28 Tip for April: 24

This last week my sweet Husband made me an oversize ironing board that 🎬 🝿 fits on top of my regular ironing board, very handy for guilting. I covered 🗤 it with 2 layers of felt, 2 of cotton batting and cotton twill. Also he put a 👯 38 small section of PVC pipe in the corner on the bottom side for a rolled up 🍟 pressing sheet. 28 Recipe for April:

Chocolate Almond Bars 🙀 2 cups flour 💓 1-1/2 cups brown sugar 1 cup blanched almonds 6 ounces chocolate chips 9" x 13" pan

🕺 1-1/3 cups butter 22 Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Use the metal blade in your Cuisinart to 24 🙀 combine the flour with 2/3 of the brown sugar and 1/2 the butter, about 🙀 ¥ 15 seconds. This could be done in a mixer but would take longer. Press ¥ mixture, then almonds into baking pan, bake until lightly colored, about 15 👯 minutes. Melt remaining butter in saucepan. Add brown sugar and cook over 86 🍟 medium heat until it bubbles. Simmer until syrupy, about 1 minute. Pour 🍟 🥡 over almonds and bake 15 minutes more. Remove from oven and distribute 🙀 🎀 chocolate over the top for a marbled effect. Cut into 3" by 1" pieces while 🗰 22 still warm. Let cool until chocolate has hardened before removing. 34



TREASURER'S REPORT

We currently have 110 quilters who have either joined or renewed their MMQ membership for 2017. We're still short of our goal of 143 members, but I expect we will reach our goal over the next couple of months.

We have had no unusual expenditures so far this year, and our retreat roster is almost full, with just one spot remaining in each of the two classes.

As of March 13, our checking account balance was \$11,100, and our savings account balance was \$15,800. Of this amount, \$14,400 is the retreat fund, which includes \$6,800 of participant fees received to date.

CALLING ALL POTHOLDERS!!

Reminder: I will be collecting potholders, quilt books, magazines and patterns at every meeting until the Sunriver Quilt Show. I would like to see every member make 1 potholder (2 would be great!). The potholders are a very popular item at the Bazaar. We sell them for \$5.00 each and usually have about 250 to 300!! They bring in a lot of money for our retreat, and also our programs!

At the last meeting, I had a question about the size of potholders and batting used. Most are 8" to 9" square or round, use two layers of batting, one of them being Insulbrite; the other a cotton batting, such as Warm and Natural. The stacking order is, top, Warm and Natural, Insulbrite and bottom. Quilt thru all layers and apply binding around edges, with a loop to hang (or not). The good sellers are wine fabrics, embroidered, and of course team related themed fabric (Ducks, Beavers, etc.). Any modern day fabrics appeal to the younger group. We also have a lot of children who buy them as gifts for their Moms. These are just suggestions, Do whatever you enjoy. If you need help, please give me a call or email.

She showed us many of her designs.


April 2017 Shop Blurb from the Stitchin' Post:


