TREASURER'S REPORT

Once again I am happy to report that MMQ's finances for 2016 continue to be strong. All of our revenues for the year have exceeded budget, and expenses are well below expected for the year to date. As of September 30 we had \$11,100 in our checking account and \$10,200 in our savings account, of which \$8850 is designated for next year's retreat.

In regards to the retreat, if you are thinking of participating, I would encourage you to sign up. The retreat committee has been working very hard and it looks to be a really great event. At this time there is no waiting list for either class If you are put on a waiting list, no deposit is required. The total fee of \$150 is due by the end of March, and I am collecting installments from anyone who would like to spread their payments out over time. I'm sure a good time will be had by all!

MINUTES Business Meeting October 11, 2016

Meeting was called to order at 10:00 am by President, LaWanda Richardson.

Greeter: Denise Meese (filling in for Connie Cleveland and Cynthia Gore) announced we had three visitors and one joined the guild today. Sally Wilson explained how joining the guild in Oct., Nov., or Dec. pays for the current year <u>and</u> your dues for the following year.

Hospitality: Diana Gonce announced that the treats were provided by Kate MacMillan, Loesje Akau and Robin Bracken.

"Thinking of You's": Jan Tetzlaf's father is quite ill and Beryl Wilcox has had thyroid surgery.

Minutes: The minutes from the September 13th, 2016 Business Meeting, were motioned, seconded and approved with no corrections.

Announcements: There will be a short, brief board meeting during the break.

LaWanda announced a quilt retreat is scheduled at Diamond Lake Resort. If you are interested there is a flyer on the back table with information. Karen Padrick also stated there is a 50% coupon involved, contact her for the coupon.

Voting for the Master Quilter is being held today - be sure to vote.

Money is also being collected for the Christmas Party in December. Cost is \$25.

Program: Kate MacMillan introduced our guest speaker, Joanna Price. Joanna is from Salem, Oregon. As she says, she loves to "dabble" in surface design techniques such as fabric painting and dyeing, eco and rust dyeing, soy wax batik, mono screening, silk painting, thread painting, beading, screen painting and stamp carving. She showed us many examples of these techniques. She states she doesn't always finish everything she starts. The process is more important than the end results. She is a member of a quilt group called "Fiber Explorations" and believes you should "Do something creative everyday". **15 Minute Break:** LaWanda held a one issue Board Meeting during the break. LaWanda had sent us an email (from Judy A Johnson and Julia Jeans) the previous day. They had attended a meeting for the 2017 Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show (SOQS). They are making changes to the shows requirements. The \$10 fee per individual still applies. They are adding additional fees for Special Exhibits (which includes the MMQ exhibit). 1.) There will be an administrative fee of \$25 for every Special Exhibit. 2.) In addition there is another fee based on the number of quilts exhibitors presenting: \$50 for 1 – 10 quilts or \$75 for 11 – 20 quilts. The question that is raised is who will pay the fees. After discussion, the decision was made that participants will continue to pay their \$10 fee and the guild will pay the \$25 administrative fee and the fee for special exhibit participants (either \$50 or \$75). This causes no increase to dues.

Treasurer: Mindy Wolfman reported MMQ's finances were strong right now. The checking account has \$11,100 and the savings account has \$10,200. Our budget looks good. She is also collecting membership dues for next year. The dues remain at \$35. The treasurer's report was motioned, seconded and approved.

Membership: Sally Wilson reports we now have 144 members. Dues for 2017 remain at \$35.

Communications and Website: Louise reports the system is running well if only her computer would stop doing things she hasn't asked it to do. **Program:** Kate MacMillan (filling in for Jan Tetzlaff) announced next month's speaker as Jeanette Pilak, the Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show Executive Director.

Education: Ruth Kinane stated the October 25th Education Meeting would feature Mardyth Peterson and will be at B.J.'s Quilt Basket with a workshop following. She will be teaching a "Mexican Star" pattern. Don't forget to arrive after 9:30 as that is when the store opens and to park on the sides, not in front. Contact Ruth by email if you are interested in this class and haven't previously signed up. Patty Morehouse, 2017 Education Coordinator, is passing out an idea sheet for next year's education meetings. If you have an idea you want to know about or something to present, add it to the sheet.

Sunriver Quilt Show: No report.

Bazaar: Michele Mullenberg stated the recent bazaar class had good attendance; they made design boards and bibs. Another workshop will be held making bra wallets and pincushion scrap bags.

Service Projects: Sue Humiston stated a few quilts were turned in and need completion, and then she will show them. She is selling fabric by the pound today in the back of the room. There is a Service Projects Sewing Day set for Oct. 18th, 10:00 am at Homestead Quilts. They will be completing 9 patch and log cabin squares.

Newsletter: Karen Padrick stated the next newsletter deadline is October 18, and that newsletter will be issued the following week. The last newsletter for the year will have a deadline of November 15, all articles pertaining to December and early January activities should meet the November deadline. **Retreat:** Mindy Wolfman reminded us there is still 1 opening for the retreat.

Sisters Quilt Show: Report added as "New Business item".

Applique: Bevalee Runner said the applique group's next meeting is October 18, 9:30 am at her home.

Block of the Month: Two members showed "Stars" they have completed.

Technique of the Month: Nancy Fischer gave her time to the "Mexican Star" class this month.

Christmas Party: Marleen Fugate reported the party will be on 12/13/16; you can arrive at 10:30 and socialize in the outer hall. Lunch will be at 12:00 am., cost is \$25 and payable in advance. She is asking that if you have a Christmas quilt to be hung in the Great Hall, bring them to her ASAP.

Secret Sisters: Marcia Schonlau asked that we please remember to pick up our gifts and to take home gifts not picked up. The Christmas Secret Sister's Lunch will be on Tuesday, December 6th at Marcia's, and your secret sister will be revealed.

New Business: 1.) Julia Jeans reported the information from the Board Meeting at the break. She also stated the rules are relaxed some for what information SOQS needs by January for the Special Exhibits. She said they need the name of the quilt and the size (small, medium, or large). The requirements for the show are at least 40" wide and no larger than 102". This year's SOQS will have a theme "Telling a Story". 2.) Don't forget the Shop Hop October 13, 14, 15 and 16. LaWanda asked that if you are going on the shop hop to take some MMQ Brochures to give to the shops.




