From day one... your welcome was warm and celebratory... there was a hurricane, technically, the day after we arrived, but we were cozy in Mike and Marge's lovely home.

That has been true ever since, in so many ways large and small... whatever has buffeted on the outside, we dwelled secure... Both in the literal home we have loved, with ongoing thanks to Joe's Boys, and in the "home"—spiritual, emotional, vocational—that these two churches embody.

Just as I write of returning, eternally returning, I am reminded of an image from Scripture, where it says "Jesus pitched his tent amongst them..."

Not built a big stone building. Not stayed. He pitched the most temporary of dwellings, knowing he would be moving on.

It reminds me of the metaphor at the heart of all our lives... that we are <u>all</u> here on a temporary basis, and all called to move on, if not literally, then inwardly, to the next place of new life, of service.

I think the best prayer I ever heard was by Dag Hammarskjold. It was passed on to me by my grandmother, and you have heard Robert say it many a time:

"For everything that has been thank you. For everything that will be... yes."

May we ALL go forward saying, shouting..."YES." Traveling mercies to us all. And ongoing love and thanks forever.

We received a lovely gift from Norma Barnes family. The Session will engrave one of the pavers in her memory and in honor of her work as Elder. Her passing brings our active membership to 56.




