PROGRAM MEETING October 9—10 am @ SHARC Kathy Deggendorfer "Quilters Road Trip"

Kathy Deggendorfer, from Sisters, will be the featured presenter at the October 9 MMQ business meeting. Her topic will be a "Quilters Road Trip".

Kathy lives on a cattle and hay ranch just outside of Sisters, on the eastern slopes of the Cascade Mountains. Her studio is in Sisters at Sisters Art Works. Inspired by the color and texture of her surroundings her vibrant and colorful watercolor paintings are whimsical representations of ranch life. Magpies snacking on the cat food and mule deer grazing on the petunias- all end up as models in her paintings.

Kathy has a line of custom tiles and tile murals done in collaboration with Kibak Tile in Sisters. She just finished a 24 foot tile mural for the new Cancer Center at St. Charles Medical Center in Bend.

2019 SISTERS OUTDOOR QUILT SHOW

The theme for the Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show 2019 is... Baskets of Plenty - use your creativity and imagination. A basket, basket weave, Cornucopia on the Thanksgiving table... it's up to you! The only requirement is that your quilt be created based on the theme Baskets of Plenty and that the quilt measures no less than 40 inches in width or length and that the length does not exceed 102 inches.

It's time to start planning for your entry in MMQ's special exhibit July 13, 2019. Sign ups will be coming soon. Deadline for preliminary submission is at the end December. That means you have 2 1/2 months to decide what you're making, it's name and what size your quilt is intended to be. Quilts are to be completed and turned in to Julia during the month and June 2019. Part of the show requirements is that we deliver the entire exhibit together.

A \$20 fee will apply when each participant registers their quilt on the Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show Website. This happens a bit later. (MMQ pays a separate special exhibit fee). This \$20 the covers up to 10 quilts that can be entered be one exhibitor.

I will have sign up sheets available at our meetings. If you would like to email me or Susan Campbell the information that works too. We will need your first and last name, telephone number, email address, size of quilt and the name of your quilt.

If anyone's quilt is completed by December and you would like to Submit a picture for possible publication with our write up, please let me know. Thank you very much I look forward to a spectacular exhibit.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Since we've wrapped up the third quarter of 2018, it's time to look at our financial condition as we approach the end of the year. Year to date our total income is down about 10% from budget, due primarily to our bazaar sales being approximately 20% under budget. This was somewhat offset by our increased membership dues, increased proceeds from the vendor booths at our guilt show, and our 30th year celebration expenses coming in significantly under budget.

Although our income side is disappointing, just as in prior years, our expenses year to date have come in significantly under budget. Program and Service Projects have operated just at their budgets, while Education is significantly under budget for the year. Most other general expenses are right at budget year to date.

I project that we will have a net profit for the year, even though we had budgeted for a \$500 net loss because of the special 30th year anniversary expenses. With a net profit we will be able to allocate 30% of our bazaar sales to the 2020 retreat, consistent with prior years. We still have a significant portion of our Excess Funds account available to purchase long-term assets for the guild; the Board is considering portable quilt racks to increase the capacity of our quilt show, and improved bazaar display fixtures to increase the visual impact of our annual bazaar. The Board welcomes your input as to the best use of our Excess Funds.



BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES—September 11, 2018

Meeting was called to order by President, Sandy Schmidgall @ 10:10 a.m.

Greeter: Heidi Thaut reported we had four visitors today.

Hospitality: Marleen Fugate reported the treats were provided by Michelle McMicken, Terry Anderson, Mary Klein and Deb Ewing. "Thinking of You's": Betty Vincent had Rotator Cuff Surgery on 9/10 and Kate MacMillan has had a serious fall. We wish them both a speedy recovery.

Announcements: Heidi Thaut passed out a handout to all about the 2020 Retreat Registration before the Business Meeting on October 9th. You must be present to register. Mindy Wolfman announced she is campaigning for donations to the Angel Fund. She hopes to be able to assist 6 people (financially) to attend the Retreat (for those who might not otherwise be able to attend). Ruth Kinane announced that all the small guilts given to Sunriver businesses for the Quilt Show have been returned. Deb Ewing announced she is planning to attend the Redmond Guild Quilt Show on 9/22 and if anyone wants to go along, give her a call. Julia Jeans passed out a ballot for everyone to vote on the theme for our guild's guilts to be entered in the Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show next year. **Program**: Joy Ryan introduced our speaker for today, Tracy Brookshire. She is from Capitola, CA. right on the coast. She is a guilter, guilt teacher, pattern designer and a judge of guilts. She will be teaching a class tomorrow at BJ's called "Butterfly Dreams". Her trunk show today was called "A Love Affair with Japan". She has attended the Tokyo Quilt Festival in Japan several times and shared photos of exquisite quilts shown there. Culturally, in Japan, when women married, they no longer worked; thus having a lot of time at home they began guilting in the late 1970's. They have come a long way since then. They do not take lessons from many instructors; they select a mentor and they have them for life. She spoke of many likenesses and differences between American and Japanese Quilters. They have 3 categories of guilts: 1) Brown Quilts - guilts made from antique "we3Ikat" materials and vintage kimonos. 2) Silk Quilts - guilts made with matte silk, shiny silk, embroidery and are hand quilted. 3) "Wa" Quilts - quilts that are very personal to the quilter. The subject may be very close to their hearts, or may use the work clothes of a special person. These guilts have to do with their Japanese identity. In all guilts they use a lot of applique, in the borders and the sashing, just everywhere. They were very beautiful.

