Tip for August:

Floor tile make a the best templates. Press paper pattern onto the $\overline{\square}$ adhesive side of a self-stick floor tile. Cut the template out on the pattern 🗖 line with a pair of scissors or utility knife. These templates are sturdy and \blacksquare can be used with a rotary cutter. Janet Madren Perry, Id.

Oreo Balls

1 pkg. Oreo Cookies

🗖 1 Pkg. Almond Bark (I used Vanilla)

Smash Oreo Cookies. Combine: Smashed Oreo Cookies and Cream Cheese Roll into a small ball.

Refrigerate for 1 hour. Melt Almond Bark.

Using a toothpick, dip balls in almond bark set on wax paper to dry.

PROGRAM MEETING August 8 - 10 am @ the SHARC Leotie Richards American Folk Hero Quilts

speaker for August will be Leotie Richards showing her exhibit "American Folk Heroes." Leotie Richards became enamored with textiles while working as an Art Director for a major retail chain. After twenty years of designing graphics and textiles for retail stores, she retired to Sisters, Oregon, and found that her graphic design skills could be readily applied to art quilting. Studying intently for three years in various workshops with Jean Wells, Sue Benner and Rosalie Dace, she became adroit with various fabrication techniques and began to experience a high degree of joy in her creative process with textiles.

In 2014 she began a series of twelve portraits which feature American folk heroes. The first two portraits were of Annie Oakley and Sitting Bull each sized at about 36" square. They were well received and ten others followed in larger 42" and 60" formats including Julia Child, Bob Dylan and Nina Simone. The collection premiered as a special exhibit at the 2016 Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show and have since been featured at Twigs Gallery in Sisters, Oregon.

Leotie has also produced many other art guilts in both abstract and pictorial styles. She just completed a three dimensional piece which incorporates needle felting and handmade paper techniques. A retrospective collection of Leotie's work is also available for exhibition.

APPLIQUE GROUP MAKES "CRITTERS"

The theme for the Applique Group exhibit at the 2017 Sunriver Quilt Show has been chosen! We will spend the next several months making hand appliqued "CRITTERS". What, exactly, is a critter, you may ask? All of you Ellie May fans out there should remember that she called her pets "critters" (still unsure? Think "Beverly Hillbillies"). So, to keep our rules very loose, a critter is any living thing that is not human. To date, we have people working on birds, cats, turtles, bugs, squirrels...you name it. There is no minimum or maximum quilt size, but most of our quilts so far are planned to be small so they can be exhibited on the wooden display frames. A larger guilt may need to be hung on a building nearby, which is acceptable as well. But remember: HAND appliqued critters only!

MASTER QUILTER NOMINATIONS

Master Quilter Nominations are now open.

If you have someone in mind, the deadline to submit your nomination is Thursday September 7, 2017.

Please note the Master Quilter Criteria from our Bylaws and the Master Quilter Secret Ballot Voting Procedures included in this Newsletter. In addition to the newsletter, Louise has also provided this information in an additional email to all the MMQ Members. This information will help you decide who you feel is the best nominee and how to write up your nomination. Please submit your written nomination to Patty Gates by September 7th. You may submit them in person, by email or regular mail. (MMQ, P.O. Box 3254, Sunriver, Or 97707) **Written Nomination is in narrative form, not to exceed 450 words or one typed page Master Quilter Criteria Below is Article VII, Section 1, from the MMQ Bylaws. Please refer to this section when completing a nomination for a Master Quilter.

Questions: please call Patty Gates or Sandy Schmidgall.

ARTICLE VII: Awards and Recognitions Section 1. Master Quilter. This award honors a member who has made contributions in support of the goals of the MMQ Guild and whose skills and workmanship the membership admires/respects. Nomination. Any member shall have the opportunity to nominate another member for Master Quilter. The nomination shall list how the member has served Mountain Meadow Quilters and how their Skills and expertise are recognized. The Master Quilter nominee must be willing to accept the Nomination. Qualifications. Workmanship and service to the MMQ Guild are equally important criteria. Election. Election for Master Quilter shall be secret ballot of the membership. Presentation. The presentation of the Master Quilter Award shall be given at the Annual Party. Expectations. The Master Quilter shall be available for professional and technical guidance to all the Member and their various projects.

Master Quilter Secret Ballot Voting Procedure (As found in the MMQ Procedures Handbook) Members present at October 10th voting meeting will be given a ballot. The member will sign a roster saying That they have voted and place the ballot in the ballot box. Members not present may put their vote on a piece of paper and insert it in a plain envelope. The envelope is placed in another mailing envelope with a return address and mailed to MMQ. P.O. Box 3254. Sunriver, Or 97707. It must be mailed one week prior to the voting date October 10th in order to be received and counted in a timely manner. The President will pick up all ballots from the mailbox the day before the voting. A roster will be started to acknowledge those ballots have been received. Identifying envelopes will be removed and ballot placed in ballot box which will be taken to the voting meeting. The President and Vice President will count the votes before the meeting ends to ensure there is not a tie Vote. In the event of a tie, the vote will be repeated between the tied nominees only, with only the Members present voting.

2017 Schedule for Master Quilter Voting Prior to September 12th Master Quilter Procedures reviewed and nominations opened. September 12th meeting-Nominations will be announced. Nomination letters will be submitted to the October Newsletter issuance and sent by e-mail to membership on-line. September 30th -Members who will not be present at the October 13th voting meeting must mail their ballots to MMQ, P.O. Box 3254, Sunriver, Or 97707 (Remember: Columbus Day is October 9th) October 10th meeting - Master Quilter voting will occur and votes counted.

Hi Everyone,

As you must realize, I am writing this a week after quilt show to meet the newsletter deadline, so I am just now relaxing after a very fun week of workshops and events, and the very successful quilt show. I was concerned about the heat that day, but it wasn¹t that bad. People paced themselves and wore hats and drank lots of water. The quilts were just stunning, and I have to give a big shout out for my committee of ten who put together the plan where each quilt will be hung and get them in the correct bags to be hung. We did it in three half-days and then worked on special exhibits. Marion Shimoda and Jan Tetzlaff did an amazing job of categorizing quilts as they arrived and then we went to work. After 43 years, quilt show is still the highlight of my year and I am still in awe watching the quilts come out of bags and getting hung on buildings.


