As we enter into Advent we are reminded of the wonder of God that came to us in the silence of the night. We are reminded that God came to us in the most unassuming way. God came to us in the midst of chaos and turmoil. God comes to us through all the seasons and through all the ways of our lives, God does not hesitate to enter in, to be present in the stillness and in the despair, God finds ways to find us, hold us, love us.

In this season I am reminded of two things-one from a favorite author/priest; the other from sailing.

Advent does not lead to nervous tension stemming from expectation of something spectacular about to happen. On the contrary, it leads to a growing inner stillness and joy allowing me to realize that he for whom I am waiting has already arrived and speaks to me in the silence of my heart. Henri J.M. In sailing, heaving to (to heave to and to be hove to) is a way of slowing a sailboat's forward progress, as well as fixing the helm and sail positions so that the boat does not have to be steered. A sailor can benefit greatly from having this skill in their toolbox of abilities. Heave to is a great way of bringing the boat to a stop. It doesn't matter if the winds are howling or if they light. Practicing heave to will give the sailor a chance to stop whenever he or she wants to. Sometimes in life we have to find a way to stop even though life continues to be underway. The purpose of heave to is to rest, renew, regroup, and then get back to it. Sometimes the boat needs repair or a clean up. Sometimes the sailor needs a chance to cook dinner in the calm of a stop rather than healed at 45 degrees. Sometimes a sailor needs a nap, or a swim, or a shower in the calm and stillness that heave to can offer.

Our lives are the same. We are on a schedule most of the time to get somewhere or to do something. In the midst of doing the necessary, we too, sometimes need to stop ourselves and put the brakes on and let the waves keep going on around us, but we choose for our own renewal, to rest and to regroup, and to just stop.

In this busy season, may you find the tools needed to get through the business, and to fall in love all over again with the God who loves us so much to choose to enter our world and become one of us.

NOVEMBER 2018 SESSION DIGEST from Clerk of Session NMPC

- -Our hearts broke one by one as the news of the passing of Matthew May reached us.
- -Monica opened the meeting with Psalm 91 and prayers about who we are in the arms of God.
- -The church stands ready to assist Ron, Joan, Paige and the rest of the family in any way they wish.
- -Susan Grove reported that the Clergy Grant funds have been received, Sun Trust banking accounts set up, credit cards established, and work has been started on the contract for the Revs. Doan. The Presbytery's Commission on Ministries must review and approve the contract. A reimbursement form has also been developed.
- -The 2019 Budget and the Pastor's "Terms of Call" were approved. It was noted that our Pastor is paid less than the minimum salary recommended by the Presbytery. We discussed the proportional amount paid by Francis Makemie PC and voted that for IRS purposes, the housing allowance is \$4,800.
- -The Session approved four weeks of paid maternity leave and up to four weeks of half pay for the Organist.
- -Many thanks to those who prepared meals for church members in need.
- -After the Christmas program on December 16, it is time for the Cookie Walk. Bring your homemade cookies and exchange them for an equal number of other cookies.
- -On Christmas Eve's Eve (December 23,) please join the caroling party hosted by Rick Turner. Gather at the church at 4:30 PM to visit the Hermitage and our shut-ins.
- -The December extra-mile giving nationally is the Christmas Joy Offering. This offering helps current and retired clergy in times of need and provides leadership development for people of color. Watch for more information in your bulletins.
- -Please select a card from the Angel Tree in the Cada Grove Room. Help support our hands-on local mission by buying, wrapping and returning the gift to the tree.
- -Mid-day on Fridays in January-February, Pastor Monica will lead us in a study on Handel's "Messiah." This music covers Christmas and Easter. Come join us.






Vulnerable love
