SESSION DIGEST from our clerk at Naomi Makemie-Jody Humphreys

Rev. Gould opened the meeting with devotions and prayer.

Tracey Arvidson reported on the Presbytery meeting on April 25 at First Presbyterian Church in Hampton. Monica's Call to Worship was complimented by the Presbytery Moderator, all had fun packing over 10,000 meals in less than an hour for "Rise Against Hunger," and the Peacemaking Committee gave us a welcome sign which the Session accepted and posted in front of our church. The sign reads "No matter where you are from, we're glad you're our neighbor" in six languages.

Nuts and Bolts:

- Jack Humphreys reported that contracts have been signed with Thornton Air Conditioning and Paul Davis Restoration. They will both begin work on May 1. The air conditioning in the Sunday School and Choir rooms has been cleaned and is now operational. The hope is that all will be completed by the end of May. The estimated cost is \$150,000+.
- Joe's Boys will have a workday on Saturday, May 13.

Mission:

- George Heinrichs will call Vernon Bell re the school supply mission.
- Tracey Arvidson is working with the youth to select a "One Great Hour of Sharing" project to support that will not exceed \$500.
- Vacation Bible School will be July 31- August 4.
- G.F. Horne is being closed and clients are being relocated.
- Mission funds of \$100 were sent to Broadwater Academy to meet a need, to expand our community outreach and support our youth.

Presence:

- The youth liturgists are a big hit and we will encourage them to use their playground voices.
- A July youth led worship service was approved.
- One goal of Christian Education is to get young people to verbally express their faith.

Community:

- Pricing and organizing the yard sale materials will occur on May 4. <u>Set up staff are</u>
 <u>needed at 7 AM on May 6 and sales staff is needed from 8 AM 1 PM. Call Linda or Rick for help</u>
 <u>with your items before Thursday.</u>
- The picnic for both churches will follow worship on June 4 at the manse. Chicken will be provided so please bring sides. In case of rain, the picnic will move to the Makemie Room.
- The Spaghetti Dinner Fundraiser will be June 16 and will benefit the FMPC roof restoration. We are hoping for a large turnout from the Tour de Shore bikers.
- The <u>Facebook group</u> is doing a great job posting pictures, announcements and prayer needs.

Moderator:

- Monica commended us on our faithfulness during this building disruption. Kudos were expressed for all those who efficiently set up and tear down the chairs and tables for each activity including worship.
- We covered joys like the Lenten Lunch series, the Spell Right competition and Ed Satterfield's new job. We also raised concerns for those homebound and caring for others.
- Prayers continue to find new Treasurers. Can you count cash, make out a deposit slip, pay bills or balance a checkbook? See Monica. (Our deadline for new treasurer is JUNE.)
- Rev. Howard Picard will preach on May 14 while Monica is away. Monica will be gone from May10-20.

Old Business:

- The church books have been audited.
- A motion was approved to let all members have voice but not vote at Session meetings.

NMPC, Inc.:

- Excess Belote mission funds will be reinvested and we will keep \$12,000 in cash to cover the budgeted mission goals.

The next Stated Meeting of Session will be Wednesday, May 24 at 4:30 PM in the Makemie Room.

SESSION SUMMARY from our clerk at Francis Makemie-Cynthia Hall

A **stated session meeting** of Francis Makemie Presbyterian Church of Accomac, Virginia, was held at church **5:45 pm April 19, 2017**. The following members, constituting a quorum, were present: Joe Valentine, Rick Hall, Charlie Mahler, Cynthia Hall, Clerk, and Rev. Monica Gould, Moderator. Excused: Paul Hughes

Rev. Gould opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes: Minutes of the February 23, 2017, meeting were approved as corrected.

Pastor's Report: Rev. Gould reported the following:

Easter Sunday service attendance was 42.

Rev. Gould asked for articles and ideas for the newsletter.

At next week's Presbytery meeting, an hour will be dedicated to pack food for the Rise Against Hunger A wedding will be held at FMPC June 2, 2017. Belle Fear's grandson and Barbara Haynes' son Matthew will marry Meredith Brebner.

