### The Travelling Vocations Chalice Family Prayer for Vocations

The Chalice is offered to you as a reminder of your obligation to pray for vocations. It is a prayer tool intended to encourage within the family, prayers of thanksgiving to God for all our Priests and Religious, and to continue to beseech God to expand the hearts and minds of the many men and women whom Jesus continues to call with the words, "Come, follow me."

#### *How does the program work?*

- Families who are interested in bringing the chalice home are asked to contact the office.
- Please provide family name, address, contact information and the weekend mass which you usually attend.
- The designated family will receive the chalice after Communion during the weekend Mass which they attend.
- The family will keep the chalice, with the prayer booklets, for seven days.
- The family will return the chalice to Father (in the Sacristy) before the 5pm Saturday Vigil Mass.

### The Celebration of Wedding Anniversaries

Anniversary blessings are given to all celebrating couples after the Holy Communion at all Masses of the last weekend of the month.



#### *How does the program work?*

- Married couples who are celebrating their wedding anniversaries are asked to contact the office.
- Please provide your names, the number of years of marriage you are celebrating, and the weekend mass time which you usually attend.

### Rite of Initiation for Adults

RCIA (*Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults*) is a program in the Catholic Church for adults who wish to become Catholic.

*It is a program geared towards three types of people:*

- Those who have never been baptized and now want to enter the Catholic Church.
- Those who have been baptized but have not completed the Sacraments of Initiation (e.g. the Sacrament of First Communion and the Sacrament of Confirmation).
- Those who have been validly baptized in another Christian denomination and now wish to be received into the Catholic Church.

If you belong to any of these three categories or know someone who does, please ask them to contact the parish office for more information.

“Following God is not a task for the faint-hearted. The first reading and the responsorial psalm are powerful reminders of how great God is, and how wondrous are God’s plans. Taking on the larger-than-life task of submitting to God’s ways will challenge us. Jesus reminds his followers, and Paul echoes these
