NAME TAGS Members are asked to create their own name tags which are to be worn to meetings and classes. These handcrafted fabric tags can be quilted, appliquéd, embroidered, stamped or ? The choice remains with the individual. Wearing your name tag to meetings makes you eligible for the drawings that we have at the first monthly meeting and also helps people remember names. It is also convenient to write your membership number on the back of your name tag. HOSPITALITY and VISITORS For each meeting, a team of three members volunteer to be hostesses and provide goodies. While the hostesses provide snacks, the guild supplies water, tea and coffee. A clipboard is passed around at meetings so people can sign up to volunteer as hostesses. Visitors are always welcome. If you do bring a visitor, please contact one of the Guild Greeters (Denise Meese and Beryl Wilcox), so the Greeter can introduce her or him to the group. Visitors may attend three meetings for free.	<b>DRAWINGS</b> The guild is very fortunate to have local advertisers support the group by providing items for monthly drawings. At the first meeting of the month, people who attend the meeting and wear their nametags have their guild membership number placed in a basket with the chance of winning a gift. It is asked that the winners write a thank you note to the person/store who donated the items. Two of the local stores, Morrow's and Cynthia's, provide gift certificates for service for a sewing machine. A member is only eligible to win one sewing machine service per year. We also have a drawing at the first meeting of the month for two books which have been purchased by the guild. For one dollar, members may place their name in the basket for a chance to win one of the books. Purchasing a chance to win is usually done at the door when you enter the meeting room. Any funds received which exceed the purchase price of the books, go into the guild account to be used for classes and charitable projects.		
A group of guild members interested in improving their appliqué techniques and skills meets once a month. The appliqué group meets at Bevalee Runner's house on the third Tuesday of each month. All interested people, whether beginning or an experienced appliqué artist, are welcome. If you are a beginner, lessons will be taught at workshops during the year. ## CLASSES

Our mission statement states that we "shall promote the art of quilt making through education .... " and as a result, the guild provides an education-focused meeting on the fourth Tuesday of each month in contrast to the more business-oriented meeting on the second Tuesday of the month. In addition to these no or low cost classes, MMQ also contracts with nationally known quilt instructors for additional classes. These additional classes are partly subsidized by the guild and are open to members who register. Frequently there is a limit to the class size for classes so it is helpful to register and pay early. In August, we have a fundraising bazaar during the Sunriver Quilt Show. To support this activity, different members offer free classes for making bazaar items. These items may include tote bags, table runners and small gift items. If a person chooses to take one of the bazaar classes, it is expected that an item be donated to the bazaar.


## INVITATION TO JOIN COMMITTEES

This free outdoor event has provided an opportunity for guild members to share with the community the art of quilting. Other activities included in the show are featured quilters, potholder sales and a bazaar featuring items made by guild members. Funds from the bazaar are used to support educational guild activities. Organizing the event needs the support of all the members. This includes creation of committees for the following: guilt management (hanging and taking down the guilts, watching the quilts during the show and checking the quilts in and out) and public relations.
