Nuts and Bolts:

- Jack Humphreys reported the painters will return May 30, the scaffolding will be taken down June 2, Paul Davis Co. will do general cleaning, the air conditioning will be finished and the organ pipes will be reinstalled in early June.
- The oriental carpet will be cleaned and Monica will contact the newspaper about an article on our restoration. A rededication ceremony for the sanctuary and Cada R. Grove room will be held on June 18.
- Joe's Boys will have a workday on Saturday, June 3.

Mission:

- The **VBS** theme is "Mission Madness- Having Hearts to Change the World" and will be held **July 31 thru August 4**. The schedule will be the same as last year. The community hands-on missions may include caring cards, food kits, blankets for the Senior Center, etc.
- In October, the mission budget priorities will be re-examined in light of the G.F. Horne closure.

It has been a long five months but the restoration of the church following the smoke damage that occurred 7-8 January is very close to completion. The scaffolding is coming down Monday and Tuesday 5-6 June. The sanctuary needs to be put back together, the finishing touches done to our all new heat pump AC system, the organ put back together, and a final clean-up. We hope to be able to worship in the sanctuary Sunday, 11 June. On Sunday, 18 June, Rev. Monica is planning a special rededication of the sanctuary.




Make this heartwarming handprint gift to give your dad or another special man on Father's Day.

A hymn's long journey

The beloved hymn "How Great Thou Art" came together across many years and miles. In 1885, when Swedish preacher Carl Boberg wrote a poem titled "O, Great God," he probably never dreamed he'd hear it performed years later to an old Swedish tune. Or that a Russian version would impact Stuart Hine, an English missionary to Poland, several decades later. Hine penned his own English version, resulting in the now-familiar lyrics.

From "the rolling thunder" echoing off the Carpathian Mountains, to the "woods and forest glades" of Romania, to powerful conversions to Christianity, Hine was inspired to craft each verse. Sometimes the Holy Spirit takes time to complete a work, and that journey is as important as the destination.