Participation in the July 4 parade in Accomac was discussed.

The group of brass players would like to return to FMPC to play.

Ed Satterfield held a hymn sing at FMPC March 17.

Treasurer's Report: see attached report

Rick reported that \$6255 has been received to date for the Raise the Roof campaign.

Gary Ewell plans to move the sanctuary from Daughtery PC in late spring.

The fence work is complete for a total of \$19,099. 00. The contractor added 2 more sections than originally quoted.

Rick is preparing application for a fall deadline to Synod for a \$5000 grant to help with the roof expenses. He will contact Presbytery for the \$5000 loan previously offered, with the expectation of the grant from Synod being approved and we can repay the loan. (note: a \$10,000 loan check from PEVA was received just days after this meeting.)

New Business:

Joe reported that the organ "check up" cost 99.00 and the technician suggested \$600 more repairs. The consensus was to repair the tweeter and pedals at this time.

Moving the ramp from the front to the back of the church was discussed.

A sign up will be prepared for garden tour day docents, communion prep, and Sunday service refreshments and flowers.


A book study/film study about race relations is planned for late spring.

NUTS & BOLTS REPORT-NEWS FROM THE NMPC BUILDING & GROUNDS COMMITTEE

From chair Jack Humphreys

After almost four months of working to get insurance company approval for clean-up and repairs of the smoke damage to the church we have signed contracts with Thornton services for all the air conditioning work and with Paul Davis Restoration for all the clean-up. Rick Turner and I have met with representatives of four companies while estimates of costs have gone from \$19,000, to \$65,000, to \$150,000 plus. Work is scheduled to begin May 1st, and hopefully will be completed before the end of May. We anticipate only minor additional disruption to church activities.

A taste of God's love

In Lost in Wonder, Love and Praise (Abingdon Press), John Killinger describes a mother's love — and how it offers a tiny foretaste of God's love:

"It is stronger than steel, softer than down and more resilient than a green sapling on the hillside. It closes wounds, melts disappointments and enables the weakest child to stand tall and straight in the fields of adversity. I believe that this love, even at its best, is only a shadow of the love of God, a dark reflection of all that we can expect of him, both in this life and the next."

Restoring the balance

In Springs in the Valley (Zondervan), pioneer missionary Lettie Cowman tells of a traveler making a trek through an African jungle. Native tribesmen who helped carry loads walked rapidly on day one, covering a great distance. Yet the next morning they refused to move. When the frustrated traveler asked the tribesmen why they were just sitting, they said they'd gone too fast on the first day and "were now waiting for their souls to catch up to their bodies."

Cowman writes, "This whirling rushing life which so many of us live does for us what that march did for those tribesmen. The difference: They knew they needed to restore life's balance; too often we do not."

God promises rest for our soul *and* body, so don't overlook the importance of physical restoration. Only by taking time to recharge can you be an effective laborer in God's kingdom.





"Eternal Father, Strong to Save," often known simply as "The Navy Hymn," dates back to 1860, when William Whiting wrote it for a student of his about to travel by ship from England to America.

Original verses testified to the protection of God the Father, Christ, the Holy Spirit and the Trinity. In 1940, the U.S. Episcopal Church rewrote the hymn to include travel on land and in the air. Many verses have been written since: for Navy SEALs, submariners, astronauts, military families, ship dedications and more.

We thank you, God, for loved ones dear Who clung to faith beyond their fear, Who served and paid the highest price For freedom bought with sacrifice. May they remind us of your Son Whose death our final freedom won.


Make this craft to display a bit of springtime year-round!

What you need:

- · An old shirt
- Tempura paint (brown, dark pink, light pink and white)
- Paintbrush
- Light blue or white construction paper
- A paper plate
- Q-tips
- Paper towels

What you do:

- Roll up one sleeve and paint your arm and the palm of your hand brown.
- Lengthwise on the paper, carefully place your painted arm and hand, with fingers spread apart. (This is the tree trunk and branches.)
- Place the other paint colors on the plate.
- Using Q-tips, place dots of paint (blossoms!) all over the branches.
- When dry, display your tree — or give it as a Mother's Day gift.
