Jones

We highly recommend Pat Jones for Mountain Meadow Quilt Guild Master Quilter of the year.

Pat began learning to sew as a young teenager by making her own clothes. Later moving on to children's clothing, pillow quilts and embroidery. While Pat was a Junior High art teacher in Winnemucca, Nevada (where she taught for many years) she and a group of teachers took their first piecing and sewing equipment classes, led by a Home Economics teacher. As a result of those classes Pat has had her quilts displayed in Winnemucca, Nevada's local art gallery and contributed many quilts to charity.

After retiring from education she and her husband moved to Alaska where she joined another quilt group. She again made charity quilts, attended retreats and taught classes for the community college and her quilt group. Pat and her husband moved to Oregon in 2007; the year she joined MMQ. She has taken classes yearly from nationally recognized teachers such as David Taylor, Margaret Miller, Helene Knott and many others at Sisters Quilters Affair and our local quilt shops. She has taught and attended many classes at MMQ as well as our retreats. She has accepted offices in the guild since the beginning of her membership, starting with hospitality in 2008 and 2009, then programs in 2010 and 2011. Pat was our quilt show chairman in 2012 where she introduced maps and hostess badges to our show. In 2013 she was vice president of our guild and president in 2014. During her time as president she spearheaded the process for the guild to become a non-profit, working many hours with an accountant and an attorney.

Pat has consistently volunteered for the hanging and quilt takedown on quilt show day and has always displayed her beautiful quilts at MMQ's show. She has displayed quilts at QuiltWorks, Sisters, Fiber Chix special exhibits and had a quilt on display in an exhibit at the Sunriver Lodge. Pat is greatly admired for her many accomplishments and dedication to our guild challenges, and Shaker Challenges. She has contributed to MMQ's special quilt displays at the Sisters Quilt Shows in July and this year to the Modern Quilt traveling show. Pat continues to donate her teaching talents along with donating charity quilts, and bazaar items every year. Pat has also had a picture of her quilt published in Sarah Kaufman's book, "Folded Log Cabin Quilts".

This is just a brief summary of her time and commitment to our guild and other quilt groups she has been an active member of.

Board Meeting Minute August 23, 2016

Board Members Attending: LaWanda Richardson, Patty Gates, Marleen Fugate, Michelle McMicken, Mindy Wolfman, Sally Wilson, Karen Padrick, Ruth Kinane and Sue Humiston.

Other attendees: Michele Mullenberg, Mike Carriger, Sandy Mahnken, Denise Meese, Linda Saukkonen, Barb Lowery, Louise Yoshihara, Cate Brooks, Judy A. Johnson, Dorothy Spain and Jan Beeson.

Meeting called to order by President, LaWanda Richardson, at 11:40 am. Agenda as follows:

1. Guild Hexagon Quilt – The question is: What should we do with the hexagon crazy quilt (made by the guild) that was to be auctioned off at the Quilt Show. There were no real bids. It was decided that we didn't properly advertise the auction, nor show the quilt well at the show. So now, what do we do with it? After discussion it was decided to see if B.J.'s would hang the quilt with our hexagon display and offer it for sale for \$75. If it shouldn't sell, we would raffle off the quilt at our annual Christmas Party.

2. Future Education Meeting Site – We currently are meeting in the Crescent Room at the SHARC; however, our attendance is often over the limit for the size of the room. The room is hot, stuffy and there are not enough chairs for everyone to sit down. In addition we are unable to book the room on the same afternoon of our meetings for classes.

LaWanda announced at several previous meetings and in the newsletter for suggestions of where we might meet asking members what they would like to do. There doesn't seem to be many options for the space we need. What came up often was meeting at B.J.'s Quilt Basket. LaWanda stated that a lot of the LaPine contingency told her they would not mind traveling to Bend, as they carpool and often go to Bend from Sunriver anyway.

