As many of you know, the Sunriver Mall is a beautiful place to have our show.


There are many visitors in August. A lot of people come from the other guilds and the shop owners and staff come too!

TREASURER'S REPORT

Now that we are in November and our guild activities are winding down, it is apparent we will have a significant surplus for the year which we can use for future activities and charitable purposes. The surplus arose from the unexpected proceeds of donated quilt and fabric sales, the successful bazaar sale (26% over the budgeted proceeds), and the fact that virtually all committees and programs were operated well under budget for the year.

I will be presenting my proposed 2017 budget to the board at our meeting following the general meeting on November 8. We will go through the budget in detail and adjust as necessary. Anyone interested in the details of next year's budget is welcome to attend this meeting. Once we have a budget approved by the Board, it will be posted on the MMQ website for you to examine before it is presented for your vote of approval at our general meeting on January 10. If you have any specific questions about the budget, please email them to me or another Board member. At October 31 our checking account balance was \$12,700, and our savings account balance was \$10,600, of which \$9200 is designated for the 2017 retreat. So far we have received next year's dues payments from 34 members, and I thank you for getting them to me early as it makes my job much easier as the new year begins

MINUTES Business Meeting November 8, 2016

Meeting was called to order at 10:00 am by President, LaWanda Richardson.

Greeter: Connie Cleveland announced we had one visitor this month.

Hospitality: Diana Gonce announced that the treats were provided by Judy Long, Martha Deuchler and Pat Jones.

"Thinking of You's": Linda Saukkonen fell on the ice on their deck and broke her hip. She must remain non-weight bearing for 12 weeks. Mike Carriger had his first surgery on his back.

Minutes: The minutes from the October 11th, 2016 Business Meeting, were motioned, seconded and approved with no corrections.

Announcements: There will be a board meeting today after the business meeting.

Michelle McMIcken spoke and handed out a "Wanted" poster in an effort to encourage filling the Sunriver Quilt Show Coordinator Position. Barb Lowery also explained the job in an effort to find a person to share the position.

Program: Jan Tetzlaff introduced our guest speaker, Jeanette Pilak. Jeanette is the Executive Director of the Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show. She gave us some history of the show and explained the amount of work required to put on the show. Last year they had 457 volunteers, 953 jobs were filled and 3087 hours were spent. It is a massive undertaking. She explained their intake process for the quilts through the work done to get them hung. The Quilt Show brings in \$1.7 million business to the area. She showed a short film, from their 25th anniversary celebration, of 891 women holding a 3' square of cloth to form a human quilt. It was amazing and fascinating to watch. Her ending quote "When you volunteer, you create a community you want to live in."

15 Minute Break

Treasurer: Mindy Wolfman reported MMQ's finances were strong. The checking account has \$12,700 and the savings account has \$10,600 (\$9200 is for the retreat). Kate MacMillan will be collecting membership dues and MMQ checks until Mindy returns from vacation. The treasurer's report was motioned, seconded and approved. Membership: Sally Wilson reports we now have 153 members. Dues for 2017 remain at \$35. New membership cards will first be available at the Christmas Party and thereafter.

Communications and Website: Louise reports she is trying to get the by-laws out of the procedures manual and get the procedures back in.

Program: Kate MacMillan announced the speaker for the January Meeting will be a physical therapist who will give us suggestions for good health while quilting.

Education: Ruth Kinane stated the November 22th Education Meeting will be at the SHARC. It is labeled as a Sit & Sew. Patty Morehouse stated the January Education Meeting would include Judy A. Johnson giving pointers on quilts.

Sunriver Quilt Show: No report.

Bazaar: Denise Meese stated there is a workshop on 11/9 making bra wallets and pincushion scrap bags. It is from 10-2, there is a sign-up and lunch will be provided.

Service Projects: Sue Humiston stated they have given out 71 quilts so far this year and still have 15-20 more to hand out. They will collect service quilts until the Christmas Party.