Under Announcements Judy Johnson gave a report on the "Quilt Outlet" not the Bazaar; and the new project for the Applique group is Sea Life not Sea Creatures. Communications and Website: No report. Program: Joy Ryan announced the speaker for October will be Kathy Deggendorfer. She is a graphic designer and guilt artist.

The Quilt Outlet (vendor) Report (submitted by Mary Klein)

The reports were reviewed individually and the following items were discussed:

Pat Jones reported that the key for the window display was picked up from Alpine Entertainment. Pat Jones and Ona Glassford will complete the window display again in 2019. The window display space needs to be procured in January for the week before the 2019 Sunriver Quilt Show. LaWanda Richardson and Pat Jones were able to purchase additional signage from the print shop in La Pine. The original banners (without the logo) were hung by Charlie Jones and a banner was hung on the fence at the Three Rivers School with permission from the school administration. In January 2019, MMQ will attempt to get approval of the banner with the logo.

There was a discussion on the damage to quilts from the sprinklers in the front of the building near Village Bar & Grill. At least one of the quilts was damaged from the water from the sprinkler. It was discussed and decided that the wording "water damage" should be added to the guilt waiver starting with the 2019 Sunriver Quilt Show. It was noted that Bonnie Schaefer will need to work diligently with the Village Management and Maintenance to assure that the sprinklers are turned off in all areas of the Village. The concern was that the sprinklers for the lawn area were turned off, but that the sprinklers in front of the buildings facing Beaver Drive were not turned off.

Judy A. Johnson commented that most of the Special Exhibits showed fairly nicely and that they were very relevant to the 30th anniversary show and represented education, fellowship and service activities. There were problems because of the large number of Special Exhibits, which numbered over 100. These issues could have been resolved if we knew lineage of the space so we could plan in advance where the special exhibits could be hung. The exhibit in Sunriver Books was well received and a higher number of people walked thru the exhibit than in previous years. The lack of a logistics chair was evident. Debra Ewing commented that, with her husband Chuck, they updated the linear footage. Nancy Fischer recommended that a registration form would be due on July 1 by members with the name and measurements of the quilt(s). Debra Ewing recommended that people also list the importance of the order the guilts should be listed. This would give the quilt hanging people an option when there may be too many quilts. Sandy Schmidgall stated that some of the issues is that some people have been in their jobs for many years and now they are unable to do their jobs. New people taking these jobs over are not aware of all they are required to do. Getting back to a Chair and an Assistant Chair (who takes over for the Chair the following year) is very important.

MMQ Board Meeting Minutes—continued Thursday - September 20, 2018

Debra Ewing commented that the Logistics Chair should be broken into several positions. The importance of writing reports/instructions for the position you are in is very important so there can be continuity.

Ruth Kinane volunteered to work with Bonnie Schaefer on breaking down logistics to see what jobs can be broken down under Logistics.

Nancy Fischer volunteered to be "Village/SROA Liasion" for the Sunriver Quilt Show. This would include getting banner approval and working with the Village management on the date for the quilt show and various items, i.e., sprinkler and banners to be hung.

Sandy Schmidgall reviewed with the Board the report from Michelle McMicken to discuss solutions for problems with the Sunriver Quilt Show. Several items were discussed on how to handle the number of quilts: Quilt entry form due by July 1; limit number of guilts; and not shown in a previous year. Debra Ewing volunteered to be the Quilt Hanging position under Logistics.

There was a further discussion on how to handle the number of guilts members could enter into the Sunriver Quilt Show. It was questioned whether special exhibits should be in this number. Nancy Fischer mentioned that the starburst in the Village is gone, which will give us more rack space. It was mentioned that we will need more volunteers to make additional racks. Mindy Wolfman mentioned that there is \$3,500 left in excess funds to make more quilt racks.

There was a discussion on the Bazaar and ways to increase sales: new items, updated fabric, possibly a table in the paver area to show examples of items for sale in the Bazaar.

There was a discussion on the location of The Quilt Outlet and one suggestion was to locate The Quilt Outlet in the Bazaar area (listed as Vendor on the map). There was also a discussion on hanging a sign at each vendor booth (including The Quilt Outlet) to identify them as a vendor and not related to MMQ. The Quilt Outlet has definite rules and in particular must be a MMQ member. A discussion was held on the reason why The Quilt Outlet was developed, which is all related to us being a 501c(3).

In The Quilt Outlet report, it was suggested for next year that they would want to make a suggestion to donate 10% to MMQ so the guilt outlet could become part of MMQ. This would not be allowed.

The following Items will be discussed and voted on at the next Board meeting:

- Number of guilts in show: no number should be set. They can enter all the special exhibits plus additional guilts and then prioritize the quilts they want in the show, not including the special exhibits.
- New registration form to enter quilts by July 1. Form should be available to the members by May.
- Use excess funds to make quilt racks and vertical exhibits for the Bazaar.
- Location for Quilt Outlet (or other additional vendors) in the Bazaar area.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:31 pm.
