Legislative Update

After a sizzling 81st Legislative Session, Texas conservatives can celebrate in their many accomplishments that will help to ensure our state's success for generations to come. While Texas lawmakers may take a break and escape the scorching weather, the heat of the health care debate in Washington D. C. is in full force. With never a dull moment, Dallas County Republican women are needed to help put a stop to this disastrous effort.

A Review of the 81st Texas Legislative Session:

What an exciting legislative session! With Republicans holding a slight majority in the House, Texas conservatives had their work cut out! Thanks to their hard work, the Republicans were able to stop several damaging pieces of legislation while at the same time achieving numerous significant successes.

State Board of Education: Good news, conservatives were successful in stopping the numerous bills that attacked the authority of the SBOE in determining the content of textbooks and curriculum in Texas schools. These bills attempted to undermine the elected board members, thus taking power away from the voters who put these elected officials in office. However, one bill did pass which would remove their authority over digitalized textbooks. Thanks to Governor Perry who after initially signing the bill issued an Executive Order to retain the authority of the SBOE.

Medicaid/CHIP Expansion: Committees in both the House and Senate chambers passed bills that would have expanded eligibility for both the Medicaid and CHIP programs, but were successfully defeated during the legislative process. Currently, Medicaid consumes 60 percent of the federal funds accounted in the state budget and is the fastest growing governmental program.

Voter ID: After valiant efforts of many conservative groups, what was known as the Voter ID bill passed in the Texas Senate. However, following Democrat stalling tactics including "chubbing" on the House floor, the bill died on the House calendar.

Margin Tax: A significant legislative success was the passage of H.B 4765 which raised the exemption threshold for the margin tax from \$300,000 to

\$1 million for the next two years, and reduces to \$600,000 in the following years. This is a significant benefit to small business which is the driving force of all job creation.

Higher Education: The Texas Legislature passed a major piece of legislation that creates a fund to provide over \$100 million in research grants to research institutions attempting to reach Tier-One status. In addition, SB175 passed, which caps at 75% the percentage of incoming freshman the University of Texas at Austin is required to admit under the Top Ten Percent rule.

National: While one can celebrate in the many successes of the 81st Texas Legislative Session, Republican women MUST turn their focus and work like never before to defeat **ObamaCare.** Passage of socialized medicine would be devastating to our country. The provisions contained in the House version of the bill, America's Affordable Choices Act of 2009 (HR3200) will cost over \$1 trillion and would reduce quality and access to care, cut Medicare and Medicaid by \$400 billion taking from our elderly and persons in need, and cost tax payers an additional \$581 billion in increases taxes. It would create a government-run health care plan which would reimburse physicians at the current Medicare rates. These rates are lower than what is currently offered by insurance companies and would have a long-term effect of eliminating competition, therefore access to care. In addition, the bill contains a mandate of coverage to both individuals and business.

The Senate is expected to drop the two versions of their health reform bill. Chairman Baucus, Chair of the very powerful Senate Finance Committee, is under extreme pressure from the Administration to provide a way to successfully fund the bill.

With every health organization vying for their pieces of the pie, Capitol Hill is abuzz with high profile lobbyists. You can be assured that all of the "Big Guns" have been hired, health associations have

increased their representation, and there is significant pressure on our elected officials to look after the special interests of these groups. The Texas Economy Today

Every day the national press discusses the economic uncertainty facing the nation. Though we face our own economic challenges, we are fortunate to live in Texas -- one of the few states not facing a state budget deficit. California, New York, and



other states are struggling in their legislative sessions to balance their budgets.

Texas is better positioned to weather the storm, largely because we are much more diverse an economy than others, and also because we have not seen our state government spending balloon out of control. It is not an accident that Texas was responsible for over 70 percent of all new job creation across the entire country in 2008. The job climate is both welcoming and rational. We know however that we will lose some of those gains in 2009, but believe that the downturn will be significantly less severe than that experienced elsewhere.

While many families are having to tighten their belts, so must government, and one of the best ways to keep spending under control is through transparent budgeting. When I announced the Biennial Revenue Estimate in early January, I pointed out that we were going to see about 10 percent less revenue than the previous budget cycle, but we were very fortunate to have the Rainy Day Fund for emergencies.

It now seems that the federal stimulus dollars, between 15 and 16 billion is expected to be allocated to Texas, can be used in certain circumstances for one-time projects which will not obligate the state in years going forward. This however must be closely monitored. The bill is very lengthy, and our staff has put up on the web all the information we have about this package, and we will modify it as more information is received. You can find more information at www.window.state.tx.us/recovery.

The most critical part of this is to avoid committing to ongoing expenditures funded by one-time sources of revenue. Otherwise, the legislature will face billions of dollars in new spending obligations without an ongoing revenue source to fund them. In this economic climate, it is wise to be cautious and prudent, and I know that the Republicans in the legislature will do just that.