Newsletter: Karen Padrick stated the next newsletter deadline is 11/15/16, and that newsletter will be issued the following week. This is the last newsletter for the year and will include December and January activities. **Retreat**: The retreat is full. There is a meeting in January.

Sisters Quilt Show: No report.

Applique: The applique group's next meeting is November 15, 9:30 am at Bevalee Runner's home.

Block of the Month (BOM): Marleen Fugate showed the "5 Pointed Star" she made. Sandy Schmidgall stated the completion of the quilt can begin at the Sit & Sew on 11/22 if you are able to attend.

Technique of the Month (TOM): Deb Ewing reminded us that the fabric requirements and supply list for next year's TOM are available. You can make a small quilt or 3 table runners from the 12" blocks they will be making. **Secret Sisters**: Marcia Schonlau stated the Secret Sister "Reveal" Luncheon will be held on

Tuesday, December 6 at her home. Forms for participation next year are available, please submit ASAP.

Christmas Party: 80-82 persons have signed up for the holiday luncheon but they still need more Christmas quilts to hang.

New Business: Patty Gates announced the nominees for the 2017 Board of Directors of MMQ. The membership motioned, seconded and approved the nominations. The standing and temporary committees were announced. Patty also announced the Sunriver Quilt Show Coordinator position still needs to be filled and a second person is needed for Program.

Old Business: LaWanda thanked the membership for their support this past year.

"Show and Tell" and "Drawings" occurred.

Meeting adjourned. Minutes prepared by Michelle McMicken, Secretary.

Board Meeting Minutes November 8, 2016

Board Members Attending: LaWanda Richardson, Patty Gates, Marleen Fugate, Michelle McMicken, Mindy Wolfman, Sally Wilson, Karen Padrick, Ruth Kinane and Sue Humiston.

Meeting called to order by President, LaWanda Richardson, at 12:15 p.m. Agenda as follows:

1. Review of Board Members Positions:

Membership - Sally Wilson stated as announced at the Business Meeting that we now have 153 members.

Program – Jan Tetzlaff stated she stayed within her budget even though the Janet Price class did not fill. She recommends that Education classes not be scheduled around the same time as a visiting speaker who is teaching a class.

Education – Ruth Kinane stated the year included very limited classroom time due to the inability to extend our time at the SHARC after the Education Meetings. It made it very difficult to schedule events plus a lot of bazaar classes interfered with education dates. **Service Projects** – Sue Humiston recommended that the next coordinator find out from the selected charities how many quilts they will need.

Newsletter - Karen Padrick had to leave early.

Retreat – Jan spoke on behalf of Linda Saukkonen, and stated the retreat is a work in progress and classes about the retreat are scheduled in January. A house will be rented for the guest speakers and a hostess provided to them.

2. Yearly Nominations and Shifting of Positions: Michelle McMicken asked the Board to specifically determine and clarify what positions in the guild are voted for and what positions the Vice-President (VP) is to fill. Problem: it seems as if the VP was required to fill a lot of positions that were not filled by the VP before this year. It is confusing because positions have been created but are not necessarily stand-alone jobs to be filled and really fall under other positions recognized by the by-laws. The Board Members are the only positions voted on by members; the nominees for committees are only presented to the membership. Discussion followed and the decision was made to put some recently added positions under previously approved categories. Such as:

The Greeters and the new position of Room Monitor for B.J.'s now fall under "Hospitality",

The Volunteer Coordinator for the Sunriver Quilt Show now falls under the venue of the "Sunriver River Quilt Show Coordinator", The Workshops Coordinator falls under the Bazaar Coordinator.

What it means is that the Vice-President will not fill these positions in the future, they will be filled by the appropriate Committee Coordinator; i.e. The Bazaar Coordinator will select who will set up the workshops, the Sunriver Quilt Show Coordinator will select who will be in charge of the volunteers, etc. This will start with the nominations for office in 2017 for 2018. This change was motioned, seconded and approved by the Board.

