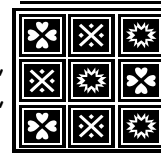

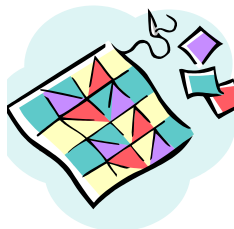

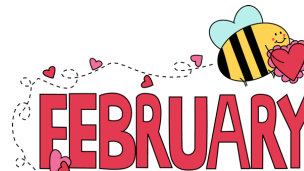

BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES

January 9, 2018

Meeting was called to order by President, Sandy Schmidgall. **Greeter:** Caroline Lincoln reported we had two visitors today. **Hospitality:** Marleen Fugate reported the treats were provided by Judy Long, Sandy Schmidgall, Renee Peters, Donna Koziol and Christine Watkins. Marleen Fugate passed around a "Treats" sign-up sheet for 2018. **"Thinking of You's":** None **Announcements:** Bevalee Runner announced she was taking a temporary leave from the Applique group. Her daughter and son-in-law are moving back to Bend. They are on a child care waiting list but a slot may not be available until the fall. Grandma is needed. Applique will still continue. The meeting on January 16th will be at Connie Cleveland's. In Feb, the group will meet at Karen Padrick's. **Program:** Candace Ruland introduced Michelle McMicken, Master Quilter for 2016 as the speaker. Michelle shared her "Journey to Quilting" and showed quilts.

Break

Minutes: The minutes from the November 17, 2017, Business Meeting, were motioned, seconded and approved with no corrections. **Treasurer's Report:** Mindy Wolfman went over the proposed budget for 2018 that the Board had previously approved. Questions were asked and answered. The budget should reflect no net income or loss. The Treasurer's report was motioned, seconded and approved with no corrections. **Membership:** Sally Wilson reported she has 103 paid memberships so far. Membership cards were passed out. There were 10 new members signed up today. **Communications and Website:** Louise stated the website password would change on 1/15/18. The new password is on the back of your membership card. **Program:** Candace Ruland announced the speaker for Program in February will be Bevalee Runner, Master Quilter in MMQ. Her topic is "Stitched Synergy". In March our speaker will be Marie Bostwick, a novelist and quilter. She is a newer member to MMQ. The speaker in April will be Janet Nesbitt. A class will accompany this speaker; more on that later. **Education:** There is no report for Education as there is no Education Coordinator. The plea for a volunteer was put out. Later in the meeting Mike Carriger volunteered to be Education Coordinator. At that time Sandy Schmidgall volunteered to do a demonstration of the Bargello pattern at the January meeting. Michelle McMicken volunteered to conduct a class in February on one of the quilts she made in a class. This quilt has triangles that could work for the guild's quilts to submit to Sister's Quilt Show. **Sunriver Quilt Show:** Penny Ueeck stated the filing deadline was met to hang the banner for the Sunriver Quilt Show. **Sisters Quilt Show:** Julia Jeans stated the theme for next year's Sister's Quilt Show is "Creative Trails". "Three Times Ten" was what the guild voted for as our theme (it incorporates our 30th year birthday). A handout was distributed explaining what is meant by Three Times Ten; it is triangle based. The quilt must be a minimum 40" wide and no more than 102." Julia needs a list by 2/23/18 of: your name, the name of your quilt and the approximate size. She thanked Judy A. Johnson for all the help she has provided in the past years. **Bazaar:** Dorothy Spain announced a table is set up in the back of the room for sign-ups of Bazaar classes. She stated she also obtained approval from the Board to participate in 2 Christmas Bazaars; one in Bend and one in La Pine. Christmas bazaar classes will be held after our quilt show; but that doesn't mean you can't make things all year. Jeri Barton, a new member, has volunteered to be the coordinator for the Bazaar. **Service Projects:** Denise Meese reported the Sit N' Sew group will meet on the first Tuesday of the Month at Homestead Quilts, starting in January 2018. Denise has sent around a list of charities to vote for who will receive our contributions in 2018. Add a group that interests you. She thanked Kathy Shaker for the wonderful contribution she made from B.J.'s Quilt Basket to Services. There were 62 panels and several bolts of fabric. MMQ thanks you Kathy! **Newsletter:** The next newsletter deadline is 1/16/2018. Nancy reminded committee coordinators that she is not responsible to remind them to submit information. She will be sending a list of Newsletter deadlines for the year. Send articles to: mmqnewsletter@gmail.com. **Retreat:** No report. **Applique:** See announcements. **Block of the Month (BOM):** Nancy Fischer will give the fabric requirements for her mystery quilt at the January Education Meeting. The quilt is called "Journey Home". She will also share 8 rulers she purchased at the Houston Quilt Market. **Technique of the Month (TOM):** Deb Ewing reports that the TOM may or may not relate to the BOM. **Secret Pals:** Coming into this meeting only 4 people had asked to be in Secret Pals for 2018. Thus, it hadn't been set up yet. Now Barb Owens states she has 10; you will be hearing from her. **Christmas Party:** Sue Humiston thanked all those who participated in last year's luncheon. She states the date has been confirmed for the next Christmas Luncheon on 12/11/18, our regular meeting date. She is also having meetings at her home to make decorations for the 2018 luncheon. The meetings are the third Wednesday of the month at 11:00; bring a sandwich and she will provide salad.

