
- 40. Put in zipper-type plastic bag & tape to inside of closet

2017 Retreat Committee Taking Deposits

Retreat Costs and Lay-away Plan

The 2017 Retreat Committee is making plans for the 2 1/2-day retreat at SHARC in Sunriver on May 9, 10, and 11 of 2017. Our featured instructors will be Jan Krentz and Maria Shell. Although the final participant cost of the retreat cannot be established at this time, the committee has set a maximum cost of \$150 per person. This amount will include 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ days of classes, facility rental, and meals for participants including 3 lunches, 1 dinner, 1 wine and cheese party, and daily snacks. No overnight accommodations are included.

The retreat committee is working hard to make the retreat affordable to all. We will be offering a layaway plan, which was so popular in 2014. You may deposit any amount per month, all of which is refundable, until the total cost is reached. The total cost of the retreat will be finalized by the committee prior to the end of 2016, and will not exceed \$150.

Registering

The committee is asking you to secure your spot in the retreat at the February 9, 2016 MMQ program meeting by depositing \$10, which is also refundable, and is applied to your retreat fees. This is a "first signed up, first registered" event. You must have paid your 2016 MMQ dues in order to do this. The deposit assures you a spot in either Maria Shell's or Jan Krentz's class of 20 each until the class is full. We need to know if there is so much interest that we need to hire an additional teacher. We don't want anyone to be disappointed by not being able to attend the retreat.

Trunk Shows

All guild members will be invited to the 2 trunk shows the guest teachers will give. There is no extra cost to guild members for the trunk shows.

Jan Krentz will give the regular MMQ meeting trunk show on May 9 and Maria Shell will do an evening trunk show on May 10.




