Lori told us about a blog she has called humblequilts.blogspot.com. On her blog she invites quilters to make a quilt along with her. She calls it "Quiltalong" Every Monday she posts another step of the quilt on her blog. Currently the quilt she is posting is Palmateer Point. Part 1 and 2 are now on the blog. When she does Presentations, the funds help finance her trips to Columbia. Lori talked about the Pillowcase Dresses she takes to the girls there. These dresses, beside filling the need for clothing, help tell predators that someone is looking out for and cares for this child. So "Don't Mess with her". If you are interested in the dresses or helping with this project, google "pillowcase dress" or go to Pinterest. # PROGRAM MEETING October 10 - 10 am @ the DOOR Katie Pedersen—"Quilting Modern"


Please join the Mountain Meadow Quilters in hosting Katie Pedersen, Seattle modern quilting instructor and author of Quilting Modern for a trunk show.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Last month I reported our quilt show bazaar sales had been somewhat less than we had anticipated; we had budgeted \$6,000 in bazaar sales, while actual sales were \$5,024. However, because our other guilt show and bazaar workshop expenses were somewhat below budget, and our vendor revenue was significantly higher than expected, our overall quilt show net income of \$4,327 was below our \$4,500 budget by only \$173! Thanks so much again to all of our bazaar organizers and volunteers, everyone who made and donated items to sell at the bazaar, and our vendor committee and quilt show committee. You know who you are: thank you all!

All of our committees continue to operate well under budget year to date, and we are in sound financial condition. As of September 2 we have \$13,800 in our checking account, and \$6,100 in our savings account. Of this amount, \$4,400 is reserved for our 2020 retreat, which includes \$1,500 from this year's bazaar sales, and \$2,900 carryover from retreats of 2014 and 2017. We have only \$35 of liabilities: one member has already paid her 2018 dues!

## BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES—September 12, 2017

Meeting was called to order at 10:00 am by President, Patty Gates. Greeter: Connie Cleveland reported we had three visitors today and a new member joined. Hospitality: Karen Padrick announced the treats were provided by Linda Ehrich, Bonnie Schaefer and Terry Anderson. "Thinking of You's": None. Minutes: The minutes from the August 8, 2017 Business Meeting, were motioned, seconded and approved with no corrections. Announcements: Remember the October 10th Business Meeting will be at "The Door", 56885 Enterprise Dr. Sunriver (in the business circle). Open at 9:00 am. Dorothy Spain has moved and downsized and can no longer make the kitty beds she has been doing. She is looking for a replacement and has supplies to donate. Sandy Schmigall still has positions to fill for next year, if you are interested in helping out give her a call (or she will be calling you). Program: Kate Macmillan introduced Lori DeJarnatt from Madras as our guest speaker. She spoke about "Reruns - Quilts inspired from the past". She like to take quilts she has seen from the past and reproduces them, they range from 1850 to the 1950's. She had many beautiful quilts and explained the things in the quilts that represented their different time periods. She has a blog: Humble Quilts, which you can visit.

#### Break

Treasurer's Report: Mindy Wolfman was not present but provided a Treasurer's report which Patty read. After finalizing more guilt show expenses, we now stand at a net profit of \$4327; only \$173 less than our projected budget income of \$4500. As of 9/2/2017 the Checking Account balance is \$13,800. The Savings Account has \$6100, of which \$4400 is reserved for the next retreat in 2020. The Treasurer's report was motioned, seconded and approved with no corrections, Membership: Sally Wilson reported we have 145 members (plus one more today). If you have not received your membership card yet, contact Sally. It was also mentioned that if you provide your membership card from the MMQ quild to "JoAnn's" they will issue you a 10% discount card. Communications and Website: Louise asked those members who have Bendbroadband as their server to notify her if they are having trouble receiving emails. Program: Kate MacMillan informed us the October Business Meeting will feature Katie Pederson who will speak on "Quilting Modern". Education: No report. Sunriver Quilt Show: Sue Humiston reported some statistics from the Quilt Show. 240 quilts were shown; 98 guilts were for sale (ranging in price from \$20 to \$1200); 29 guilts were sold (ranging in price from \$30 to \$550); nine vendors who paid \$50 to participate all made a profit; Alpine Management gave the guild \$1500 for the guilt show (they paid for one band and the guild paid for the other out of this money); and there were 44 volunteers. A new change was made that persons purchasing a new guilt did not have to wait until the end of the day to pick it up; they could take it with them. Suggestion was made to stop selling the magazines and patterns as many were left over; then, someone suggested we just provide them on a table for free. Many people want the "Pay N Go" back next year. Sisters Quilt Show: No report; Judy Johnson brought in guilts to be returned. Bazaar: No report. Service Projects: Mike Carriger had a goal of 100 quilts for the year. We now have 90 quilts that have been completed and donated so far this year. A total of 122 have been turned so far. Some need quilting and binding. Sandy Mahnken stated she has 12 more finished quilts. Newsletter: The next newsletter deadline is 9/19/2017. Send articles to: mmgnewsletter@gmail.com. Retreat: No report. Applique: The next meeting is 9/19/17. Block of the Month (BOM): Bring in your recently completed block to the Education Meeting. Technique of the Month (TOM): No report. Secret Pals: No report. Christmas Party: No report.

