
Ken Fairchild offers thoughts on the question everyone's asking:

Red River 44 Memorial Service

On September 17, 2008, a CH-47 Chinook helicopter crashed just outside of Basra, Iraq, killing all seven soldiers on board. The **"Red River 44"** crew members who died were from the 2nd Battalion, 149th Aviation Regiment, stationed in Grand Prairie.

On September 13, 2009, Republican women from Northwood, First and several other clubs, along with **Dallas Mayor and Mrs. Tom Leppert**, had the privilege to serve breakfast to approximately 600 family members of the Fallen and their fellow soldiers. We also attended the Memorial Service and the "Red River 44" Park Dedication Service. Many hugs and tears later, we were all so thankful for this opportunity to express our gratitude and encouragement.

Many who were not able to attend had generously donated money toward the cost of the breakfast. Seven park benches are located in the "Red River 44" Memorial park – each bench representing a Fallen Soldier. Northwood RW donated funds to purchase one bench in honor of the sacrifices made by these brave men. The seven Fallen Soldiers leave behind eleven children along with countless loved ones and friends. As the American flag was presented to each of these children and the bagpipes played "Amazing Grace," we were reminded that....."All gave some but some gave ALL."

Thank you, Republican women, for once again stepping up to the plate to show our love for this Country and those who defend Her.




Click on "My Profile" to view your current profile. You can edit some items directly from this page.
