

### The whole earth is filled with awe at your wonders Psalm 65:8

This is the scripture that is guiding Monica and Mike on their passage across the ocean later this year, an anticipated passage of awe and wonder.

We will be taking our own passage of awe and wonder through sermons and other activities during that time. As we follow them on the map and through their blog, we will be focusing on how we are overwhelmed with God's awe and wonder. We have all had those moments when we stand speechless and think to ourselves, "Wow...God is here. God is amazing!" Sometimes it happens to us in a boat, in a car, walking a path. We will share them with everyone after Monica and Mile leave in September. Please consider sending me a short description of your experiences. If there is a scripture that comes to mind to go along with it, please send that too.

I anticipate that this will become a **devotional booklet** which allows us to encourage and support one another in our own life's passages, and help us find God right there beside us all along. Lets see how many of these I can collect within the next month!

### It's that time again! Eastern Shore Presbyterian Ministries (ESPM)

ESPM was started in 2004 by the five (now only four) Presbyterian Churches on the Eastern Shore. We came to the realization that many students in our elementary schools did not have the required school supplies. In two schools 75% of the families live below the poverty level.

We decided that our goal would be to provide sufficient supplies so that the schools would have them available for any child who was living below the poverty level.

Members of the ESPM team contact each school in June and July to determine what quantities of each item of the school supply list are needed. Then we contact WalMart and they place an order with their warehouse. WalMart guarantees that their price to us is the best we can find in the local area.

We take delivery on a Friday in late August and on the next Monday volunteers from all the ESPM churches gather at NMPC to 'pick' the items needed for each school and deliver them. An average of over \$3,600 each year is raised.

THEREFORE-NOW IS THE TIME for your DONATIONS earmarked ESPM or 'school supplies' and either dropped in the offering plate on Sunday morning or mail to NMPC PO BOX 397 Onancock VA 23417.

As a church we commit a portion of our mission budget to this mission effort, *but we rely on all the Presbyterian Churches' individual donations as well.* 

We look forward to this joint mission effort to be another year of huge success. Thank you for all you do!

# Weighed down

Many people dream of having the "right stuff" to fly to space. Recently, 18,300 people applied for just 12 astronaut spots at NASA! Fanfare over the moon landing's 50th anniversary is sure to spark even more interest.

Leaving behind earthly troubles and floating in zero gravity must be amazing, right? Not, it turns out, for one's body. Weightlessness takes a heavy physical toll in space. Without resistance, muscles waste away and bones weaken. Bodily systems we take for granted are disrupted, causing disorientation. To counteract these effects, astronauts wear resistance suits while exercising. Ironically, after escaping Earth's gravity, they must replace it.

Similarly, we long for trouble-free days and pray for an end to earthly burdens, not recognizing that exertion, whether physical or spiritual, builds strength. "He who knows no hardships will know no hardihood," said Harry Emerson Fosdick. "He who faces no calamity will need no courage. … The characteristics in human nature which we love best grow in a soil with a strong mixture of troubles."

Every weighty challenge is a reason to "rejoice ... knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope" (Romans 5:3-4, ESV).

Three years ago we shared the SECURITY PLANS for Naomi Makemie. It's probably a good idea to review these again.



The *PCUSA* has requested that all churches develop *site specific security plans*. They want them to comply with Federal Emergency Management Administration standards for churches. The diagrams mark the fire extinguisher and AED locations as well as appropriate exits.

FIRE HAZARDS Goals: During – Protect all persons and property from injury

Objectives: Immediately **call 911**, fire and EMS; Immediately **evacuate** all persons from the building to the manse (1 Holly St) ; Account for all persons known to be on site After – Provide necessary medical attention Objectives: Immediately begin to provide first aid; Safely sweep the building



#### WEAPONS SECURITY

While recognizing the church as a safe and sacred space, our plan also recognizes that our Commonwealth has a concealed carry permit available. One objective of the NMPC plan is to "ensure all permit holders know the Code of Virginia Section 18.2-283." *If you have a "good and sufficient reason" for carrying, please confidentially inform Rev. Gould.* 

Goals: Before – Prevent a weapon incident from occurring

Objectives: Ensure all persons know their evacuation routes; Ensure all concealed gun permit holders are known by the Pastor; Ensure all permit holders know the Code of VA Section 18.2-283 During – Protect all persons and property from injury

Objectives: Immediately call 911 and EMS; Immediately evacuate all persons from the building to the manse (1 Holly St); Account for all persons known to be on site

After – Provide necessary medical attention

Objectives: Immediately begin to provide first aid; Safely sweep the building Code of Virginia, Section 18.2-283: Places off-limits when carrying: "To a place of worship while a meeting for religious purposes is being held at such place, without good and sufficient reason."