New Business: Master Quilter - If you are not going to be at the 10/10 meeting to vote, you can vote by mail. Send your vote in a plain envelope enclosed in a mailing envelope to P.O. Box 3254 Sunriver, OR 97707. Two nominees were introduced and showed some of their work. The nominees were Marleen Fugate and Pat Jones. Michelle McMicken read two of Pat Jones' nominations and Bevalee Runner read one of Pat 's nominations and the nomination for Marlene. Voting for Master Quilter will occur at the October 10th Business Meeting. Additional New Business: Candace Ruland announced there is a new non-profit "Friends of the Children" organizing to begin in January 2018. They will cover the area from La Pine to Madras. They will be mentoring 24 selected 5 year olds until they turn 18. These will be paid mentors (guaranteeing at least a 4 year commitment) funded by a grant. Candace would like to see each child receive a quilt, she has made 5 so far and is asking for help in accomplishing this task, 24 are needed. She wants this non-profit to be considered for one of the agencies we provide quilts to next year. After discussion, Mike Carriger volunteered to help provide to these children from the current service quilts we get until the end of the year. The guild was in favor of this. Old Business: None. "Show and Tell" occurred. "Drawings" occurred.

Meeting adjourned at 12:30.

### MASTER QUILTER VOTING and NOMINEES

As announced at the September 12 business meeting, Marleen Fugate and Pat Jones have been announced as nominees for Master Quilter. Their nomination letters can be read on pages 6-9 of this newsletter. Below are the procedures for voting for Master Quilter. Please follow the procedures below so that you vote counts!

Master Quilter Secret Ballot Voting Procedure (As found in the MMQ Procedures Handbook): Members present at October 10th voting meeting will be given a ballot. The member will sign a roster saying That they have voted and place the ballot in the ballot box. Members not present may put their vote on a piece of paper and insert it in a plain envelope. The envelope is placed in another mailing envelope with a return address and mailed to MMQ. P.O. Box 3254. Sunriver, Or 97707. It must be mailed one week prior to the voting date October 10th in order to be received and counted in a timely manner. The President will pick up all ballots from the mailbox the day before the voting. A roster will be started to acknowledge those ballots have been received. Identifying envelopes will be removed and ballot placed in ballot box which will be taken to the voting meeting. The President and Vice President will count the votes before the meeting ends to ensure there is not a tie Vote. In the event of a tie, the vote will be repeated between the tied nominees only, with only the Members present voting.

2017 Schedule for Master Quilter Voting: Prior to September 12th—Master Quilter Procedures reviewed and nominations opened. September 12th meeting—Nominations will be announced. Nomination letters will be submitted to the October Newsletter for issuance and sent by e-mail to membership on-line. September 30th—Members who will not be present at the October 10th voting meeting must mail their ballots to MMQ. P.O. Box 3254, Sunriver, Or 97707 (Remember: Columbus Day is October 9th) October 10th meeting—Master Quilter voting will occur and votes counted.



















## PAT JONES Master Quilter Nomination

We highly recommend Pat Jones for Mountain Meadow Quilt Guild Master Quilter of the year. Pat began learning to sew as a young teenager by making her own clothes. Later moving on to children's clothing, pillow quilts and embroidery. While Pat was a Junior High art teacher in Winnemucca, Nevada (where she taught for many years) she and a group of teachers took their first piecing and sewing equipment classes, led by a Home Economics teacher. As a result of those classes Pat has had her quilts displayed in Winnemucca, Nevada's local art gallery and contributed many guilts to charity. After retiring from education she and her husband moved to Alaska where she joined another guilt group. She again made charity guilts, attended retreats and taught classes for the community college and her quilt group. Pat and her husband moved to Oregon in 2007; the year she joined MMQ. She has taken classes yearly from nationally recognized teachers such as David Taylor, Margaret Miller, Helene Knott and many others at Sisters Quilters Affair and our local guilt shops. She has taught and attended many classes at MMQ as well as our retreats. She has accepted offices in the guild since the beginning of her membership, starting with hospitality in 2008 and 2009, then programs in 2010 and 2011. Pat was our guilt show chairman in 2012 where she introduced maps and hostess badges to our show. In 2013 she was vice president of our guild and president in 2014. During her time as president she spearheaded the process for the guild to become a non-profit. Working many hours with an accountant and an attorney. Pat has consistently volunteered for the hanging and guilt takedown on guilt show day and has always displayed her beautiful quilts at MMQ's show. She has displayed quilts at Quiltworks, Sisters, Fiber Chix special exhibits and had a guilt on display in an exhibit at the Sunriver Lodge. Pat is greatly admired for her many accomplishments and dedication to our guild challenges, and Shaker Challenges. She has contributed to MMQ's special guilt displays at the Sisters Quilt Shows in July and this year to the Modern Quilt traveling show. Pat continues to donate her teaching talents along with donating charity guilts, and bazaar items every year. Pat has also had a picture of her quilt published in Sarah Kaufman's book, "Folded Log Cabin Quilts." This is just a brief summary of her time and commitment to our guild and other guilt groups she has been an active member of.

