Identity's Thread: Listening to Who You Are Now Announcing a weekend retreat... March 15, 16 and 17

The question of our identity weaves throughout our lives, especially in times of transition. Our work in the world changes... our children leave home... our health or geography may change... what we feel called to do can shift in ways planned or unplanned.

Throughout, questions, challenges and opportunities abound to listen deeply and to respond to life's current invitations—especially when those invitations involve not necessarily a big change in identity but a subtle shift in perception.

This kind of conscious, exploratory and even playful inquiry is aided immeasurably by time set apart, by a community of fellow travelers, and by a setting conducive to inner exploration. Wherever you may be on the journey of articulating the next phase of your life, this retreat will speak to you. During this weekend of presentations, artwork, quiet time, journaling, fellowship and sharing, walks in nature, yoga and meals together, we will explore various ways to sense, articulate, and respond to who we are becoming.

About the Retreat: Join us Friday afternoon for a leisurely beachfront birding and wildlife walk at Assateague Wildlife Refuge. Following dinner (on your own in one of Chincoteague's many interesting restaurants), we'll meet at 7:30 to settle into our cozy meeting spot and begin our brief journey together. On Saturday enjoy presentations, quiet times, and opportunities to share. Choose from included events such as art projects, journaling, dream workshops, guided meditation, yoga, a social hour and relaxing in a hot tub (overnight guests.) Sunday morning features morning stretching, a wrap-up session and time for one last walk on the beach. We'll close before noon to allow time to explore Chincoteague and for a leisurely return home, renewed and refreshed. The Mission Committee provided lunch for a Habitat for Humanity group from Cornell University in December and the Membership, Friendship and Service Committee was busy planning the Spaghetti Dinner Fundraiser.

Rev. Close will convene the Worship Committee and plan the upcoming pancake lunch on Sunday, February 10. He also announced that the community Lenten Lunch series will start on February 13. The ecumenical noon Lenten (brown bag) services will start at NMPC then Market Street United Methodist Church, then the third and fourth Wednesday's at Holy Trinity Episcopal, fifth Wednesday back to NMPC, and the last at Market Street Methodist. Rev. Close will offer at 7PM worship service on Maundy Thursday, March 28 at NMPC.

At the Corporation Meeting, we elected new officers. Congratulations to President Cada Grove, Secretary Jody Humphreys and Treasurer George Heinrichs. Cada appointed Tom Nielsen and Debbie Ryon to serve on the Financial Management Committee. The corporate officers are working on locating the deeds of the manse and the church.