The suggestion was made that if it is a paid class, the no-show will not be refunded for not attending. They need to find a replacement. No decision has been made.

Sandy also shared that 5 committees were approved to be set up at the Board Meeting in October. 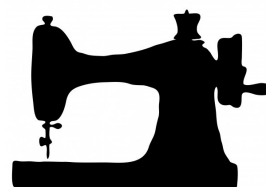
PARKING AT BJ'S QUILT BASKET For 4th Tuesday Meetings

BOARD MEETING MINUTES

January 4, 2018

Members Attending: Patty Gates (BM), Michelle McMicken (BM), Sandra Schmidgall (BM), Mindy Wolfman (BM), Robin Bracken (BM), Denise Meese (BM) and Nancy Fischer (BM). Other attendee's: Mike Carriger, Dorothy Spain, Barb Owens, Lavelle Wallace and Penny Ueeck.

Meeting called to order by President, Sandra Schmidgall, at 10:20 a.m.

New Business:

Outreach Committee: There was a discussion of the duties an Outreach Committee would fulfill. There may be some expenses for mailing. The following motion was made, seconded and approved by the Board: The guild will start an Outreach Committee and they will have a budget of \$50 a year. Mike Carriger will be the coordinator beginning 1/18. **2018 Budget:** Mindy Wolfman, Treasurer, reviewed the proposed 2018 budget line item by line item. Adjustments were made as follows: 1) Joy Ryan provided Program's itemized estimated costs for 2018 and the total was \$3,915.25. The Program Budget was increased to \$4,000. 2) Service Project Coordinator, Denise Meese, explained the group was going to need more batting to finish out 2018. \$150 was added to their budget. 3) Mindy had anticipated 10 meetings at B.J.'s Quilt Basket in 2018; but there will probably be 11. \$30 added to B.J.'s room rental 4) Based on last year's expenses, the Hospitality budget was reduced \$50. The following motion was made, seconded and approved by the Board: The proposed budget for 2018 was accepted. The budget will be presented to all guild members at the January Business Meeting for approval. **Retreat:** During the budget discussion the following was discussed: Right now there is no cap on the amount of money that can be set aside/accumulated for the Guild Retreat. Also, 30% of all bazaar net earnings are put into the Retreat Fund each year. We are not sure where this figure came from. It is not included in the bylaws or the procedures. It seems that is just the way we have always done it. Mindy requested clarification of this procedure and it be provided in writing. After discussion, the Board made the following motion that was seconded and approved: The yearly amount provided to the Retreat Fund will be the lesser of 30% gross bazaar sales OR our net cash income for the year. There will be a cap on the total cash in the restricted retreat fund of \$10,000. **Excess Funds Committee:** The setting up of this committee was approved at the October 2017 Board Meeting; but the funds could not be allocated at that time because it was not included in the budget for 2017. It is included in the budget for 2018. The following motion was made, seconded and approved by the Board: The amount allocated to the Excess Funds Committee will be \$4,500. This surplus cash is to be used for betterment of the operation of the guild. All funds spent must be Board approved. **Bazaar:** Dorothy Spain asked the Board for permission for our Bazaar Donations/Classes to include Christmas items and that MMQ be able to participate in local bazaars to sell these items. She wants to be able to participate in more timely bazaars to the holidays. Approval was given. **Holiday Party:** The following motion was made, seconded and approved by the Board: The Holiday Party is approved for December 11, 2018, at the Great Hall. If this date is not available we will try for the following dates in this order: 12/12, 12/13, 12/5 or 12/6. A check was issued for the down payment. **Education:** As of this date no one has volunteered to be the Education Coordinator. The question is what will be done at the Jan 23, 2018 Meeting? The following motion was made, seconded and approved by the Board: There will be no Education portion of the meeting on Jan 23; unless someone volunteers in the interim and is able to schedule the event. **Newsletter:** Nancy Fischer is sending out a memo to all Committee Coordinators stating articles for the Newsletter are due to her by the third Tuesday of the month. She will let them know if this changes. It is the committee's responsibility to make their submissions timely; it is not her job to remind them.