## MARLEEN FUGATE Master Quilter Nomination

I would like to nominate Marleen Fugate for Master Quilter for 2017. Marleen joined the MMQ Guild in 2000 when meetings were held at the Sunriver Fire Station. At that time, she also joined a ladies group at the old Senior Center in La Pine. There she learned how to hand quilt. The group Hand quilted the communities quilt tops to make money that went into a building fund for the future New Senior Center. In 2002 Marleen worked with a small group of MMQ members including Sharon Bean, a MMQ master guilter, to make a guilt for the New Senior Center, which is still hanging in the lobby today. Marleen has had many positions in our guild. In 2006 she co-chaired block of the Month and also Guild drawings. She was historian/photographer in 2009, Communications Assistant in 2010, She Co- chaired the Annual Christmas Luncheon in 2010 and chaired the Luncheon in 2016. She has headed up Service Quilts in 2012 and 2013. Her focus in 2012 was the Wounded Warriors project. She made various Kits, so members could paper piece them to make a quilt. She taught a Paper Piecing class at our education Meeting at Cascade Bible Church in La Pine. All blocks were pieced together, quilted and the quilt was presented to a young soldier who was wounded in Iraq. In 2013, Marleen decided to learn how to applique, joining Bevalee Runner's Applique Group, and is an excellent Applique quilter. In 2014, Marleen served as Vice President of the guild. She assisted the President in all meetings with the MMQ Attorney and CPA during the process of obtaining our Non-Profit Status. In 2014, she also organized, promoted, and welcomed new members to the New Members Tea held at the Sunriver Library. Marleen strives to support the MMQ guild mission Statement of promoting the art of guilt making through education and charitable giving. She has made Service quilts year after year. Her goals as 2015 Guild President at every meeting was to encourage Fellowship and Education. She printed and supplied 2 different education sheets for all to take. Marleen also worked with Michelle McMicken to revise some of the wording in the MMQ Procedure Manual. As outgoing President her goal was to support the MMQ president, and has done so every year since. Marleen has always volunteered to teach Educational Bazaar workshops every year and usually supplies all the materials to make the project. She always contributes many items for our Bazaar. She provided two quilt tops, batting, backing, and binding fabric for 2 guilts that were guilted by Louise Carriger and donated to the Sunriver Quilt show to sell and the proceeds went to benefit our MMQ Education Budget. From Jan 2015 - May 2017, Marleen worked on the Retreat Committee, Co-Chairing the Retreat Room Set-up, which proved to be a big challenge. But she dug in her heels and along with her husband, Vern, worked out a way for us to be able to have enough electricity for all of our sewing machines. She also made all of the handmade gifts that were given to the Retreat Attendees. She has always played a big part in the Sunriver Quilt Show, volunteering for many jobs. She always participates in the Applique and Shaker Challenges. The last three years she has helped put up and take down the small quilts in businesses. This year she worked with the Carrigers, to supply every member that wanted one, an embroidered name badge, offering to give a class to anyone who wanted to know how to put them together. Besides all her MMQ activities, Marleen is a talented seamstress and quilter. She has made some beautiful quilts and wall hangings. She is always anxious to help out anyone who has a quilting or sewing question. Marleen is always willing to help out if someone is on vacation or is going to be unable to attend guild. She has stated that she" loves being a Member of the MMQ Guild." She feels that it is a gift of all that she has learned and shared from so many.