LaWanda and Kathy Shaker, owner of B.J.'s, discussed this possibility. Kathy has a room rental rate that would be costly for the guild over a year's time. What they worked out was: the guild could rent the room for \$15 a half day and \$30 for the whole day **if** we set up the chairs and take them down after the meeting and cleaned up after ourselves (vacuuming if necessary). We can have food in the room, have potlucks, and are provided excellent sewing conditions with spacious tables, ironing and cutting stations. Another problem would be that the store does not open until 9:30. Our hostesses usually arrive before that time to set up the coffee and snacks.

There was a great deal of discussion among board members and other attendees. A lot of members come before the 9:30 social time. It was decided we could have a room monitor that only allowed people setting up to enter prior to 9:30. Sandy Mahnken lives close by and volunteered to be the room monitor. After 9:30 we would use the back door to enter and not parade through the store (unless you want to shop). Kathy doesn't want anyone roaming around the store **before** 9:30.

Parking was suggested as a possible problem. On B.J.'s First Saturdays, people parked on the side of Joann's. We would need to explore if this is possible for us to do. We thought that we should leave the parking spaces in front of B.J.'s open for regular shoppers.

LaWanda asked if this vote should be approved by the membership. The Board members and those attending all thought there were enough people attending this meeting that it was a representative of the guild and we should just have the board vote.

The Board voted and unanimously approved meeting at B.J.'s for the Education Meetings starting in January 2017. With the idea of not excluding our other local quilt store supporters, we would look into holding bazaar classes in their stores (Sew Many Quilts, Quiltworks and Homestead Quilts).

Future things to think about:

Mindy Wolfman, Treasurer, stated she was uncomfortable charging guild members 5% for using the "Square" at the quilt show. Currently, if a member sold their quilt at the show they knew that 5% of the price would go to the guild if the quilt was purchased by credit. This was done to cover the guild's cost of using the Square. Mindy says it costs about 2 ¾% for the Square's use. 5% had been chosen just because it was thought to be easier. Mindy says the Treasurer is the one who handles that transaction and 2 ¾% is just as easy. She would like this to be discussed at the next board meeting.

Marleen Fugate suggested that the guild look into buying our own microphone. The SHARC is now charging us for the use of their microphone (which doesn't work well) at a cost of about \$300 a year. This will be explored and discussed later.

Meeting adjourned at 12:15 pm.

MINUTES Business Meeting September 13, 2016

Meeting was called to order at 10:00 am by President, LaWanda Richardson.

Greeter: Cynthia Gore announced two visitors today: Della visiting from Sacramento, CA and Helen Brisson's sister, Bonnie. **Hospitality:** Diana Gonce announced that the treats were provided by Cynthia Gore, LaWanda Richardson, Delores Petty and Nancy Fischer.

"Thinking of You's": Sue Schimke thanked everyone in the guild for their support after her husband's accident. Laverne Torchio's husband passed away.

Minutes: The minutes from the August 9th, 2016 Business Meeting, were motioned, seconded and approved with no corrections. **Announcements:** There will be a short, brief board meeting during the break. Judy A. Johnson made sure the ballots were passed out to vote on the guild's "special exhibit" for next year. Read over and vote during the meeting. Patty Gates has three remaining positions open for 2017: Hospitality Coordinator, Education Coordinator and the MMQ Quilt Show Coordinator. Karen Padrick volunteered to take care of Hospitality. Please contact Patty Gates if you are interested in one of the other positions. Kate MacMillan, on behalf of Mt. Bachelor Guild, asked if we would be willing to take classes in Bend when we share sponsorship of well-known quilters. The Guild raised hands that we would support classes on Sat. in Bend. Nancy Fischer announced that she will begin teaching classes at B.J.'s Quilt Basket in Oct., and will be teaching Quilting 101 next year. **Program:** Jan Tetzlaff introduced our guest speaker, Janet Fogg. Janet is from Lake Oswego and an award winning quilter. She takes traditional patterns and expands upon them. She calls herself an "Innovative Traditional Quilter". She became a seamstress in high school and then completed a degree in Graphic Design. She was employed as an Art Director and began quilting after her second child was born. She has developed 25 patterns, many of which she showed us her samples. There were a lot of wonderful quilts to see. Her motto is "Just take your time and enjoy it".