Meeting adjourned at 12:55 p.m.

THINK ABOUT!

Volunteers needed! When is the last time anyone said to you, you need to spend money? What fun!

The Board is working to make the guild compliant with our non-profit status. The guild is carrying more assets than we should. The Board has discussed this and we will be setting up some committees to remedy this situation. (Don't worry - we are keeping a safety net of resources for the on-going maintenance of the guild.) It will be an opportunity for members to have some input in the running of the guild. We will be looking for volunteers to work on the following committees:

30th Birthday Celebration

MMQ will be celebrating its 30th year of the Sunriver Quilt Show in 2018. We want to make a big deal of this. \$500 has been allocated to this committee to plan how to celebrate the event during the Sunriver Quilt Show. This will be done in conjunction with quilt show activities. Out of the volunteers, someone will be the spokesperson or contact. Spending requires Board approval.

Judy Hopkins Fund

This money (\$1,672.03) was collected from the sale of donated items from Judy Hopkins who passed away in 2012. The donation was to the entire guild, not as specific group. Therefore, the money should be spent on something that is beneficial to the entire guild. It is hoped that Sarah Kaufman will volunteer and lead this group as Judy was her friend. Spending requires Board approval.

Excess Funds Committee

This committee has been allotted \$4,500 (Sweet!). The money spent is meant to aid the running of the guild. What does the guild need? New quilt hanging racks, tents, increase the budget for better programs, support the mentoring program established by QuiltWorks??? MMQ Committee's in the guild may have some special needs to be considered. Volunteer to help decide where the money would be best spent. Spending requires Board approval.

Two Other Committees will also be formed:

Pay N' Go

This will probably be a one-time meeting. Michelle McMicken will be the Spokesperson. Clarification of Pay N' Go status will be explained if it still isn't clear. Pay N' Go can occur as a vendor at the Quilt Show. Procedures will be written to include in the Procedures Handbook as how to set up Pay N' Go.

Website Committee

This committee will explore the current system to determine what it can and cannot do. Is it meeting our needs? If it is not capable of doing the things for us we need, the committee will explore other systems. You don't need technical computer experience but should have a working knowledge of computers. Current contract expires 9/19. The guild needs to be ready to move on this change if necessary

There is work to be done and we are asking everyone to think about volunteering. The committee's will not be long-term commitments. It is a perfect time to participate in your guild that gives you so much. The committee's will be discussed in full at the February 13th Business Meeting and sign-ups will be taken at that time. 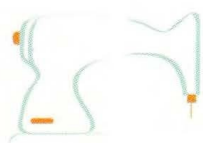

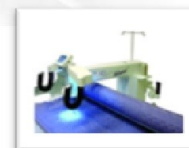

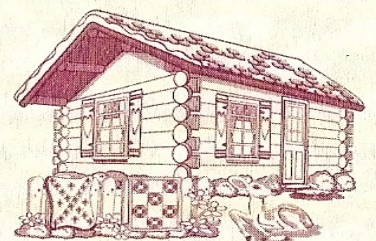
