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Compelled by visions of God's kingdom, Isaiah and John the Baptist build up and tear down.

Isaiah envisions God's peaceable kingdom, where "they will not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain." He waits for the Messiah, the "shoot ...

from the stump of Jesse," who will bring righteousness and justice. His people, mired in sorrow and despair, have stopped waiting for God's kingdom. He builds them up, offering hope.

The Baptist is "preparing the way" for Jesus the Messiah. His people, mired in greed and exploitation, have stopped waiting for God's kingdom. John warns: change your ways... find the right path, bear good fruit - now!

Prophets do what's necessary, so others can see reality. For John and Isaiah, God's kingdom is a compelling reality, their goal and guide. They are connected to that kingdom and long for its fullness.

We celebrate the in-breaking of God's kingdom in Jesus. How slowly that kingdom comes to fullness! But the vision is strong and compelling, as it was for Isaiah and John: God's reign of peace, justice, and healing.

We experience it in our midst and long for its fullness. Graced by the Spirit, fed by the Eucharist, we proclaim it and practise it... living in hope, love, peace, and justice. The many glimpses and tastes of God's kingdom draw us in and send us forth to share this vision with others. ~Dinah Simmons, Living With Christ

Abramo concepì Isacco per la fede nella promessa di Dio "e divenne padre di molti popoli" (cf. Rm 4,18-22). Ugualmente Maria concepì Gesù per mezzo della fede. La concezione verginale di Gesù fu opera dello Spirito Santo, ma per mezzo della fede di Maria. È sempre Dio che opera, ma attraverso la collaborazione dell'uomo. Credere, infatti, è rispondere con fiducia alla parola di Dio, accogliere i suoi piani come se fossero propri e sottomettersi in obbedienza alla sua volontà per collaborarvi. La fede vuole sempre: 1) la fiducia in Dio e 2) la professione di ciò che si crede, poiché "con il cuore si crede per ottenere la giustizia e con la bocca si fa la professione di fede per avere la salvezza" (Rm 10,10). Una volta riconosciuta vera la parola di Dio, Maria credette alla concezione verginale di Gesù e credette pure alla volontà di Dio di salvare gli uomini peccatori, la volle e aderì a quel piano lasciandosi coinvolgere: "Eccomi, sono la serva del Signore, avvenga di me quello che hai detto" (Lc 1,38). Dalla sua fede quindi nacque Gesù e pure la Chiesa. Perciò, insieme ad Elisabetta che esclamò: "Beata colei che ha creduto all'adempimento delle parole del Signore" (Lc 1,45), ogni generazione oggi la proclama beata (cf. Lc 1,48).

La Chiesa ha il compito di continuare nel mondo la missione materna di Maria, quella di comunicare il Salvatore al mondo. Il cristiano di oggi deve fare proprio il piano di Dio "il quale vuole che tutti gli uomini siano salvati" (1Tm 2,4), proclamando la propria salvezza e lasciandosi attivamente coinvolgere nel portare la salvezza al prossimo, poiché "in questo è glorificato il Padre mio: che portiate molto frutto e diventiate miei discepoli (Gv 15.8).
