SESSION DIGEST FROM CLERK OF SESSION NMPC...

The Session members met on Thursday, March 26 and they approved the February 24 Session minutes and the Treasurer's February 2015 Report. The Presbytery voted to offer only retreats and conferences at Makemie Woods Camp and Conference Center in 2015 while their management team researches ways to keep the facility solvent. Those families interested in Presbyterian youth camping are encouraged to contact Camp Hanover in the Presbytery of the James. On the national level, a majority of the presbyteries approved changing the definition of marriage and allowing same sex marriage in states where it is legal. Our Session has agreed to address this issue on a case by case basis.

We approved and celebrated the baptism of Brooklyn Grace Colona on Palm Sunday and we look forward to having April Lynn Thompson join our church on April 19. The Lenten brown bags and suppers were well attended and very educational. The second Winter Blues Bash Lunch was great fun and they have relabeled themselves the "Presbyterian Lunch Bunch." Everyone is invited to join the Presbyterian Lunch Bunch at Rita's in Parksley on Monday, April 13.

The Session approved Michele Van Hove as the Assistant Treasurer. She will also direct the Youth Choir which hopes to sing quarterly. Plans for Vacation Bible School are being finalized. The nursery overhaul is now completed thanks to Joe's Gang. Additional school supplies have been distributed and the Mission Committee has applied for grant funding for this project. The last week in April, the church will host a university group working on Habitat projects.

The Hospitality Committee noted 18 attending bowling on March 1. They will host a spaghetti dinner and silent auction on May 1st and on Saturday, May 16 will manage the church yard sale. Please let them know what items you have to offer for both the auction and yard sale. On Sunday, May 31, Monica will host the Church Picnic at the manse.

PCUSA Note: from Gradye Parsons, Stated Clerk of the General Assembly

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

It appears from unofficial voting tallies that amendment 14-F of the Directory for Worship in the Book of Order has been approved by a majority of the presbyteries. The approval allows Teaching Elders wider discretion in whose weddings they may conduct and Sessions wider discretion in whose weddings it may host. That discretion could include same gender marriages in states where that is permitted. It is important to note that the determination of what couple a Teaching Elder will marry has and will continue to be with that Teaching Elder. Likewise, the determination by a Session as to whose weddings a congregation will host remains solely with the Session. There is nothing in the amendment to compel any Teaching Elder to conduct a wedding against his or her judgment, nor a Session to host one against its judgment.

The Book of Order in F-3.0105 encourages us to exercise mutual forbearance toward each other when we differ. That forbearance should show itself in respect and genuine care for each other. As a church the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) has received much grace from God in Jesus Christ. We should extend that grace to each other in all gentleness as we live into this chapter of our common life.