## PAT JONES Master Quilter Nomination

Pat Jones doesn't like to "blow her own horn", so we will do it for her! If you don't know her, she is the taller gray-haired lady that sits at the Drawings table. Pat joined our Guild in 2007. From the very beginning she has volunteered. Her first official job was Hospitality. She did that job with a flair for two years. During her tenure in Hospitality, she also helped to plan our Christmas party, where the committee made teddy bears donated to the Fire and Police Departments. She then went on to Co-Chair and then Chair Programs for another two years. She has worked on the Retreat Committee for two separate Retreats. Every year she has taught Bazaar classes and contributed many items for our Bazaar. If asked, she is always willing to teach, or be a part of Education presentations. Not only does she donate at least two quilts per year to our Service Projects, she donates fabrics to make them! In 2012 she was Chairman of our Quilt Show where she came up with the brilliant idea to have badges made for all the volunteers who worked at the show, (and she's still in charge of those badges!) She introduced maps to help direct visitors. She also procured the display window at the Country Store for future shows, and has decorated the window every year since. The work doesn't stop there. Every year Pat works at take-in of guilts. She is there before 6:00 a.m. on the day of our Quilt Show to organize and hang quilts and to take them down. Pat stays all day on the day of the show to help wherever she is needed. In 2013, she was Vice-President of the guild and went on to be President, where besides her responsibilities as President, Pat spearheaded the process for our guild to be a non-profit. Not only did she meet numerous times with an accountant and attorney, Pat spent many months working diligently guiding us to become non-profit. As former President she sat on the board as an advisor for another year. Sewing with her grandmother, teaching art, painting and photography are skills that have helped to make her the accomplished guilter she is today. Her quilts have been shown in guild displays at Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show, our Sunriver Outdoor Quilt Show, Quilt Works Gallery, BJ's Quilt Shop, Aspen Ridge, the Sunriver Book Store and the Northwest Quilt Expo in Portland. She has also displayed guilts with the Fiber Chix art guilting group, where she has been a member since its inception in 2010. Independently she has shown at two themed shows in the Quilt Works Gallery. She has also entered three quilts in the Shaker Challenges. She was juried into an exhibit at the Betty Gray Art Gallery at the Sunriver Resort Lodge. Pat has one of her quilts in Sarah Kaufman's book, Folded Log Cabin Quilts. Currently, Pat was accepted into the juried Fiber Art show at the Unitarian Universalist Fellowshop of Central Oregon. Pat is a skilled and creative guilter who has generously supported and promoted the guild. She is always there to answer questions, help new members, teach classes and give of her time.





















## PAT JONES Master Quilter Nomination

I would like to nominate Pat Jones for Master Quilter. I have known Pat since I joined the guild in 2010 and have admired her service to the guild, her knowledge of guilting and her beautiful work as a guilter. She is a master at every level of guilting, both hand and machine. Pat began sewing as a young teenager by making her own clothes (as many of us did). She then moved on to making children's clothing, pillow guilts and embroidery. Pat was an art teacher for middle school students in Winnemucca, Nevada. With a group of teachers, she took her first quilting class, led by a local Home Economics teacher. After that she was hooked! This is where her many accomplishments in guilting began; Pat had her guilts displayed in Winnemucca's local art gallery and contributed many quilts to a local charity in Winnemucca. After retiring from education, she and her husband moved to Alaska where she joined another quilt group. Her accomplishments in quilting continued where she made more charity quilts, attended retreats and taught classes for the community college and her local quilt guild. In 2007, Pat and her husband moved to Sunriver and she joined Mountain Meadow Quilters and she was able to continue to show and share her accomplishments in guilting. Pat has volunteered for the guild in a variety of capacities, including: Hospitality in 2008 and 2009; Programs in 2010 and 2011; Sunriver Quilt Show Director in 2012, where she introduced the use of maps and hostess badges; Vice President in 2013; President in 2014; mentor to the incoming President in 2015; and Drawings in 2017. During her tenure as President, she oversaw the process for the Guild to obtain non-profit status. She logged many hours working with an accountant and attorney to obtain the Guild's non-profit status. She gave monthly updates to the Guild so we knew exactly how the process was going. I consider this an amazing feat for a volunteer to oversee! In addition to the official positions she has held with the Guild, Pat has consistently volunteered (along with her husband, Charlie) for the guilt hanging and takedown on the day of the Sunriver Quilt Show. Pat is a true Master Quilter. She consistently shows her latest projects at Show and Tell and has had quilts displayed in the Sunriver Quilt Show; QuiltWorks; Sister's Outdoor Quilt Show; and had a quilt in an exhibit at the Sunriver Resort. As a member of the Fiber Chix group of guilters, she has shown guilts in their special exhibits. Pat is greatly admired for her many accomplishments and dedication to our quilt challenges and Shaker challenges. She has contributed to MMQ's special guilt displays at various Sister's Outdoor Quilt Shows and in 2015 to the Modern Quilt traveling show. For the guild, Pat continues to donate charity guilts and bazaar items every year. She has also taught various bazaar classes. She also has a picture of her quilt published in Sarah Kaufman's book, "Folded Log Cabin Quilts". Even though Pat is a very accomplished guilter, she continues to take classes from nationally recognized teachers such as David Taylor, Margaret Miller and Helene Knott, along with a variety of classes at Quilter's Affair during the Sister's Outdoor Quilt Show. 