Treasurer: Mindy Wolfman reported that the net earnings from the Quilt Show were \$7700. The Checking Account contains \$14,740 and the Savings Account has \$7840. \$2260 has been moved to the Retreat fund (its percentage of the Quilt Show profits) which now has \$6500. **10 Minute Break:** LaWanda called a brief Board Meeting. The artist who has previously made our Master Quilter Badges is no longer doing business. The badges were made of some kind of polymer. She gave some suggestions to LaWanda of where to look online, but this proved futile. It was suggested we talk to Cheryl Chapman in our guild. She has an art glass studio called "Silly Dog Art Glass" and she stated she could make something like what we have had for a very reasonable price. The Board voted to employ her for this task.

Membership: Sally Wilson reports we now have 143 members.

Communications and Website: no report.

Program: Jan Tetzlaff announced that next month Joanna Price will be the guest speaker. Her topic is "Zen Doodling with Fabric". A sign-up will be going around.

Sunriver Quilt Show - No report.

Education: In September Carol Elsbree will have a class showing us all how to make an autumn table runner with felt and silk leaves. The Education Meeting in October will be held at B.J.'s Quilt Basket. There will be a class using the Mexican Star Pattern. A pattern must be purchased and your material cut out before the class. A sign-up was passed around and more information will be coming.

Bazaar: No report.

Service Projects: Sue Humiston showed nine more quilts that have been completed for delivery. We have close to 70 quilts so far. **Newsletter:** Karen Padrick stated the next newsletter deadline is September 20th.

Retreat: No report.

Sisters Quilt Show: No report.

Applique: Bevalee Runner said the applique group is currently working on their own projects and that she will not be teaching any beginning applique (in guild classes) at this time. She is however, teaching Beginning Applique at B.J.'s Quilt Basket if you are interested. She will be teaching from her own original pattern of "Butterflies" which will give you the techniques you need to learn. The class will be 2 sessions for \$35. Guild applique classes are on the third Tuesday of each month, 9:30 am, at Bevalee's home.

Block of the Month: Three members showed "Stars" they have completed.

Technique of the Month – Nancy Fischer will show how to make a quilt square on graph paper in Sept. In October she gave her time to the "Mexican Star" class. Nancy has talked with the Block of the Month teacher for 2017 (Debra Ewing) and next year their classes will be coordinated with one another.

Christmas Party: Marleen Fugate reported the party will be on 12/13/16.

Secret Sisters Marcia Schonlau asked that we please remember to pick up our gifts and to take home gifts not picked up. New Business: None.

Old Business: 1. The Board met on August 9th to discuss changing the location of the Education Meeting beginning in January 2017. LaWanda stated the decision was voted on and approved to re-locate our education meeting to B.J.'s Quilt Basket. Kathy Shaker gave us a very good deal; however, <u>there are rules</u>. Rule #1. Do not park in front of the store entrance; leave that area for her customers. You can park in the rear or on the side streets or in Joanns' side parking lot. Rule #2. The store does not officially open until 9:30. We can enter by the backdoor to set up Hospitality and the meeting but cannot enter the store area until after 9:30.

2. In the "Newcomers Newsletter" it is mentioned to please not wear fragrances to the meetings as many people have allergies and it causes problems for them.

3. Two members have been nominated for Master Quilter: Michelle McMicken and Pat Jones. The nomination letters for both were read. The election (by secret ballot) for Master Quilter will be at the October Business Meeting on October 11th. If you cannot attend please follow the mail-in ballot instructions and mail before the previous Friday.

4. After tallying the votes taken today, Julia Jeans and Judy Johnson announced the theme for next year's guild "special exhibit". The theme will be "Cabin Fever". The description for Cabin Fever was: Traditional, modern, and abstract quilts made with the log cabin block, and pictorial art quilts that have a cabin theme. The quilt must be a minimum of 40" X 40" and no larger than 104". There will be more information in the newsletter. **"Show and Tell"** and **"Drawings"** occurred.
