Come & See Weekend at St. Augustine's Seminary November 1st - 3rd





Jesus in prayer and adoration?



TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Today we hear about how Jesus, continuing on his journey to Jerusalem, heals 10 lepers. This story is a lesson about faith and reminds us that faith is sometimes found in unlikely places. Ten people afflicted with leprosy cry out to Jesus. Struck with pity, Jesus heals all 10. However, only one is described as glorifying God and returning to thank

Jesus. The one who returns is a Samaritan, a foreigner. In the Jewish circles in which Jesus lived, Samaritans were looked down upon because of the differences between the two communities in their observance of Judaism. It is significant, therefore, that Jesus commends the Samaritan for his faith, which has been his salvation. Throughout Luke's Gospel, faith is found in surprising places.

Another lesson for us in this Gospel has to do with salvation. All 10 of the lepers were given the gift of healing, but in his gratitude to God for this gift, the Samaritan found salvation. Our salvation is found in recognizing the gifts we have been given and knowing to whom we must offer our thanks. (loyolapress.com)

"La tua fede ti ha salvato". Il lebbroso samaritano, il solo straniero nel gruppo che è andato incontro a Gesù per supplicarlo. Il solo, anche, a ritornare sui suoi passi per rendergli grazie. Il suo gesto religioso, prostrarsi ai piedi di Gesù, significava anche che egli sapeva di non avere nulla che non avesse ricevuto (cf. 1Cor 4,7). La fede, dono di Cristo, porta alla salvezza.

"E gli altri nove, dove sono?". Gli altri nove avevano obbedito all'ordine di Gesù e si erano presentati ai sacerdoti, dando così prova di una fede appena nata. Ma non hanno agito di conseguenza, una volta purificati, tornando verso Gesù, la sola via per arrivare al Padre (cf. Gv 14,6), mediatore indispensabile per la glorificazione di Dio.

La misericordia di Gesù verso colui che non possiede altro che la sua povertà e il suo peccato, ma che si volge verso il Signore per trovare il perdono e la riconciliazione, non è solo fonte di salvezza personale, ma anche di reintegrazione nella comunità di culto del popolo di Dio. Nella Chiesa, la fede di coloro che sono stati riscattati diventa azione di grazie al Padre per mezzo di nostro Signore Gesù Cristo (cf. Col 3,16-17).

Extraordinary Mission Month ~ "Baptized & Sent"



Pope Francis has declared October 2019 to be an Extraordinary Mission Month. Catholics are reminded that by virtue of their baptism, they are all called to have a

part in the missionary activity of the church. The work of the missions is not restricted to a select few who travel to foreign lands. Mission work is a call of all baptized Catholics to bring the Gospel message to wherever their life journey may take them and whatever their life situations. This month is to help all Catholics appreciate the missionary nature of the church and that the very essence of the church is to bring the Gospel to the world, as Jesus commissioned his disciples at his ascension. This proclamation is not so much about ideas as it is about a person: Jesus Christ. Missionary activity is creating favourable circumstances for an encounter with Jesus.
