A native of southern Louisiana, James came to Texas in the summer of 1998 to attend Texas Christian University in Fort Worth. While at TCU James interned in the office of Congresswoman Kay Granger. He graduated in 2002 with a degree in Economics and Political Science from TCU. James was a volunteer on Congressman Jeb Hensarling's first campaign, where he learned about political fundraising and grass roots. Beginning in 2003, James worked with the Magnolia Group, a local fundraising firm. Over the course of his tenure at the Magnolia Group, James worked with various clients on the national and state level, including Congressman Michael Burgess, Congressman Kenny Marchant, and in 2007 Republican Presidential Candidate Mitt Romney.

In the summer of 2010, James became campaign manager for Representative Stefani Carter. Representative Carter was elected on November 2nd, 2010 with the widest margin of any challenger candidate in Dallas County and she became the first African-American Republican woman elected in Texas. During the 82nd Legislative Session, James worked in the Texas Capitol as the legislative director for Irving Representative Linda Harper Brown. Dallas County Chairman Wade Emmert selected James to be the new Executive Director of the Dallas County Republican Party in July of 2011. His responsibilities include day to day management of the party, fundraising, and helping to elect Republican candidates in Dallas County.

TEXAS REPUBLICAN PARTY CONVENTIONS Your Grass Roots Road Map to Participation

Precinct Convention – County Executive Committee will determine when it's held; after the polls close or within five days of election.

- Primary Election Day ____*___ 2012
- To participate you must have voted in the Republican primary.
- Precinct chairman may open meeting and a permanent chairman is elected.
- Delegates for the Senatorial Convention are selected.
- Resolutions for platform may be presented in writing and voted upon.
- There is no quorum to hold the convention.
- Required paperwork provided and must be returned to the County party headquarters

Senatorial/County Convention – Held Saturday, * (lasts one day)

- Delegates chosen at the Precinct Conventions.
- Some Precinct delegates help organize convention and serve on temporary committees.
- Delegates to the State Convention selected by the Nominations Committee and presented to the body for a vote.
- Resolutions will be selected by the Resolutions Committee and presented to the body for a vote
- Vote is by caucus

State Convention – June 7, 8 & 9, 2012, Fort Worth

- Delegates are selected by the Senatorial Delegate Committee.
- One delegate from each Senatorial Districted appointed to serve on temporary committees.
- Permanent committee members elected by convention.
- Senatorial Districts will caucus the first day to elect 1 man and 1 woman to serve on State Republican Executive Committee.
- Convention elects State Chairman and Vice Chairman.
- Only in Presidential years: Congressional Districts will caucus the second day to elect 3 national delegates and 3 alternates to attend the national convention.
- A National Committeeman and National Committeewoman will be elected to represent Texas on the RNC
- A state platform will be voted on.

National Convention – August 27 to 31, 2012, Orlando, Florida – held before a Presidential Election

- Delegates elected at State elect 1 man and 1 woman to serve on each of the temporary committees for the convention.
- A national platform is voted upon.
- A Presidential nominee is elected.



The Republican Party of Texas Grassroots Club TFRW Award Plan

What it is

The RPT is providing an award program for TFRW clubs. The more members of your club join the Grassroots Club, the higher the award for your club.

The percentage of your club members who belong to the Grassroots Club determines the **level** of your recognition. The percentage will be based on your club's **2011 final** active membership (does not include associate members.)

Award levels

- ** State Representative Level 25% of your 2011 final active membership
- The State Senator Level 50% of your 2011 final active membership
- The Lieutenant Governor Level 75% of your 2011 final active membership
- ** Governor Level 100% of your 2011 final active membership
- Presidential Level greater than 100% of your final 2011 active membership

If your club participates in the award program during 2012, it will receive the special recognition of being a Charter Grassroots Club RW.



Incentives

- Recognition on the RPT Website
 - All participating clubs will be listed on a special TFRW Grassroots Club recognition page.
- Recognition at the RPT Convention
 - All clubs that have achieved 25% membership or greater by May 1, 2012, will be listed on a special page in the 2012 RPT convention program.
 - Clubs that achieve 50% or higher by June 1, 2012, will receive special recognition at the 2012 RPT convention.
- Award certificate(s) from RPT honoring your club
 - RWs will be awarded as they achieve each level.

<u>SPECIAL NOTE:</u> for each Club participating at 50%, their name will appear in the Convention Program and they will also receive points towards the Tower Award.

How to Begin Your Club's Participation

- Step 1: Each RW President must appoint a Grass Roots Club Coordinator who will be responsible for collecting and reporting the names of the RW members who belong to the Grassroots Club. Reporting will be done on an Excel spreadsheet, so you will want to appoint someone who is familiar with the computer.
- Step 2: The club President must email Janet Jackson, the TFRW Grassroots Club Coordinator. Janet's email is JanetSREC@gmail.com and her phone number is 254-709-1187. Tell Janet three things:
 - 1) That your club wants to join the TFRW Award Program.
 - 2) Who your club's Grass Roots Club Coordinator is.
 - 3) Your coordinator's email address and phone number.
- Step 3: Janet will email back to the President and to the club's coordinator a reporting form that is in Excel, a Grassroots Club sign up form that you can make copies of, your club's final 2011 active membership number, and what your club's goals are for each level.

YOU'RE READY TO GO!

The Local Club's Grass Roots Club (GRC) Coordinator's Responsibilities

- A. List on the reporting page the members of your RW who have already joined the Grassroots Club. You will need to ask your members to turn their names into you if they are already members, so that your club can count them toward your goal.
- B. Recruit more members of your club to join the Grassroots Club. They can sign up on the internet at www.grassrootsclub.com. If they sign up online, remind them to tell you so you can record their names. Or they can sign up using a copy of the form on the next page. They also may pay with a check. (If you collect the completed forms or cards, be very careful with them because they contain credit card information). Please mail immediately to:

Important reminder! Be sure to record your members names before you send in their forms so that your club can receive credit!

- C. Once your club reaches the 25% mark, email the list of members to Janet Jackson, the TFRW Grassroots Club coordinator, at JanetSREC@gmail.com. As your club achieves the next higher percentage levels, continue to send the updated lists to Janet.
- D. Your club will receive an award certificate from RPT each time it achieves the next higher level.
