It Has Been a Good Year for Richardson Resident Dot Adler

It has been a good year for Dorothy A. (Dot) Adler, although she has had many good years and seen many successes in her sixty years of volunteering on behalf of the Republican Party and Republican candidates. She was recognized by the Dallas County Council of Republican Women with the Anita Hill Lifetime Achievement Award in December, 2012. Ms. Adler covered the founding convention of the Texas Federation of Republican Women as a young reporter for the *San Antonio Light*, and says she cast her first vote for Dwight D. Eisenhower and has been voting Republican ever since.

The Resolutions were read before the House and the Senate during the Legislative Day organized by the Texas Federation of Republican Women (TFRW) in April, 2013.

However, the accolades were not over. She was honored again at a special reception at the Bush Library in conjunction with a TFRW Board Meeting in Dallas. Among the dignitaries was former President Bush, himself, who recalled the time when Ms. Adler had been a full-time volunteer in the Dallas finance committee office of the George W. Bush Presidential Exploratory Committee for Texas, quipping "Dot may not remember me, but I remember her." TFRW President Carolyn Hodges brought Ms. Adler a congratulatory proclamation adopted by TFRW, and Representative Dan Branch presented her with a Texas flag that had been flown over the capitol in Austin.

Even though this has been quite a year, Ms. Adler is not done volunteering. She continues to be active in the Dallas Downtown Republican Women's Club, the Dallas County Council of Republican Women, and the TI Alumni Association.
