





# Parliamentary Points

#### The Story of Roberts Rules of Order History of Henry Martyn Robert

General Robert's accomplishment is the result of a positive response to adversity he encountered in 1863, at the age of 26. An army engineer stationed in New Bedford, Massachusetts, charged with safe-guarding harbor defenses, Captain Robert unexpectedly found himself called on to chair a meeting of citizens at a local Baptist church. Accepting the assignment despite having no training as presiding officer caused him to later recall: "My embarrassment was supreme. I plunged in, trusting to Providence that the assembly would behave itself.

But with the plunge went the determination that "I would never attend another meeting until I knew something of...parliamentary law". Newspaper accounts at the time indicate that the meeting lasted 14 hours and accomplished nothing.

To prevent the same situation from occurring again, Robert sought guidance from existing manuals of parliamentary procedure, including those established by Thomas Jefferson and Luther S. Cushing. Finding them inadequate, he set out to become a student of parliamentary procedure and to prepare a system of rules of order that would be suitable for use by ordinary societies throughout the United States. ... *(Continued here.)* Click here to print this article!

"... Currently, the RPT has Victory staff in eight different offices around the state. In addition, our statewide candidates, especially General Abbott, have infrastructure and staff in virtually every community around the state. This is one of the reasons I believe our ticket continues to maintain a lead over the Democrats. The response to our call for volunteers has been overwhelming and we have received a very positive response to our ticket out in the field. In addition to our daily calling and block walking we also schedule a monthly Super Saturday block walk to attract new volunteers to our team. July was no exception as we scheduled a July 19 Super Saturday. On that day alone hundreds of volunteers in 51 counties fanned out across the state. The Story of Roberts Rules of Order: History of Henry Martyn Robert (continued from above)

... In 1867 Robert was promoted to major and ordered to San Francisco as chief engineer with the Army Corps of Engineers. He and his wife, Helen Thresher Robert, were involved in several community organizations. In San Francisco, Robert served on the board of trustees of the First Baptist Church, where contentious issues such as whether women should be allowed to vote in business meetings, abounded. The church's instruction to "love and be kind to one another" did not help the decision making of board members who all referred to different rules of order depending on what part of the country they came from.

Robert's research and compilation of his own rules of order resulted in a 16 page guide to assist the half dozen societies of which he and his wife were members. A busy work schedule kept him from finishing the pamphlet, but after moving to Milwaukee, WI, he found some time during the early part of 1874 when the harsh weather conditions prevented any engineering services along Lake Michigan. Robert used this time to finish his manuscript. But his attempt to find a publisher was met with disappointment. Telling him there was no need for such a book, some publishers went as far as to say that one would believe that an army officer could possibly know enough about parliamentary law to write about it.

To counter such negativity, Robert offered to give away 1,000 review copies, and to assume all financial responsibilities until the publisher was completely reimbursed. It was well received by Legislators, clergy, educators and others who had received copies of the book. Robert revised in February 1876 the Pocket Manual of Rules of Order for Deliberative Assemblies. It was met with immediate success and sold out in four months. A second edition was published with more than 10,000 copies sold the first year at a price of \$.75 each.

Critics praised the book, saying that it could never have been written by lawyers or legislators, for they would have been bound by precedents. Robert, however, had broken with precedent whenever necessary. We now have the RONR 2011.

There is more to the story, but this gives you some background of how RONR got started.

Henry Martyn Robert served as a Union Soldier in the American Civil War attaining the rank of Brigadier General. Henry Robert and his engineers built the levee in Galveston, Texas. in 1902 after the big hurricane disaster in 1900. This levee has saved millions of lives.

His grandson, Henry Martyn Robert III, visited the seawall in Galveston at the 2012 convention of the Texas State Association of Parliamentarians. He touched the inscription on the monument, with an AHHH moment.
