## PARKING AT BJ'S QUILT BASKET For 4th Tuesday Meetings

What fun to hold our fourth Tuesday meeting each month at BJ's!! Thank you to Kathy and her staff!

A few parking reminders: please leave 5-6 spots free in front of the shop for BJ's customers. The majority of MMQ members should park across the street along the side of JoAnn's. Please leave the parking spots in the BJ's parking lot for those unable to walk across the street. If you are bringing sewing machines or other items to the meeting, please unload at the side entrance and then move your car to the JoAnn's parking lot. Please do not arrive before 9:15 am and please use the side entrance.



## BEST CALZONE RECIPE EVER

I've looked for many years for the right recipe for the perfect Calzone dough and now I think I've found it. This recipe is for pocket Calzones and makes a total of eight.

#### Dough

2 cups lukewarm (110 degrees) water

6 cups of All-purpose flour

1 tablespoon Glutton (for high altitude cooking)

 $2\frac{1}{4}$  teaspoons instant yeast or active dry yeast or one packet active dry yeast

#### Calzone wash

1 egg

#### Fillings

Sauce: marinara, pizza, pesto, etc.

Meat: sliced ham, pepperoni prosciutto, salami, smoked turkey, cooked and crumbed hamburger, sausage, etc.

Cheese: sliced or grated - provolone, mozzarella, Parmesan, Gorgonzola, feta, etc.

Vegetables: chopped or sautéed onions, scallions, hot or sweet peppers, mushrooms, garlic, shallots, olives, capers, sundried tomatoes, artichoke hearts, spinach, etc.

#### To make the dough:

- 1. Mix all of the ingredients together until the dough pulls away from the sides of the bowl. Turn the dough out onto a floured surface to knead. Note: A bread maker machine works great for making the dough.
- 2. Knead the dough until it's smooth and supple, adding more water or flour as needed.
- 3. Place the dough in a bowl. Cover the bowl and allow the dough to rise for 1 hour, or until it's puffy.
- 4. Gently press the dough down and turn it out onto a lightly floured surface. Alternatively, you can leave dough in the bowl and let it rise again, for about half the time of the initial rising; this will produce a finer grained product.

#### To make the Calzones:

- 1. Divide the dough in half. Divide each half in half. Divide each quarter in half. This gives you eight small pieces of dough.
- 2. Form each piece of dough into a sphere.
- 3. Place each piece on a floured surface (one at a time) and push gently down flattening the ball.
- 4. Roll each piece out flipping and turning the dough 90 degrees several times until you have a roughly circular piece of dough. The dough needs to be as flat and thin as you can make it but not so thin that it tears when being picked up or worked with.
- 5. To fill your Calzone, begin with one or two tablespoons of sauce and spread over one half of the dough leaving at least half to three guarters of an inch from the edges.
- 6. Spread a thin layer of cheese.
- 7. Add other fillings being careful not to overfill. Remember that you have to fold the dough over on itself.
- 8. Add more sauce over the filling.
- 9. Add more cheese over the sauce.
- 10. Fold the dough over the filling and pinch the edges closed. Make sure the edges are secure or the sauce and filling will leak out during baking.
- 11. Place each Calzone on a baking sheet cover with parchment paper.
- 12. Preheat oven to 450 degrees.
- 13. Mix egg and water thoroughly and brush each Calzone liberally ensuring that you get a good coating along the pinched seam
- 14. Bake at 450 degrees for fifteen (15) minutes. Remove Calzones from oven and reset oven to 400 degrees.
- 15. Turn Calzones over and brush more egg wash over them coating the entire surface. The Calzones are hot, so be careful turning them.
- 16. Return Calzones to oven and bake for fifteen (15) minutes at 400 degrees. Watch to ensure that the crust remains a golden brown.
- 17. Remove from the oven and let cool for 30 minutes before serving. The interior of the Calzone will be extremely hot (remember all that cheese).

#### Note: Calzones will look finished after first fifteen minutes of cooking but are not finished.
