



TREASURER'S REPORT

I have no particularly exciting financial news for our first month of 2018, but dues receipts are going well. As of January 31 we had received dues from 104 members, which is just short of 75% of our goal. Please remember to remit your \$35 dues to either myself or Sally Wilson, and also to turn in your 2018 membership information form so Sally can keep our roster up to date. Remember, dues are due by March 31!

As of February 9 we had just under \$12,000 in our checking account and \$6,100 in our savings account. \$4,500 of the checking account balance is the accumulated surplus which has built up over the past 7 years, \$4,400 of the savings account is designated for the 2020 retreat, and \$1,675 of the savings is the restricted Judy Hopkins Fund. If you are interested in serving on a committee to come up with ideas for the best use of the surplus and Judy Hopkins Fund for the benefit of the guild and its exempt function, be sure to sign up as those committees will be forming soon.

Meeting was called to order by President, Sandy Schmidgall @ 10.00 am. **Greeter**: Marleen Fugate (filling in for Caroline Lincoln) reported we had eight new visitors today. **Hospitality**: Marleen Fugate reported the treats were provided by Denise Meese, Valerie Weber, Jerri Banton and Marleen Fugate. The "treats" sign-up was passed around. "**Thinking of You's"**: Michelle McMicken had minor surgery on her leg; Caroline Lincoln fell and broke her femur and will be out for 12 weeks; and Louise Yoshihara's son is finally out of the hospital (after 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ months). **Announcements**: Sandy Schmidgall passed around sign-up sheets for the 5 Committee's that are being formed. They are: Pay N' Go, 30th Birthday, Excess Funds, Judy Hopkins Fund and Website. The Committees were announced at the January Business Meeting and an article in the February Newsletter.

In an effort to speed up our meetings, presenters are asked to keep their announcements to three minutes. Sandy also stated that if a person has an announcement to make at the Business Meeting to let her know and she will write your name in; also, if you are a committee coordinator and have no announcement to make, let her know and she will skip your committee report at the business meeting.

Program: Joy Ryan announced the speaker for Program in March will be Marie Bostwick, a novelist and guilter. She is also a member of MMQ. The speaker in April will be Janet Nesbitt. A class will accompany this speaker; sign-ups are available; you must use one of books in the class being offered. Education: Mike Carriger is now the Education Coordinator. He stated the 2/27 meeting will have Nancy Fischer talking about rulers. The 3/27 meeting will have Michelle McMicken teaching a Jigsaw pattern guilt. This guilt will work for the "Guild" theme guilt for the Sisters Quilt Show. The 4/24 meeting will feature Sue Humiston informing us on how to prepare a top for "long arm" guilting. There will also be a panel of "long armers" for discussion. Sunriver Quilt Show: Bonnie Schaefer wanted to thank all those who volunteered to help with the guilt show. She has only one spot to fill; someone to do "Logistics". Sisters Quilt Show: Julia Jeans said you need to notify Susan Campbell by 2/23/18 of: your name, the name of your guilt and the approximate size. Michelle McMicken is offering a class on 3/27 that meets the definition of the theme for SOQS. She explained how to figure out the size guilt you want to make. Bazaar: Dorothy Spain announced a table is set up in the back of the room for sign-ups of Bazaar classes. They completed a class on Notebook Covers and Key Ring Holders. The class on 2/15 is Hedgehog Hot Pads and Potholders. Connie Cleveland says if you bring in potholders there is a basket in the back or put them with the Bazaar items. Service Projects: Denise Meese states the Guild voted to supply service quilts to the following agencies: Kid's Center, Grandma's House, Bethlehem Inn, Friends of the Children and Chemo Quilts. 6 hour class. Skill Level: Beginner



In this class, students can select ANY crazy quilt from any One Sister or Buggy Barn publication. That's right each student could potentially be making a different quilt! This is a fun class and students learn my popular "crazy" piecing technique (stacking fabric, cutting on the lines, shuffling and stitching it all). This trademark piecing method is easy and forgiving ensuring quilting success for piecers of all levels. This fun technique keeps you coming back for more, one quilt after another and will keep you "piecing like crazy" long after the class is over.

Things to know:

Every student must purchase the Buggy Barn or One Sister "Crazy" pattern or book of your choice. Currently out of print or previously purchased books or patterns can be used. You can purchase books and patterns on her website www.onesisterdesigns.com and on Amazon, probably other places. Please check with the local quilt shops to see if they are carrying any of Janet's books.

She will be bringing books and fabric to sell.

Prior to the class : Students will trace the crazy pattern onto freezer paper and have their fabric ironed and **ready** to stack and cut. A complete detail sheet will be given when you sign up and pay for the class.
