Chickens on plots

There has been a request that we consider allowing the keeping of chickens on our site.

While the county council does not sanction the keeping of livestock on its sites, as a self managed site we do have this right as granted by the allotment act.

If we are to agree with this request we would look to put in place the following conditions.

- 1) An officer would be appointed to inspect all plots with chickens on them and to which all applications to keep chickens would have to be made and their decision would be final.
- 2) All chickens would have to be kept in a secure fox proof cage.
- Chicken runs would have to be kept clean and not attract vermin such as rats

and mice.

- 4) Any plot holder wishing to keep chickens will need to demonstrate that they have the time to devote to their livestock and have the knowledge required to keep them healthy.
- 5) The plot holder will allow the designated officer to inspect their chickens and chicken runs at any reasonable time and to report immediately any health issues that may appear within their birds.
- No plot holder will be allowed to keep more than six birds irrespective of how many plots they hold.

No plot holder will be allowed to keep a cockerel as this is liable to cause nuisance to local residents.

Recipe of the month

Parsnip, Chilli and Parmesan Soup

Serves 6

Preparation 10 minutes

Cooking time 40 minutes

Ingredients 3-4 tbsp Olive oil, 6 large parsnips peeled and chopped into 1cm chunks, 1 large onion peeled and chopped into 1 cm chunks, 2 garlic cloves peeled and crushed, 1.25 litres vegetable stock made from 2 stock cubes, 1 red chilli, seeds removed, finely chopped, 50g parmesan broken into pieces, 50ml single cream

To serve Crusty rolls

I) Heat some of the oil in a large pan, then add the parsnips and onion. Cook for about 5 minutes then add the garlic and stock and bring to the boil.

2) Turn down the heat to simmer then add the chilli and parmesan. Simmer for about 30 minutes or until the parsnips are soft to the touch,

3)Turn off the heat then use a hand blender to blitz until smooth. Add the cream and season to taste. Gently reheat and serve with crusty bread rolls

Hire of Equipment

At the last committee meeting it was decided that plot holders would be allowed to make use of the equipment that the site owns for a fee of £10.00 per day

This fee will include a full tank of fuel.

Any person wishing to use the equipment must be over 18 years of age and will be required to sign a disclaimer stating that Kingsthorpe Grove Allotment Association or its officers are not responsible or liable for any injuries sustained while using the equipment howsoever caused. Instructions will be given on the use of the equipment prior to hire Any damage caused to the equipment by misuse will be the responsibility of the hirer

We will be limiting the equipment we hire out at present to lawnmowers and the rotovator

If you wish to make use of this equipment please leave your details including phone number at the shop and we will arrange a date that is convenient. We will be announcing a date in March when we will be having a shredding day. Plot holders who have bulky woody material will have the opportunity to use the associations petrol shredder to dispose of it. We will also be having a skip delivered at the same time to get rid of any rubbish that has accumulated.



Fencing Update

We are now in a position to start purchasing new perimeter fencing. We have decided on the type of fencing we will be buying and will be visiting suppliers over the next couple of weeks to try to get the best deal. Once that is decided we will be sending in the planning application which should take six weeks, so hopefully we should be able to start work by the end of March. The fencing will be replaced in sections starting from the bottom corner by the golf course entrance and working up towards Eastern Avenue. The first stretch should be about 50 metres. As we will be erecting the fence ourselves we will be asking for volunteers to help with the work. Remember this work is being carried out for your benefit so it is in your interest to help carry this project forward. Dates when work will be carried out will be advertised in advance via the usual channels. Members whose plots run down to the bottom wall may experience some disruption during the construction process so please bear this in mind before planting right up to the wall.