3. Authorized signatures for the checkbook: LaWanda reminded the Board that the changing of legitimate bank signatures need to be done right after the first of the year. The motion was made to remove LaWanda Richardson and add Patty Gates to the checking account effective January, 2017. This motion was seconded and approved by the Board

4. Next Retreat: The question came up that the next Retreat Coordinator was not nominated for 2020. Technically, Linda's responsibility ends after the retreat in May 2017. Due to the need to schedule good teachers as far in advance as possible the position should probably be filled so they could get started and learn the ins and outs of this year's retreat. This will be discussed in January when the Retreat Committee meets. Apparently there has been discussion that Jan Tetzlaff would be willing to do the job; but is somewhat unwilling to commit to something 4 years away. For continuities sake we are calling Jan the "Temporary Overseer for 2020".

5. 2017 Budget: Mindy Wolfman provided us each a proposed budget for MMQ for 2017. She reviewed each line item and discussion ensued. The budget was motioned, seconded and approved by the Board. The budget will be presented to the membership for vote at the January 2017 Business Meeting.

6. Angel Fund: Mindy Wolfman is establishing what is called an "Angel Fund" for our group. This is not a business part of MMQ. She will accept donations from anyone in the guild at any time and do the required bookkeeping to maintain the fund. The fund will be used to aid/assist anyone that may be having some financial difficulty paying their dues or being unable to attend the Christmas Party or just needs help. It is very difficult for the person in need to request help so it will be the responsibility of friends to suggest who might have a need. This will all be done anonymously.

7. Bazaar: Mindy stated that since we are now a non-profit our records of the items sold at the bazaar require much more bookkeeping then in the past. A discussion of this followed and during this discussion the difficulty in filling the Sunriver Quilt Show Coordinator position also arose. It was decided that the responsibility for the Bazaar would be totally removed from the Sunriver Quilt Show Coordinators responsibility. It was decided a specific person was needed to be responsible for the inventory for the Bazaar; just like someone is responsible for the workshops. It was also decided that pot holders would be rolled over into the Bazaar's responsibility. In addition, if there is "Pay & Go" next year it will fall under the Sunriver Quilt Show Coordinators responsibilities. This separation was motioned, seconded and approved by the Board. It was also suggested that we might be able to combine more of the bazaar workshops with the Education Meetings held on the 4th Tuesday as long as no Education Workshops were planned following the meeting.

8. Newcomers Tea: LaWanda commented on how well the Newcomer's Tea was attended and received and thanked Patty Gates for setting it up. The next Newcomers Tea will be in 2018 since this year's tea was held late in the year. It was also discovered that a decision was made by a previous board to have the Tea in the spring when the members are most likely to still be "new" and the "snowbirds" would likely to still be around. So the next Newcomers Tea will be in April 2018.

9. Gender Equality: A request was made to change the name of Secret Sisters to "Secret Pals". The request was motioned, seconded and passed. The new name is Secret Pals.

LaWanda thanked everyone for their service this past year.

Meeting adjourned at 1:45 pm. Minutes prepared by Michelle McMicken, Secretary



3 SAMPLER TABLE RUNNERS - 16" x 44"

Table Runner Fabric Requirements are based on the following Measurements

Blocks - (3) 12" Sashing - 2" Borders - 2" Binding - 2-1/2" strip

Table Runners Fabric Requirements

3 Table Runners using the same fabric throughout

9 Fat Quarters in various prints/solids - darks, lights, and mediums 1 yd Background Fabric

OR

3 Seasonal Table Runners

Season 1 (Jan/Feb/Mar) - 6 Fat Quarters / 1/8 yd or just a 6-1/2" scrap Background Fabric Season 2 (Apr/May/Jun) - 4 Fat Quarters / 1/2 yd Background Fabric Season 3 (Jul/Aug/Sep) - 4 Fat Quarters / 1/2 yd Background Fabric

Additional Fabric Requirements for EACH of the 3 Table Runners

Sashing – 1/4 yd o'r 1 Fat Quarter Border – 1/2 yd Binding – 1/3 yd Backing – 3/4 yd OR 3 Fat Quarters
