Recipe for June:

Hamburger Upside Down Bake (Kathy Leedle)

1 lb Hamburger 1/4 cup catsup (I use more)

1/4 cup chopped onion One 12 oz. can of whole corn, do not drain 1 tsp salt 1 pkg of corn bread or corn muffin mix

1/2 tsp chili powder

Brown hamburger and onion. Combine first 5 ingredients in 10" skillet. Push 👸 meat mixture to edges making a ring. Pour can of corn (undrained) in center. Mix corn bread (I make my own---single recipe). Pour on top of mixture. Bake @ 425 degrees for 20-25 minutes. Can turn over onto a plate----I serve out of skillet. Enjoy!!!!

What, exactly, is a critter, you may ask? All of you Ellie May fans out there should remember that she called her pets "critters" (still unsure? Think "Beverly Hillbillies"). So, to keep our rules very loose, a critter is any living thing that is not human. To date, we have people working on birds, cats, turtles, bugs, squirrels...you name it. There is no minimum or maximum quilt size, but most of our quilts so far are planned to be small so they can be exhibited on the wooden display frames. A larger guilt may need to be hung on a building nearby, which is acceptable as well. But remember: HAND appliqued critters only!

SERVICE QUILTS UPDATE

For 2017, we're striving to reach 100 service quilts. To make this goal, we'll need a minimum of 12 quilts per month. This translates to 60 quilts by the end of May. As of this writing, we have a total of 84 quilt tops turned in. However, we only get credit for those quilts that are actually given to one of the organizations that we are supporting this year. So far, we have:

27 finished quilts donated to one of the organizations 10 completed awaiting donation

47 quilts that need quilting and binding

If you have a quilt package at home that you are going to quilt for us, please try to complete as soon as possible. If you have a quilt package at home and are now realizing that you are not going to be able to get to it, please bring it back in and we'll reassign it. We appreciate the effort but understand that life gets in the way of the best intentions.

We've been able to do all of this thanks to all of you who have donated fabric, sewn the tops, and quilted and put the binding on these quilts. You can all be very proud of your efforts. It's been amazing!

To assist with the effort, we've begun a new group; the 'Sit and Sew' group. The group meets on the third Tuesday of each month in La Pine at the Homestead Quilts and Gallery located at the southern end of La Pine on the right side of Highway 97 beginning at 9:30 am and going until the store closes or there isn't anyone left. Coffee service is provided and lunch is pot luck. Come and join us. Bring your sewing machine, cutting tools, irons or just bring yourself. There will be plenty to do.

Quilters needed. We are in need of anyone who will assist in quilting these tops. The guild ensures that each top turned in has batting and a back before it's ready for quilting. Quilts are available at guild meetings for pickup. You don't need a long arm to quilt. Many of the children's quilts can be quilted on a sewing machine.

TRAIL STEW (Served at the Sit-N-Sew in February)

Notes before you begin

You will need a 12-quart pot for this receipt. It will provide you with 9 to 11 quarts of a very hardy, zesty stew with a mild, short lived spicy after taste (not hot). Follow the preparation steps for best results. I've broken the ingredients into spices and other ingredients to help you determine whether you have everything before starting. Preparation will take about an hour. The stew is best when refrigerated overnight and then re-heated the next day. Leftovers can be frozen for up to six months.

Spices

2 tbsp Sage 4 tbsp Minced garlic with juice

3 tbsp Curry powder 3 tbsp Chili powder

2 tbsp Cyan Pepper 3 tbsp Beef bouillon paste (or 4 bouillon cubes crushed)

2 tbsp Basil 4 Bay leaves 2 tbsp All spice 3 tbsp Celery salt

3 tbsp Italian seasoning 2 tbsp Cumin

Other Ingredients

2 - 3 lbs Stew meat 2 cups Celery (chopped)

2 cups Carrots (chopped) 2 Medium onions (chopped)

2 cups Clear chicken broth 1 pkg 5 sweet mild Italian sausage links 4 cans Cream of Mushroom soup 8 - 10 Medium potatoes with skins (chopped)

 $\frac{1}{2}$ pkg Bacon 4-6 cups Water

2 cups Peas (optional)

Preparation Steps

In a sauce pan, pour in chicken broth. Add sage, cumin, bouillon, cyan pepper, chili powder, and Curry. Whisk gently over medium heat. DO NOT boil. Mixture should be approximately 140 to 180 degrees and well blended. Remove from heat and set aside. If microwaving, place all ingredients in a microwaveable bowl, whisk gently for several minutes until mixture is well blended. Microwave on high for 1 minute. Remove, whisk again and set aside.

In a 12" frying pan with high sides. Cut beacon into $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ inch pieces and place in frying pan on high hear. Stir to break up into individual bits. While beacon is cooking, cut sausage links into $\frac{1}{2}$ inch pieces and add to frying pan. Continue to stir beacon and sausage pieces. Place stew meat on cutting board and review, cutting larger pieces into bite size pieces as needed. Add stew meat to frying pan and reduce heat to medium. Continue to cook and stir until the stew meat is browned on all sides (no red color should be seen on any of the stew meat pieces). Remove from heat and set aside.

In a two-quart mixing bowl, combine all remaining spices and mix thoroughly. Add cream of mushroom soup (do not add water). Blend spices and soup together.

Pour spice and soup mixture into twelve-quart pot. Add remaining other ingredients holding back carrots and optional peas. Mix and blend into spice and soup mixture. Add beacon, sausage, and stew meat into pot including all juices and stir until blended. Add chopped potatoes and blend. Add 4 to 6 cups of water and stir. Amount of water will determine thickness of stew gravy. Place on stove and heat on high bringing ingredients to a boil. Let stew boil vigorously for 20 minutes stirring regularly. Reduce heat to medium and slow boil for two hours stirring every 10 minutes to reduce sticking. When potatoes are nearing completion, pour in carrots (optional peas) and stir them into the stew. Continue to cook until carrots and potatoes are at desired level. Remove from heat and let stand for 30 minutes to cool enough to eat or allow to cool completely before ladling into refrigerator containers. Place in refrigerator overnight to allow spices to fully integrate.

THE STITCHIN' POST

Hi Ladies,

Thank you for helping us celebrate our 43rd year in business at our sale at the end of May. I do fondly remember the day I opened The Stitchin' Post in the Sisters Saloon building, where my paternal grandmother once had a pharmacy in the 30's. She is the one who taught me to sew, and little did I know I began the business in the same place where she once had a pharmacy. Jason was in kindergarten and Valori was just a year old. Jason's teacher, Robin helped me to paint a patchwork pattern on the outside of the building under the window. I had taken my money out of my teaching retirement account, all of \$3,500, to start the business. In those days a bolt of fabric cost \$25, and these days it is more like \$87 (wholesale).

As most of you know, I hung out twelve family quilts for the first quilt show. I had only made two quilts at that time, both for my children. 
