session of the House and Senate to give his State of the State address. The full transcript, and other resources, can be found here on the Governor's website. During his speech, Gov. Abbott laid out four emergency items for the Legislature to take up. The Texas Constitution does not allow the Legislature to consider any legislation until the 60th day of session, unless the governor declares an emergency item, so this means that legislation pertaining to his items will be considered as soon as possible.

The four emergency items are:

- 1 Child Protective Services reform (SB 11)
- 2 Banning sanctuary cities and strengthening border security (SB 4)
- 3 Ethics reform (SB 14)
- 4 Article V Convention of States (SB 21, HJR 39, SJR 2, HB 506)

We can expect bills on these topics to be scheduled for hearings quickly. SB 11 by Sen. Charles Schwertner (R-Georgetown) will be heard on February 2 in the Senate Health and Human Services Committee, and SB 14 by Sen. Van Taylor (R-Plano) will be heard February 1 in Senate State Affairs. You can watch those hearings online at http://www.senate.state.tx.us/events.php



Well, that didn't take long.

Within 90 minutes of President Trump's Supreme Court nomination announcement of Judge Neil Gorsuch, Senate Democrats, like Elizabeth Warren and Sherrod Brown, took partisan politics to the next level by announcing they would oppose President Trump's pick – all without a single Senate hearing.



On Betsy DeVos

On January 8, NFRW President Carrie Almond endorsed the nomination of Betsy DeVos, a proven education reformer and chair of the American Federation for Children, to be America's next Secretary of Education.

"The NFRW has a long-standing commitment to improving education and literacy rates for our nation's children, and we've long supported accountability, flexibility, local control and choice in education." Almond wrote. "As an unflinching champion of charter schools and vouchers for underprivileged children, Ms. DeVos is the perfect catalyst to bring much-needed change to our education system."

The letter continues: "The NFRW applauds President-elect Trump's wisdom and foresight in nominating Ms. DeVos for this key position in his Cabinet, and we call upon the U.S. Senate to confirm her appointment without delay."

On Neil Gorsuch

"We applaud President Trump on his decision and congratulate him on naming a worthy successor to the highly respected Justice Scalia," said National Federation of Republican Women President Carrie Almond. "Just as President Trump is already setting a course for a renewed, greater

will protect and preserve our constitutional liberties for generations to come."

Gorsuch, who currently serves on the Tenth U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, is known as a champion of religious liberty and is considered to be an originalist in his interpretation of the U.S. Constitution. The native Coloradan earned degrees from Columbia, Harvard and Oxford, clerked for two Supreme Court justices, and worked in George W. Bush's Justice Department. National Review describes Gorsuch as "a well-respected conservative whose legal philosophy is remarkably similar to that of Antonin Scalia."

"Gorsuch is the justice America has been waiting for,"
President Almond went on to say. "During the recent election,
the American people clearly understood that the outcome would
affect not just the presidency, but the direction of the Supreme
Court as well. The NFRW commends Republican leadership in
the Senate for holding the line to ensure the American people
had their say before a new Supreme Court justice was seated."

"There is no understating the importance of this selection and subsequent selections to the high court," Almond said. "We experience daily our forefathers' faith, genius and forethought in structuring the Constitution with checks and balances to protect the rights of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness for all Americans."
